SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/21B-20

Amends the Educator Licensure Article of the School Code. Provides that a specialized educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who is employed in a teaching position at an accredited institution of higher education in this State that has officially announced its intent to cease all academic programming at the time the announcement was officially made or was employed in a teaching position at an accredited institution of higher education in this State that has ceased all academic programming within 5 years prior to or on or after the effective date of the amendatory Act and who, at the time of applying for the endorsement, meets specified criteria. Provides that the specialized educator endorsement is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years of the endorsement being issued and may be renewed. Provides that the holder of a specialized educator endorsement shall be permitted to teach in the content area in which he or she previously taught at the accredited institution of higher education. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21B-20 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21B-20)

7 Sec. 21B-20. Types of licenses. The State Board of 8 Education shall implement a system of educator licensure, 9 whereby individuals employed in school districts who are required to be licensed must have one of the following 10 licenses: (i) a professional educator license; 11 (ii) an 12 license with stipulations; (iii) a substitute educator teaching license; or (iv) until June 30, 2023, a short-term 13 14 substitute teaching license. References in law regarding individuals certified or certificated or required to be 15 16 certified or certificated under Article 21 of this Code shall 17 also include individuals licensed or required to be licensed under this Article. The first year of all licenses ends on June 18 19 30 following one full year of the license being issued.

The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board, may adopt such rules as may be necessary to govern the requirements for licenses and endorsements under this Section.

(1) Professional Educator License. Persons who (i) 1 2 have successfully completed an approved educator 3 preparation program and are recommended for licensure by the Illinois institution offering the educator preparation 4 5 program, (ii) have successfully completed the required testing under Section 21B-30 of this Code, (iii) have 6 7 successfully completed coursework on the psychology of, the identification of, and the methods of instruction for 8 9 exceptional child, including without limitation the 10 children with learning disabilities, (iv) have 11 successfully completed coursework in methods of reading 12 and reading in the content area, and (v) have met all other criteria established by rule of the State Board of 13 14 Education shall be issued a Professional Educator License. 15 All Professional Educator Licenses are valid until June 30 16 immediately following 5 years of the license being issued. 17 The Professional Educator License shall be endorsed with specific areas and grade levels in which the individual is 18 19 eligible to practice. For an early childhood education 20 endorsement, an individual may satisfy the student 21 teaching requirement of his or her early childhood teacher 22 preparation program through placement in a setting with 23 children from birth through grade 2, and the individual may be paid and receive credit while student teaching. The 24 25 student teaching experience must meet the requirements of 26 be approved by the individual's early childhood and

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1 teacher preparation program.

Individuals can receive subsequent endorsements on the Professional Educator License. Subsequent endorsements shall require a minimum of 24 semester hours of coursework in the endorsement area and passage of the applicable content area test, unless otherwise specified by rule.

7 (2) Educator License with Stipulations. An Educator
8 License with Stipulations shall be issued an endorsement
9 that limits the license holder to one particular position
10 or does not require completion of an approved educator
11 program or both.

12 An individual with an Educator License with 13 Stipulations must not be employed by a school district or 14 any other entity to replace any presently employed teacher 15 who otherwise would not be replaced for any reason.

16 An Educator License with Stipulations may be issued 17 with the following endorsements:

(A) (Blank).

(B) Alternative provisional educator. An
alternative provisional educator endorsement on an
Educator License with Stipulations may be issued to an
applicant who, at the time of applying for the
endorsement, has done all of the following:

(i) Graduated from a regionally accredited
college or university with a minimum of a
bachelor's degree.

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1(ii) Successfully completed the first phase of2the Alternative Educator Licensure Program for3Teachers, as described in Section 21B-50 of this4Code.

(iii) Passed a content area test, as required under Section 21B-30 of this Code.

7 The alternative provisional educator endorsement is 8 valid for 2 years of teaching and may be renewed for a 9 third year by an individual meeting the requirements set 10 forth in Section 21B-50 of this Code.

11 (C) Alternative provisional superintendent. An 12 alternative provisional superintendent endorsement on 13 an Educator License with Stipulations entitles the 14 holder to serve only as a superintendent or assistant 15 superintendent in a school district's central office. 16 This endorsement may only be issued to an applicant 17 who, at the time of applying for the endorsement, has done all of the following: 18

19(i) Graduated from a regionally accredited20college or university with a minimum of a master's21degree in a management field other than education.

(ii) Been employed for a period of at least 5
years in a management level position in a field
other than education.

