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1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
2-3.163 as follows:

8 Services database <u>information for students and parents or</u>
9 <u>guardians</u>.

10 (a) The General Assembly makes all of the following 11 findings:

(1) <u>Pursuant to Section 10-26 of the Department of</u> <u>Human Services Act, the</u> The Department of Human Services maintains a statewide database known as the <u>PUNS database</u> Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services that records information about individuals with <u>intellectual</u> <u>disabilities or</u> developmental disabilities who are potentially in need of services.

19 (2) The Department of Human Services uses the data on
 20 <u>PUNS</u> Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services to
 21 select individuals for services as funding becomes
 22 available, to develop proposals and materials for
 23 budgeting, and to plan for future needs.

(3) The PUNS database Prioritization of Urgency of 1 Need for Services is available for children and adults 2 3 intellectual disabilities or a developmental with disabilities disability who have an unmet service needs 4 5 need anticipated in the next 5 years. The PUNS database is also available for children with intellectual disabilities 6 7 or developmental disabilities with unmet service needs.

(4) Registration to be included on the PUNS database 8 9 Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services is the 10 first step toward <u>receiving</u> getting developmental 11 disabilities services in this State. A child or an adult 12 who is If individuals are not on the PUNS database will not 13 be Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services waiting list, they are not in queue for State developmental 14 15 disabilities services.

16 (5) Lack of awareness and information about the PUNS 17 database results in underutilization or delays in registration for the PUNS database by students with 18 intellectual disabilities or developmental disabilities 19 20 and their parents or guardians Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services may be underutilized by children and 21 22 their parents or quardians due to lack of awareness or 23 lack of information.

24 (a-5) The purpose of this Section is to ensure that each 25 student with an intellectual disability or a developmental 26 disability who has an individualized education program ("IEP") SB2039 Engrossed - 3 - LRB103 27611 RJT 53987 b

and the student's parents or quardian are informed about the 1 2 PUNS database, where to register for the PUNS database, and 3 whom they can contact for information about the PUNS database and the PUNS database registration process. This Section is 4 5 not intended to change the PUNS database registration process established by the Department of Human Services or to impose 6 any responsibility on the State Board of Education or a school 7 8 district to register students for the PUNS database.

9 <u>(a-10) As used in this Section, "PUNS" means the</u> 10 <u>Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services database or</u> 11 <u>PUNS database developed and maintained by the Department of</u> 12 <u>Human Services pursuant to Section 10-26 of the Department of</u> 13 <u>Human Services Act.</u>

(b) The State Board of Education <u>shall</u> may work <u>in</u> <u>consultation with the Department of Human Services and</u> with school districts to <u>ensure that</u> <u>inform</u> all students with <u>intellectual disabilities or</u> developmental disabilities and their parents or guardians <u>are informed</u> about the <u>PUNS</u> <u>Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services</u> database, <u>as</u> described in subsections (c), (c-5), and (d) of this Section.

(c) <u>The</u> Subject to appropriation, the Department of Human Services and State Board of Education shall develop and implement an online, computer-based training program for at least one designated employee in every public school in this State to educate <u>the designated employee or employees</u> him or her about the <u>PUNS</u> Prioritization of Urgency of Need for

Services database and steps required to register students for 1 2 the PUNS database, including the documentation and information 3 parents or guardians will need for the registration process to be taken to ensure children and adolescents are enrolled. The 4 5 training shall include instruction on identifying and 6 contacting for at least one designated employee in every 7 public school in contacting the appropriate developmental disabilities Independent Service Coordination agency ("ISC") 8 9 to register students for the PUNS database enroll children and adolescents in the database. The training of the designated 10 11 employee or employees shall also include information about 12 organizations and programs available in this State that offer assistance to families in understanding the PUNS database and 13 14 navigating the PUNS database registration process. Each school district shall post on its public website and include in its 15 16 student handbook the names of the designated trained employee 17 or employees in each school within the school district. At least one designated employee in every public school shall 18 19 ensure the opportunity to enroll in the Prioritization of 20 Urgency of Need for Services database is discussed during 21 annual individualized education program (IEP) meetings for all 22 children and adolescents believed to have a developmental 23 disability.

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24 (c-5) During the student's annual IEP review meeting, if
 25 the student has an intellectual disability or a developmental
 26 disability, the student's IEP team shall determine the

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student's PUNS database registration status based upon 1 2 information provided by the student's parents or guardian or by the student. If it is determined that the student is not 3 registered for the PUNS database or if it is unclear whether 4 5 the student is registered for the PUNS database, the parents or quardian and the student shall be referred to a designated 6 7 employee of the public school who has completed the training described in subsection (c). The designated trained employee 8 9 shall provide the student's parents or guardian and the student with the name, location, and contact information of 10 11 the appropriate ISC to contact in order to register the 12 student for the PUNS database. The designated trained employee 13 shall also identify for the parents or quardian and the 14 student the information and documentation they will need to 15 complete the PUNS database registration process with the ISC, 16 and shall also provide information to the parents or quardian 17 and the student about organizations and programs available in this State that offer information to families about the PUNS 18 19 database and the PUNS database registration process.

(d) The State Board of Education, in consultation with the Department of Human Services, through school districts, shall provide to <u>the</u> parents and guardians of <u>each student with an</u> <u>IEP students</u> a copy of <u>the latest version of</u> the Department of Human Services's guide titled "Understanding PUNS: A Guide to Prioritization for Urgency of Need for Services" each year at the annual review meeting for the student's individualized SB2039 Engrossed - 6 - LRB103 27611 RJT 53987 b

- education program, including the consideration required in subsection (e) of this Section.
- 3 (e) <u>(Blank).</u> The Department of Human Services shall 4 consider the length of time spent on the Prioritization of 5 Urgency of Need for Services waiting list, in addition to 6 other factors considered, when selecting individuals on the 7 list for services.
