2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 456 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
5	27-20.9 as follows:
6	(105 ILCS 5/27-20.9 new)
7	Sec. 27-20.9. Latina, Latino, and Latin American History
8	<u>study.</u>
9	(a) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, every public
10	elementary school and high school shall include in its
11	curriculum a unit of instruction studying the events of
12	Latina, Latino, and Latin American history, including the
13	history of Latin Americans in Illinois and the Midwest, as
14	well as the contributions of Latin Americans toward advancing
15	civil rights from the 19th century onward. These events shall
16	include the contributions made by individual Latin Americans

in government and the arts, humanities, and sciences, as well as the contributions of Latin American communities to the economic, cultural, social, and political development of the United States. The studying of this material shall constitute an affirmation by students of their commitment to respect the dignity of all races and peoples and to forever eschew every form of discrimination in their lives and careers.

(b) The State Superintendent of Education may prepare and 8 9 make available to all school boards instructional materials, 10 including those established by the Public Broadcasting 11 Service, that may be used as quidelines for development of a unit of instruction under this Section. However, each school 12 13 board shall itself determine the minimum amount of 14 instructional time that qualifies as a unit of instruction 15 satisfying the requirements of this Section.

16 <u>(c) The regional superintendent of schools shall monitor a</u> 17 <u>school district's compliance with this Section's curricular</u> 18 <u>requirements during the regional superintendent's annual</u> 19 <u>compliance visit.</u>

## 20 (d) A school may meet the requirements of this Section 21 through an online program or course.

(e) Subject to appropriation, the State Board of Education shall finance educational workshops designed to assist teachers in the development and integration of the unit of instruction under this Section into the curriculum.
