

103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 SB1803

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 805/805-72 new

20 ILCS 862/36

20 ILCS 862/36.3 new

30 ILCS 105/5.990 new

Amends the Department of Natural Resources (Conservation) Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Provides that the Department of Natural Resources shall coordinate with the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Public Health, and members of the University of Illinois' INHS Medical Entomology Program to establish the Lyme Disease Innovation Program no later than one year after the effective date of the amendatory Act. Provides that the Department shall contract with a not-for-profit organization whose purpose is to raise awareness of tick-borne diseases with the public and the medical community to operate the Program. Provides that the Program's purpose is to raise awareness with the public and to assist persons at risk of Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases with education and awareness materials and campaigns while developing evidence-based approaches that are cost-effective. Includes provisions relating to the Program's objectives. Provides that the Program shall be funded by the Lyme Disease Awareness Fund. Amends the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act. Provides that the Department of Natural Resources shall issue to an off-highway vehicle owner an Off-Highway Vehicle Usage Stamp, and the Stamp shall be \$10 or \$5 depending on the size of the vehicle's engine capacity. Provides that the proceeds from the Stamp must be deposited into the Lyme Disease Awareness Fund. Makes a conforming change. Amends the State Finance Act to make a conforming change. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning State government. 1

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- 4 Section 5. The Department of Natural Resources 5 (Conservation) Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by adding Section 805-72 as follows:

- Sec. 805-72. Lyme Disease Innovation Program. 8
- 9 (a) The Department shall coordinate with the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Public Health, and members of 10 the University of Illinois' INHS Medical Entomology Program to 11 12 establish the Lyme Disease Innovation Program no later than one year after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 13 14 103rd General Assembly. The Department shall contract with a not-for-profit organization whose purpose is to raise 15 16 awareness of tick-borne diseases with the public and the medical community to operate the Program. The Program's 17 purpose is to raise awareness with the public and to assist 18 19 persons at risk of Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases 20 with education and awareness materials and campaigns while 21 developing evidence-based approaches that are cost-effective.
 - (b) The Program shall implement a statewide interagency and multipronged approach to combat Lyme disease and other

5	objectives include:
6	(1) bringing awareness of Lyme disease and tick-borne
7	diseases by any one or more of the following methods:
8	(A) creating innovative ideas and collaborations
9	for raising awareness about risks and prevention;
10	(B) amplifying and improving access to essential
11	information supporting innovations in prevention,
12	education, and care with open data and science;
13	(C) fostering the development of new,
14	community-based education and prevention efforts; and
15	(D) using programs, website advertising,
16	pamphlets, or other methods to increase the awareness
17	of Lyme disease and tick-borne diseases;
18	(2) engaging stakeholders to facilitate
19	patient-centered innovations by (i) building trust among
20	stakeholders through listening sessions, roundtables, and
21	other learning approaches that ground innovations in lived
22	experience, (ii) engaging stakeholders in identifying
23	current areas of need to promote targeted innovations that
24	will make real-world improvements in quality of care, and
25	(iii) gaining insight into patient needs and priorities
26	through stakeholders' collective wisdom and applying that

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- (3) advance stakeholder driven interdisciplinary and interagency collaborations by providing resources to not-for-profit organizations whose purpose is to raise awareness of tick-borne diseases with the public and the medical community in order to (i) facilitate the stakeholder engagement and collaborations and patient-centered innovations and support groups, (ii) identify ways to better collect and share data while raising awareness of tick-borne illnesses, and (iii) assist with the development of outreach and education materials and approaches for State agencies.
- (c) The Program shall be funded through moneys deposited into the Lyme Disease Awareness Fund and other appropriations.

 The not-for-profit organization contracted with to operate the Program shall be paid for its operation of the Program from moneys deposited into the Fund or from other appropriations.
- (d) The Department, the Department of Agriculture, and the Department of Public Health must adopt rules or joint rules to implement this Section.
- Section 10. The Recreational Trails of Illinois Act is amended by changing Section 36 and by adding Section 36.3 as follows:

- 1 Sec. 36. Falsification. No person shall falsely alter or
- 2 change in any manner the Off-Highway Vehicle Usage Stamp or
- 3 Off-Highway Vehicle Lyme Disease Awareness Stamp issued under
- 4 the provisions of this Act, or falsify any record required by
- 5 this Act, or counterfeit any form of license provided for by
- 6 this Act. Any person found guilty of this Section shall be
- 7 quilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

- 10 Sec. 36.3. Off-Highway Vehicle Lyme Disease Awareness
- 11 Stamp.
- 12 (a) As used in this Section, "Stamp" means an Off-Highway
- 13 Vehicle Lyme Disease Awareness Stamp.
- 14 (b) The Department shall issue to an off-highway vehicle
- owner an Off-Highway Vehicle Usage Stamp. The Stamp is a
- separate and additional requirement from the other off-highway
- 17 vehicle stickers or stamps under this Act. Except as provided
- in this Section, a person shall not, on or after March 1, 2024,
- 19 operate any off-highway vehicle within the State unless the
- 20 off-highway vehicle has attached a Stamp purchased and
- 21 displayed in accordance with the provisions of this Section.
- The Department shall adopt rules for the purchase of Stamps.
- 23 (c) The fee for a Stamp for a vehicle with an engine
- 24 capacity of over 75 cubic centimeters shall be \$10 annually
- and shall expire the March 31st following the year displayed

- on the Stamp. The fee for a Stamp for a vehicle with an engine
- 2 capacity of 75 cubic centimeters or below shall be \$5 annually
- 3 and shall expire the March 31st following the year displayed
- 4 on the Stamp.
- 5 The Department shall deposit all moneys from the sale of
- 6 each Stamp into the Lyme Disease Awareness Fund, a special
- fund that is created in the State treasury, and, as directed by
- 8 the Department, may be expended for the Lyme Disease
- 9 Innovation Program under Section 805-72 of the Department of
- 10 Natural Resources (Conservation) Law of the Civil
- 11 Administrative Code of Illinois.
- 12 (d) The owner of an off-highway vehicle shall prominently
- display the Stamp on the forward half of the off-highway
- 14 vehicle.
- (e) The operator of an off-highway vehicle must purchase a
- 16 new Stamp if a previous Stamp is destroyed, lost, stolen, or
- 17 mutilated beyond legibility. A valid Stamp already displayed
- on an off-highway vehicle that is sold or transferred remains
- valid until the date the Stamp expires.
- 20 (f) The operator of an off-highway vehicle is not required
- 21 to display a Stamp if the off-highway vehicle falls into any of
- the exceptions from display under Section 34.
- 23 Section 90. The State Finance Act is amended by adding
- 24 Section 5.990 as follows:
