5 lease"; and

6 on page 3, line 13, by replacing "22.64" with "59.6"; and

7 on page 9, line 4, by replacing "Such" with "Additionally,  
8 such"; and

9 on page 9, line 9, after "incentives", by inserting ", such as  
10 signing bonuses,"; and

11 on page 31, line 4, after "Fire", by inserting "Service"; and

12 on page 31, line 21, by replacing "5.1017, and 5.1018" with

4 "(d) For each carbon dioxide pipeline, the owner or  
5 operator of the pipeline shall use modeling that can handle  
6 non-flat terrain; obstacles, such as vegetation and buildings;  
7 time or spatial variations in wind, including direction and  
8 speed; ambient weather conditions, such as temperature and  
9 humidity; variations to the direction of release of CO<sub>2</sub>; and  
10 concentrations and durations of CO<sub>2</sub>, in addition to the  
11 specifics related to the pipeline design, including, but not  
12 limited to, diameter, thickness, and shutoff valves, to  
13 develop a risk-based assessment and a chemical safety  
14 contingency plan. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency and  
15 Office of Homeland Security shall publish this information on  
16 its website and provide these materials to local emergency  
17 management agencies in relevant counties."; and

10 by replacing line 24 on page 103 through line 17 on page 104  
11 with the following:

12 "(g) For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and each  
13 fiscal year thereafter, at the direction of the Agency, in  
14 consultation with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and  
15 Office of Homeland Security, and the Department of Natural  
16 Resources, the State Comptroller shall direct and the State  
17 Treasurer shall transfer from the Carbon Dioxide Sequestration  
18 Administrative Fund the following percentages of the amounts  
19 collected under this Act by the Agency during the previous  
20 fiscal year:

21 (1) 2% to the Water Resources Fund;

- 1           (2) 6% to the Oil and Gas Resource Management Fund;  
2           (3) 20% to the Emergency Planning and Training Fund;  
3           (4) 28% to the Carbon Dioxide Sequestration Long-Term  
4           Trust Fund;  
5           (5) 10% to the General Revenue Fund; and  
6           (6) 24% to the Environmental Justice Grant Fund.".