25 (iii) Successfully completed the first phase26 of an alternative route to superintendent

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endorsement program, as provided in Section 21B-55 of this Code.

3 (iv) Passed a content area test required under Section 21B-30 of this Code.

The endorsement is valid for 2 fiscal years in order to complete one full year of serving as a superintendent or assistant superintendent.

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(D) (Blank).

9 (E) Career and technical educator. A career and 10 technical educator endorsement on an Educator License 11 with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who 12 has a minimum of 60 semester hours of coursework from a 13 regionally accredited institution of higher education or an accredited trade and technical institution and 14 has a minimum of 2,000 hours of experience outside of 15 16 education in each area to be taught.

17 The career and technical educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid until 18 19 June 30 immediately following 5 years of the 20 endorsement being issued and may be renewed.

individual who holds a valid career 21 An and 22 technical educator endorsement on an Educator License 23 with Stipulations but does not hold a bachelor's 24 degree may substitute teach in career and technical 25 education classrooms.

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(F) (Blank).

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1 (G) Transitional bilingual educator. А 2 transitional bilingual educator endorsement on an 3 Educator License with Stipulations may be issued for the purpose of providing instruction in accordance 4 5 with Article 14C of this Code to an applicant who provides satisfactory evidence that he or she meets 6 7 all of the following requirements:

8 (i) Possesses adequate speaking, reading, and 9 writing ability in the language other than English 10 in which transitional bilingual education is 11 offered.

12 (ii) Has the ability to successfully13 communicate in English.

14 Either possessed, within 5 (iii) years 15 previous to his or her applying for a transitional 16 bilingual educator endorsement, а valid and 17 comparable teaching certificate or comparable authorization issued by a foreign country or holds 18 a degree from an institution of higher learning in 19 20 а foreign country that the State Educator 21 Preparation and Licensure Board determines to be 22 the equivalent of a bachelor's degree from a 23 regionally accredited institution of higher learning in the United States. 24

25A transitional bilingual educator endorsement26shall be valid for prekindergarten through grade 12,

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is valid until June 30 immediately following 5 years
 of the endorsement being issued, and shall not be
 renewed.

Persons holding a transitional bilingual educator endorsement shall not be employed to replace any presently employed teacher who otherwise would not be replaced for any reason.

8 Language endorsement. In effort (H) an to 9 alleviate the shortage of teachers speaking a language 10 other than English in the public schools, an 11 individual who holds an Educator License with 12 apply for Stipulations may also а language 13 endorsement, provided that the applicant provides satisfactory evidence that he or she meets all of the 14 15 following requirements:

(i) Holds a transitional bilingual endorsement.

(ii) Has demonstrated proficiency in the
language for which the endorsement is to be issued
by passing the applicable language content test
required by the State Board of Education.

(iii) Holds a bachelor's degree or higher from
a regionally accredited institution of higher
education or, for individuals educated in a
country other than the United States, holds a
degree from an institution of higher learning in a

1 foreign country that the State Educator 2 Preparation and Licensure Board determines to be 3 the equivalent of a bachelor's degree from a 4 regionally accredited institution of higher 5 learning in the United States.

(iv) (Blank).

7 A language endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid for prekindergarten through 8 9 grade 12 for the same validity period as the 10 individual's transitional bilingual educator 11 endorsement on the Educator License with Stipulations 12 and shall not be renewed.

13 (I) Visiting international educator. A visiting international educator endorsement on an Educator 14 15 License with Stipulations may be issued to an 16 individual who is being recruited by a particular 17 school district that conducts formal recruitment programs outside of the United States to secure the 18 19 services of qualified teachers and who meets all of 20 the following requirements:

21 (i) Holds the equivalent of a minimum of a
22 bachelor's degree issued in the United States.

(ii) Has been prepared as a teacher at the grade level for which he or she will be employed.

(iii) Has adequate content knowledge in thesubject to be taught.

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(iv) Has an adequate command of the English
 language.

A holder of a visiting international educator 3 endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations 4 5 shall be permitted to teach in bilingual education 6 programs in the language that was the medium of 7 instruction in his or her teacher preparation program, 8 provided that he or she passes the English Language 9 Proficiency Examination or another test of writing 10 skills in English identified by the State Board of 11 Education, in consultation with the State Educator 12 Preparation and Licensure Board.

13A visiting international educator endorsement on14an Educator License with Stipulations is valid for 515years and shall not be renewed.

