2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 851 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The Broadband Advisory Council Act is amended by changing Section 20 and by adding Section 30 as follows:
6	(220 ILCS 80/20)
7	Sec. 20. Powers and duties of the Council generally.
8	(a) The Council shall:
9	(1) explore any and all ways to expand the
10	availability to end-user customers of broadband services
11	using available technologies, including, but not limited
12	to, wireline, wireless, fixed wireless, and satellite
13	applications;
14	(2) identify barriers to broadband adoption among the
15	residents and small businesses of Illinois;
16	(3) research ways to eliminate barriers to adoption

through measures such as: digital literacy programs;
programs to assist older citizens in using broadband
Internet access; programs to facilitate adoption by
disabled citizens; and programs to encourage collaborative
efforts among public universities, community colleges,
libraries, public housing, and other institutions;

7 (4) assess the availability of broadband for 8 low-income households compared to the availability of 9 broadband for other households;

10 (5) explore the potential for increased use of 11 broadband service for the purposes of education, career 12 readiness, workforce preparation, and alternative career 13 training;

14 (6) explore the potential for increased use of
 15 broadband services to facilitate aging in place;

16 (7) explore ways for encouraging State and municipal 17 agencies, including public housing authorities, to expand 18 the use of broadband services for the purpose of better 19 serving the public, including audio and video streaming, 20 voice-over Internet protocol, teleconferencing, and 21 wireless networking;

(8) cooperate and assist in the expansion of
 electronic instruction and distance education services;
 and

(9) as the Federal Communications Commission updates
 the benchmark downstream data rates and upstream data

rates, publish the revised data rates in the Illinois 1 Register within 60 days after the federal update; and -2 3 (10) evaluate the expansion of the Illinois Century Network to Illinois public schools, public libraries, and 4 5 State-owned correctional institutions or facilities, including issuing recommendations for increasing agency 6 staffing, infrastructure development, price modeling, and 7 providing download speeds of at least one gigabyte per 8 9 second and upload speeds of at least one gigabyte per 10 second.

11 (b) In addition to the powers set forth elsewhere in this 12 Act, the Council is hereby granted the powers necessary to 13 carry out the purpose and intent of this Act, as enumerated in 14 this Section, including, but not limited to:

(1) promoting awareness of public facilities that have
 community broadband access that can be used for distance
 education and workforce development; and

(2) advising on deployment of e-government portals
such that all public bodies and political subdivisions
have websites and encourage one-stop government access and
that all public entities stream audio and video of all
public meetings.

23 (c) The Council shall also:

(1) monitor the broadband-based development efforts of
other states in areas such as business, education, aging
in place, and health;

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(2) receive input provided on a voluntary basis from 1 Illinois broadband stakeholders and advise the 2 all 3 Governor and the General Assembly on policies related to broadband in Illinois, provided that no stakeholders shall 4 5 be required to publicly disclose competitively sensitive information or information that could compromise network 6 security or undermine the efficacy of reasonable network 7 8 management practices, and that any such information 9 voluntarily disclosed shall be protected from public 10 disclosure; and

11 (3) serve as the broadband advocate to State agencies 12 and other State entities to communicate the broadband 13 needs of citizens and organizations that do not have 14 access to broadband service or to broadband service 15 adequate for their needs.

(d) The Council shall exercise its powers and authority to 16 17 (1) advise and make recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor on bringing broadband service to unserved and 18 19 underserved rural and urban areas and improving broadband service statewide, (2) advise and make recommendations to the 20 21 General Assembly and the Governor on facilitating broadband 22 adoption by all citizens, and (3) propose statutory changes 23 that may enhance and expand broadband in the State.

(e) The Council shall report to the General Assembly on or
before January 1 of each year. The report to the General
Assembly shall be filed with the Clerk of the House of

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1	Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate in electronic
2	form only, in the manner that the Clerk and the Secretary shall
3	direct. The report shall include the action that was taken by
4	the Council during the previous year in carrying out the
5	provisions of this Act. The Council shall also make any other
6	reports as may be required by the General Assembly or the
7	Governor.

10	Sec. 30. Illinois Century Network Study.
11	(a) The Council shall study the feasibility of connecting
12	all Illinois public schools, public libraries, and State-owned
13	correctional facilities to the Illinois Century Network by
14	January 1, 2030. The purpose and scope of the study is limited
15	to connecting all public schools, public libraries, and
16	State-owned correctional facilities to the Illinois Century
17	Network, with a goal to give all public schools, public
18	libraries, and State-owned correctional institutions or
19	facilities access to reliable, gigabit-level broadband service
20	by January 1, 2030. The Office of Broadband within the
21	Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity shall support
22	and assist the Council in the development of the study.
23	(b) The feasibility study required under subsection (a)
24	shall explore:
25	(1) efforts among other states and units of local

government to connect public schools, public libraries, 1 2 and correctional facilities to a public broadband service; 3 (2) the current state of broadband service connection for all public schools, public libraries, and State-owned 4 correctional facilities, including connection speeds, type 5 of technology, and whether the network is serviced by the 6 7 Illinois Century Network currently; 8 (3) models for expanding the Illinois Century Network 9 solely for the purpose of connecting all Illinois public 10 schools, public libraries, and State-owned correctional 11 facilities; (4) the resources necessary to expand the Illinois 12 Century Network across the State of Illinois to all 13 14 Illinois public schools, public libraries, and State-owned 15 correctional facilities; (5) the benefits of the Illinois Century Network in 16 Illinois public schools, public libraries, and State-owned 17 correctional facilities; 18 19 (6) potential sources of funding for the expansion of 20 the Illinois Century Network to Illinois public schools, 21 public libraries, and State-owned correctional facilities; 22 (7) additional staff and contracting needs that would 23 be necessary to expand the Illinois Century Network to all 24 Illinois public schools, public libraries, and State-owned 25 correctional facilities; 26 (8) options for partnering with units of local

1 government in Illinois that have taken steps toward offering public broadband service for the purpose of 2 connecting all Illinois public schools, public libraries, 3 and State-owned correctional facilities to the Illinois 4 5 Century Network; and 6 (9) any other factors that are necessary for the exploration of the feasibility of expanding the Illinois 7 Century Network to all Illinois public schools, public 8 9 libraries, and State-owned correctional facilities. 10 The feasibility study shall offer recommendations based on the results of the study and shall offer options for the 11 expansion of the Illinois Century Network, including a 12 timeline, staffing needs, financial resources needed, and 13 14 suggested rates for broadband service. 15 (c) The Council shall issue a report on its findings, recommendations, options for expansion, and any recommended 16 legislation to the General Assembly by January 1, 2024. 17

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.".
