

103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 SB1410

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

110 ILCS 947/23 new

Amends the Higher Education Student Assistance Act. Requires the Illinois Student Assistance Commission to implement and administer a program, beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year, to award College Promise grants to Illinois residents seeking an associate degree, certificate, or diploma from an institution of higher learning or a not-for-profit private business or vocational school. Sets forth the terms and conditions of the program. Effective July 1, 2023.

AN ACT concerning education. 1

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- 4 Section 5. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act is 5 amended by adding Section 23 as follows:
- (110 ILCS 947/23 new) 6
- 7 Sec. 23. College Promise program.
- 8 (a) In this Section:
- 9 "Continuous enrollment" means a student has attended classes in the fall and spring semester of a single academic 10 year; enrollment in summer semester or intersession terms is 11 12 not required.
- "School" means a private business and vocational school, 13 14 as defined in Section 15 of the Private Business and
- Vocational Schools Act of 2012, that is not for profit. 15
- 16 "Student aid" means scholarships and grants, other than a College Promise grant, awarded to a student from any source 17 that does not require repayment; "student aid" does not 18
- 19 include student loans and work-study awards.
- 20 (b) The Commission shall implement and administer a 21 program, beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year, to award 22 College Promise grants to all eligible Illinois residents seeking an associate degree, certificate, or diploma from an 2.3

| 2 shall apply to the program: | |
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- (1) To be eligible for a grant, a student must be admitted to and enrolled full-time, as an Illinois resident, in an institution or a school in the fall term following graduation from an approved high school or after obtaining a high school equivalency certificate, provided that the student obtains the high school equivalency certificate prior to the student reaching 19 years of age. Exceptions to initial enrollment may be made for extenuating circumstances as provided in rules adopted by the Commission.
- (2) Students applying for a grant shall complete the College Promise grant application in their initial year of enrollment. Students shall complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid each academic year in which they seek to receive a grant.
- (3) To continue to receive a grant, a student must maintain Illinois residency, as well as satisfactory academic progress as determined by rules adopted by the Commission.
- (4) Grant recipients shall participate in mentoring and community service programs under rules adopted by the Commission.
- (5) Each academic year, subject to appropriation, a grant shall be equal to the cost of tuition and mandatory

| 5 | (c) In awarding grants under this Section, the Commission |
| 6 | shall, by rule, develop the selection and renewal criteria for |
