Sec. 3. To facilitate such cooperation, each public institution of higher education as defined in "An Act creating a Board of Higher Education, defining its powers and duties, making an appropriation therefor, and repealing an Act herein named", approved August 22, 1961, as amended, is authorized to establish programs, requested by and in cooperation with school districts located within the community, under which qualified students of such institution may provide high-impact tutorial services to elementary and secondary school students

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who are in need of such services, as determined and requested by <u>those</u> their respective school districts. The public institution of higher education may also coordinate with those school districts to secure additional high-impact tutors from within the community. Programs shall include the tracking of student progress in reading and mathematics skills over time. Each public institution of higher education is encouraged to work in partnership with public schools in this State maintaining any of grades kindergarten 9 through 12 in order to help assure that all students entering 9th grade in the 1989-90 school year and thereafter are offered, during their years of enrollment as high school students, all coursework required to satisfy statewide minimum admission requirements and standards established by the Board of Higher Education, pursuant to Section 9.07 of "An Act creating a Board of Higher Education, defining its powers and duties, making an appropriation therefor, and repealing an Act herein named", and coursework that satisfies specific career competencies.

Sec. 4. Students selected by a public institution of higher education and tutors from the community who are furnishing high-impact tutoring to furnish tutorial services:

(i) shall meet basic requirements established by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 2-3.49 of The School

- 1 Code, as now or hereafter amended; and (ii) shall be assigned
- 2 by such institution to a specific school district or
- districts, on a regularly recurring basis, and to a particular
- 4 representative of such district who shall be responsible for
