SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/10-20.63 105 ILCS 5/34-18.56

Amends the School Code. Provides that a school district may (instead of shall) make menstrual hygiene products available, at no cost to students, in bathrooms of every school building that are open for student use in grades 4 through 12 during the regular school day. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Sections 10-20.63 and 34-18.56 as follows:
- 6 (105 ILCS 5/10-20.63)
- 7 Sec. 10-20.63. Availability of menstrual hygiene products.
- 8 (a) The General Assembly finds the following:
- 9 (1) Menstrual hygiene products are a health care
 10 necessity and not an item that can be foregone or
 11 substituted easily.
- 12 (2) Access to menstrual hygiene products is a serious 13 and ongoing need in this State.
 - (3) When students do not have access to affordable menstrual hygiene products, they may miss multiple days of school every month.