16 (J) Paraprofessional educator. A paraprofessional 17 educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who holds a 18 19 high school diploma or its recognized equivalent and 20 (i) holds an associate's degree or a minimum of 60 21 semester hours of credit from a regionally accredited 22 institution of higher education; (ii) has passed a 23 paraprofessional competency test under subsection (c-5) of Section 21B-30; or (iii) is at least 18 years 24 25 of age and will be using the Educator License with 26 Stipulations exclusively for grades prekindergarten

through grade 8, until the individual reaches the age 1 2 of 19 years and otherwise meets the criteria for a 3 paraprofessional educator endorsement pursuant to this (J). The paraprofessional 4 subparagraph educator 5 endorsement is valid until June 30 immediately 6 following 5 years of the endorsement being issued and 7 may be renewed through application and payment of the appropriate fee, as required under Section 21B-40 of 8 9 this Code. An individual who holds onlv a paraprofessional educator endorsement is not subject 10 to additional requirements in order to renew the 11 12 endorsement.

(K) Chief school business official. A chief school 13 14 business official endorsement on an Educator License 15 with Stipulations may be issued to an applicant who 16 qualifies by having a master's degree or higher, 2 17 years of full-time administrative experience in school business management or 2 years of university-approved 18 19 practical experience, and a minimum of 24 semester 20 hours of graduate credit in a program approved by the 21 State Board of Education for the preparation of school 22 business administrators and by passage of the 23 applicable State tests, including an applicable 24 content area test.

25The chief school business official endorsement may26also be affixed to the Educator License with

Stipulations of any holder who qualifies by having a 1 2 master's degree in business administration, finance, 3 accounting, or public administration and who completes an additional 6 semester hours of internship in school 4 5 business management from a regionally accredited 6 institution of higher education and passes the 7 applicable State tests, including an applicable 8 content area test. This endorsement shall be required 9 for any individual employed as a chief school business 10 official.

11 The chief school business official endorsement on 12 an Educator License with Stipulations is valid until 13 June immediately following 5 years of 30 the 14 endorsement being issued and may be renewed if the 15 license holder completes renewal requirements as 16 required for individuals who hold a Professional 17 Educator License endorsed for chief school business official under Section 21B-45 of this Code and such 18 19 rules as may be adopted by the State Board of 20 Education.

21 The State Board of Education shall adopt any rules 22 necessary to implement Public Act 100-288.

(L) Provisional in-state educator. A provisional
 in-state educator endorsement on an Educator License
 with Stipulations may be issued to a candidate who has
 completed an Illinois-approved educator preparation

program at an Illinois institution of higher education and who has not successfully completed an evidence-based assessment of teacher effectiveness but who meets all of the following requirements:

(i) Holds at least a bachelor's degree.

6 (ii) Has completed an approved educator
7 preparation program at an Illinois institution.

8 (iii) Has passed an applicable content area
9 test, as required by Section 21B-30 of this Code.

10 (iv) Has attempted an evidence-based 11 assessment of teacher effectiveness and received a 12 minimum score on that assessment, as established 13 by the State Board of Education in consultation 14 with the State Educator Preparation and Licensure 15 Board.

A provisional in-state educator endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations is valid for one full fiscal year after the date of issuance and may not be renewed.

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(M) (Blank).

(N) Specialized services. A specialized services
endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations
may be issued as defined and specified by rule.

24(0) Specialized Educator. A specialized educator25endorsement on an Educator License with Stipulations26may be issued to an applicant who, at the time of

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1	applying for the endorsement, meets all the following
2	<u>criteria:</u>
3	(i) Has graduated from an institution of
4	higher education accredited by the Higher Learning
5	Commission with a master's degree or higher.
6	<u>(</u> ii) Was employed in good standing in a
7	teaching position at an institution of higher
8	education in this State accredited by the Higher
9	Learning Commission that has officially announced
10	its intent to cease all academic programming at
11	the time the announcement was officially made or
12	was employed in good standing in a teaching
13	position at an institution of higher education in
14	this State accredited by the Higher Learning
15	Commission that has ceased all academic
16	programming within 5 years prior to or on or after
17	the effective date of this amendatory Act of the
18	103rd General Assembly.
19	(iii) Has a minimum of 5 years of experience
20	teaching at an institution of higher education in
21	this State accredited by the Higher Learning
22	Commission.
23	(iv) Has completed a minimum of 6 semester
24	hours of coursework from a State-approved educator
25	preparation program, or has taught educational
26	methods at an institution of higher education

