1 AN ACT concerning finance.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Procurement Code is amended by 5 changing Section 20-10 as follows:

9 Sec. 20-10. Competitive sealed bidding; reverse auction.

(a) Conditions for use. All contracts shall be awarded by
 competitive sealed bidding except as otherwise provided in
 Section 20-5.

(b) Invitation for bids. An invitation for bids shall be issued and shall include a purchase description and the material contractual terms and conditions applicable to the procurement.

(c) Public notice. Public notice of the invitation for bids shall be published in the Illinois Procurement Bulletin at least 14 calendar days before the date set in the invitation for the opening of bids.

(d) Bid opening. Bids shall be opened publicly or through an electronic procurement system in the presence of one or more witnesses at the time and place designated in the SB2192 Engrossed - 2 - LRB103 25677 HLH 52026 b

invitation for bids. The name of each bidder, including earned and applied bid credit from the Illinois Works Jobs Program Act, the amount of each bid, and other relevant information as may be specified by rule shall be recorded. After the award of the contract, the winning bid and the record of each unsuccessful bid shall be open to public inspection.

7 (e) Bid acceptance and bid evaluation. Bids shall be 8 unconditionally accepted without alteration or correction, 9 except as authorized in this Code. Bids shall be evaluated 10 based on the requirements set forth in the invitation for 11 bids, which may include criteria to determine acceptability 12 such as inspection, testing, quality, workmanship, delivery, and suitability for a particular purpose. Those criteria that 13 14 will affect the bid price and be considered in evaluation for 15 award, such as discounts, transportation costs, and total or 16 life cycle costs, shall be objectively measurable. The 17 invitation for bids shall set forth the evaluation criteria to be used. 18

(f) Correction or withdrawal of bids. Correction or 19 20 withdrawal of inadvertently erroneous bids before or after award, or cancellation of awards of contracts based on bid 21 22 mistakes, shall be permitted in accordance with rules. After 23 bid opening, no changes in bid prices or other provisions of 24 bids prejudicial to the interest of the State or fair 25 competition shall be permitted. All decisions to permit the correction or withdrawal of bids based on bid mistakes shall 26

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be supported by written determination made by a State purchasing officer.

(q) Award. The contract shall be awarded with reasonable 3 promptness by written notice to the lowest responsible and 4 5 responsive bidder whose bid meets the requirements and criteria set forth in the invitation for bids, except when a 6 State purchasing officer determines it is not in the best 7 8 interest of the State and by written explanation determines 9 another bidder shall receive the award. The explanation shall 10 appear in the appropriate volume of the Illinois Procurement 11 Bulletin. The written explanation must include:

(1) a description of the agency's needs;

13 (2) a determination that the anticipated cost will be14 fair and reasonable;

15 (3) a listing of all responsible and responsive16 bidders; and

17 (4) the name of the bidder selected, the total
18 contract price, and the reasons for selecting that bidder.
19 Each chief procurement officer may adopt guidelines to
20 implement the requirements of this subsection (g).

The written explanation shall be filed with the Legislative Audit Commission, and the Commission on Equity and Inclusion, and the Procurement Policy Board, and be made available for inspection by the public, within 14 calendar days after the agency's decision to award the contract.

26 (g-5) Failed bid notice. In addition to the requirements

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of subsection (g), if a bidder has failed to be awarded a 1 2 contract after 4 consecutive bids to provide the same services 3 to the Department of Transportation, the Capital Development Board, or the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority, the 4 5 applicable chief procurement officer for the respective agency shall in writing detail why all 4 bids were rejected. The chief 6 7 procurement officer shall submit by certified copy to the bidder the reasoning for the rejection of the bid within the 8 9 same calendar quarter in which the fourth bid was rejected and prior to 15 days before the next Illinois Procurement Bulletin 10 11 for that type of bid.

