1 AN ACT concerning safety.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Pesticide Application at Schools Act.

6 Section 5. Legislative findings. The General Assembly7 finds that:

8 (1) schools throughout the State treat school property 9 with pesticides in order to reduce risks to students from 10 noxious weeds, such as thistle, poison ivy, pests, 11 allergies, disease bearing insects, and activities on 12 unlevel playing surfaces;

13 (2) unless properly applied in accordance with the 14 United States Environmental Protection Agency's pesticide 15 labels, schools may inadvertently expose children to 16 pesticides; and

17 (3) it is the purpose of this Act to minimize student18 exposure to pesticides.

Section 10. Definition. As used in this Act, "school day" has the same meaning given to that term in Section 300.11 of the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. SB1772 Enrolled - 2 - LRB103 28768 CPF 55151 b

1 Section 15. Pesticide application prohibited. Beginning 2 July 1, 2024, a school serving students grades kindergarten through 8th grade is prohibited from scheduling pesticide 3 applications on school grounds during the school day, 4 5 including during a partial day, when students are in 6 attendance at school for instructional purposes. Areas 7 prohibited from treatment include paved surfaces, playgrounds, 8 and playing fields. This Section shall not apply to areas of 9 school grounds where children are not typically present, 10 including, but not limited to, flower beds and lawns 11 surrounding the school not used as playing fields.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