1	accredited by the Higher Learning Commission for a					
2	minimum of 2 years if the applicant has not					
3	completed a minimum of 6 semester hours of					
4	coursework from a State-approved educator					
5	preparation program.					
6	(v) Has passed a content area test, as					
7	required under Section 21B-30 of this Code, in a					
8	content area in which he or she taught at the					
9	institution of higher education accredited by the					
10	Higher Learning Commission.					
11	The specialized educator endorsement is valid					
12	until June 30 immediately following 5 years of the					
13	endorsement being issued and may be renewed.					
14	The holder of a specialized educator endorsement					
15	shall be permitted to teach in the content area in					
16	which he or she previously taught at the institution					
17	of higher education accredited by the Higher Learning					
18	Commission.					
19	The State Board of Education may adopt any rules					
20	necessary to implement this subsection.					
21	(3) Substitute Teaching License. A Substitute Teaching					
22	License may be issued to qualified applicants for					
23	substitute teaching in all grades of the public schools,					
24	prekindergarten through grade 12. Substitute Teaching					
25	Licenses are not eligible for endorsements. Applicants for					
26	a Substitute Teaching License must hold a bachelor's					

degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution of higher education or must be enrolled in an approved educator preparation program in this State and have earned at least 90 credit hours.

Substitute Teaching Licenses are valid for 5 years.

6 Substitute Teaching Licenses are valid for substitute 7 teaching in every county of this State. If an individual 8 has had his or her Professional Educator License or 9 Educator License with Stipulations suspended or revoked, 10 then that individual is not eligible to obtain a 11 Substitute Teaching License.

12 A substitute teacher may only teach in the place of a 13 licensed teacher who is under contract with the employing 14 board. If, however, there is no licensed teacher under 15 contract because of an emergency situation, then a 16 district may employ a substitute teacher for no longer 17 than 30 calendar days per each vacant position in the district if the district notifies the appropriate regional 18 19 office of education within 5 business days after the 20 employment of the substitute teacher in the emergency situation. An emergency situation is one in which an 21 22 unforeseen vacancy has occurred and (i) a teacher is 23 unable to fulfill his or her contractual duties or (ii) 24 teacher capacity needs of the district exceed previous 25 indications, and the district is actively engaged in 26 advertising to hire a fully licensed teacher for the

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1 vacant position.

2 There is no limit on the number of days that a 3 substitute teacher may teach in a single school district, provided that no substitute teacher may teach for longer 4 5 than 120 days beginning with the 2021-2022 school year through the 2022-2023 school year, otherwise 90 school 6 7 days for any one licensed teacher under contract in the 8 school year. A substitute teacher who holds a same 9 Professional Educator License or Educator License with 10 Stipulations shall not teach for more than 120 school days 11 for any one licensed teacher under contract in the same 12 school year. The limitations in this paragraph (3) on the number of days a substitute teacher may be employed do not 13 14 apply to any school district operating under Article 34 of 15 this Code.

A school district may not require an individual who holds a valid Professional Educator License or Educator License with Stipulations to seek or hold a Substitute Teaching License to teach as a substitute teacher.

(4) Short-Term Substitute Teaching License. Beginning
on July 1, 2018 and until June 30, 2023, the State Board of
Education may issue a Short-Term Substitute Teaching
License. A Short-Term Substitute Teaching License may be
issued to a qualified applicant for substitute teaching in
all grades of the public schools, prekindergarten through
grade 12. Short-Term Substitute Teaching Licenses are not

eligible for endorsements. Applicants for a Short-Term
 Substitute Teaching License must hold an associate's
 degree or have completed at least 60 credit hours from a
 regionally accredited institution of higher education.

5 Short-Term Substitute Teaching Licenses are valid for 6 substitute teaching in every county of this State. If an 7 individual has had his or her Professional Educator 8 License or Educator License with Stipulations suspended or 9 revoked, then that individual is not eligible to obtain a 10 Short-Term Substitute Teaching License.

11The provisions of Sections 10-21.9 and 34-18.5 of this12Code apply to short-term substitute teachers.

13 An individual holding a Short-Term Substitute Teaching 14 License may teach no more than 15 consecutive days per 15 licensed teacher who is under contract. For teacher 16 absences lasting 6 or more days per licensed teacher who 17 is under contract, a school district may not hire an individual holding a Short-Term Substitute 18 Teaching 19 License, unless the Governor has declared a disaster due 20 to a public health emergency pursuant to Section 7 of the 21 Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act. An individual 22 holding a Short-Term Substitute Teaching License must 23 complete the training program under Section 10-20.67 or 24 34-18.60 of this Code to be eligible to teach at a public 25 school. This paragraph (4) is inoperative on and after 26 July 1, 2023.
