2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 2039 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section Section 2-3.163 as follows:
6	(105 ILCS 5/2-3.163)
7	Sec. 2-3.163. PUNS Prioritization of Urgency of Need for
8	Services database information for students and parents or
9	guardians.
10	(a) The General Assembly makes all of the following
11	findings:
12	(1) <u>Pursuant to Section 10-26 of the Department of</u>
13	Human Services Act, the The Department of Human Services
14	maintains a statewide database known as the <u>PUNS</u>
15	Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services that
16	records information about individuals with intellectual

<u>disabilities or</u> developmental disabilities who are
 potentially in need of services.

3 (2) The Department of Human Services uses the data on
4 <u>PUNS</u> Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services to
5 select individuals for services as funding becomes
6 available, to develop proposals and materials for
7 budgeting, and to plan for future needs.

8 (3) <u>The PUNS database</u> Prioritization of Urgency of 9 <u>Need for Services</u> is available for children and adults 10 with <u>intellectual disabilities</u> or a developmental 11 <u>disabilities</u> disability who have an unmet service <u>needs</u> 12 need anticipated in the next 5 years. <u>The PUNS database is</u> 13 <u>also available for children with intellectual disabilities</u> 14 or developmental disabilities with unmet service needs.

15 (4) Registration to be included on the PUNS database Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services is the 16 17 first step toward <u>receiving</u> getting developmental disabilities services in this State. A child or an adult 18 19 who is If individuals are not on the PUNS database, will 20 not be Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services 21 waiting list, they are not in queue for State 22 developmental disabilities services.

(5) Lack of awareness and information about the PUNS
 database results in underutilization or delays in
 registration for the PUNS by students with intellectual
 disabilities or developmental disabilities and their

parents or guardians Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services may be underutilized by children and their parents or guardians due to lack of awareness or lack of information.

5 (b) The State Board of Education <u>shall</u> may work <u>in</u> 6 <u>collaboration with the Department of Human Services and</u> with 7 school districts to <u>ensure that</u> <u>inform</u> all students with 8 <u>intellectual disabilities or</u> developmental disabilities and 9 their parents or guardians <u>are informed</u> about the <u>PUNS</u> 10 <u>Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services</u> database, <u>as</u> 11 <u>described in subsections (c), (d) and (e) of this Section</u>.

As used in this Section "PUNS" means the Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services database developed and maintained by the Department of Human Services.

15 (c) The Subject to appropriation, the Department of Human 16 Services and State Board of Education shall develop and implement an online, computer-based training program for at 17 18 least one designated employee in every public school in this 19 State to educate the designated employee or employees him or 20 her about the PUNS Prioritization of Urgency of Need for 21 Services database and steps required to register students for 22 the PUNS, including the documentation and information the 23 parents or guardian will need for the registration process. to 24 be taken to ensure children and adolescents are enrolled. The 25 training shall include instruction on identifying and 26 contacting for at least one designated employee in every

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1 public school in contacting the appropriate developmental disabilities Independent Service Coordination agency ("ISC") 2 to register students for the PUNS. enroll children and 3 4 adolescents in the database. The training of the designated 5 employee or employees shall also include information about organizations and programs available in this State that offer 6 assistance to families in understanding the PUNS and 7 navigating the PUNS registration process. Each school district 8 9 shall post on its public website and include in its student 10 handbook the names of the designated trained employee or 11 employees in each school within the school district. At least one designated employee in every public school shall ensure 12 13 the opportunity to enroll in the Prioritization of Urgency of Services database is discussed during 14 for Needannual 15 individualized education program (IEP) meetings 16 children and adolescents believed to have a developmental 17 disability.

(c-5) At least one of the designated trained employees in 18 the public school shall ensure that each student's PUNS 19 20 registration status is discussed during the student's annual individualized education program (IEP) review meeting if the 21 22 student is believed to have an intellectual disability or a developmental disability. The annual review IEP conference 23 24 report shall indicate whether the student is registered for 25 the PUNS based upon information provided by the student, parent or quardian. If it is determined that the student may 26

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1 not be registered for the PUNS, one of the designated trained employees in the public school shall provide the student's 2 parent or guardian the name, location and contact information 3 4 of the appropriate ISC to contact in order to register the 5 student for the PUNS and the documentation and information the parents or quardian will need to complete the registration 6 process with the ISC. A trained designated employee of the 7 public school shall also provide the parents or quardian with 8 9 information about organizations or programs available in this 10 State that offer assistance to families to understand and the 11 PUNS database and navigate the PUNS registration process.

(d) The State Board of Education, in consultation with the 12 Department of Human Services, through school districts, shall 13 14 provide to parents and quardians of each student with an IEP 15 students a copy of the latest version of the Department of 16 Human Services's guide titled "Understanding PUNS: A Guide to Prioritization for Urgency of Need for Services" each year at 17 the annual review meeting for the student's individualized 18 19 education program, including the consideration required in 20 subsection (c) of this Section.

(e) <u>(Blank).</u> The Department of Human Services shall
consider the length of time spent on the Prioritization of
Urgency of Need for Services waiting list, in addition to
other factors considered, when selecting individuals on the
list for services.