(h) Multi-step sealed bidding. When it is considered impracticable to initially prepare a purchase description to support an award based on price, an invitation for bids may be issued requesting the submission of unpriced offers to be followed by an invitation for bids limited to those bidders whose offers have been qualified under the criteria set forth in the first solicitation.

19 (i) Alternative procedures. Notwithstanding any other 20 provision of this Act to the contrary, the Director of the 21 Illinois Power Agency may create alternative bidding 22 procedures to be used in procuring professional services under 23 Section 1-56, subsections (a) and (c) of Section 1-75 and subsection (d) of Section 1-78 of the Illinois Power Agency 24 25 Act and Section 16-111.5(c) of the Public Utilities Act and to 26 procure renewable energy resources under Section 1-56 of the

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Illinois Power Agency Act. These alternative procedures shall be set forth together with the other criteria contained in the invitation for bids, and shall appear in the appropriate volume of the Illinois Procurement Bulletin.

(i) Reverse auction. Notwithstanding any other provision 5 of this Section and in accordance with rules adopted by the 6 chief procurement officer, that chief procurement officer may 7 8 procure supplies or services through a competitive electronic 9 auction bidding process after the chief procurement officer 10 determines that the use of such a process will be in the best 11 interest of the State. The chief procurement officer shall 12 publish that determination in his or her next volume of the 13 Illinois Procurement Bulletin.

An invitation for bids shall be issued and shall include (i) a procurement description, (ii) all contractual terms, whenever practical, and (iii) conditions applicable to the procurement, including a notice that bids will be received in an electronic auction manner.

19 Public notice of the invitation for bids shall be given in 20 the same manner as provided in subsection (c).

Bids shall be accepted electronically at the time and in the manner designated in the invitation for bids. During the auction, a bidder's price shall be disclosed to other bidders. Bidders shall have the opportunity to reduce their bid prices during the auction. 1 shall be open to public inspection.

After the auction period has terminated, withdrawal of
bids shall be permitted as provided in subsection (f).

The contract shall be awarded within 60 calendar days after the auction by written notice to the lowest responsible bidder, or all bids shall be rejected except as otherwise provided in this Code. Extensions of the date for the award may be made by mutual written consent of the State purchasing officer and the lowest responsible bidder.

10 This subsection does not apply to (i) procurements of 11 professional and artistic services, (ii) telecommunications 12 services, communication services, and information services, 13 and (iii) contracts for construction projects, including 14 design professional services.

2 (c) Public notice. Public notice of the invitation for 3 bids shall be published in the Illinois Procurement Bulletin 4 at least 14 calendar days before the date set in the invitation 5 for the opening of bids.

6 (d) Bid opening. Bids shall be opened publicly or through 7 an electronic procurement system in the presence of one or 8 more witnesses at the time and place designated in the 9 invitation for bids. The name of each bidder, including earned 10 and applied bid credit from the Illinois Works Jobs Program 11 Act, the amount of each bid, and other relevant information as 12 may be specified by rule shall be recorded. After the award of the contract, the winning bid and the record of each 13 14 unsuccessful bid shall be open to public inspection.

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(f) Correction or withdrawal of bids. Correction or 1 2 withdrawal of inadvertently erroneous bids before or after award, or cancellation of awards of contracts based on bid 3 mistakes, shall be permitted in accordance with rules. After 4 5 bid opening, no changes in bid prices or other provisions of bids prejudicial to the interest of the State or fair 6 7 competition shall be permitted. All decisions to permit the correction or withdrawal of bids based on bid mistakes shall 8 9 be supported by written determination made by a State 10 purchasing officer.

11 (q) Award. The contract shall be awarded with reasonable 12 promptness by written notice to the lowest responsible and 13 responsive bidder whose bid meets the requirements and 14 criteria set forth in the invitation for bids, except when a 15 State purchasing officer determines it is not in the best 16 interest of the State and by written explanation determines 17 another bidder shall receive the award. The explanation shall appear in the appropriate volume of the Illinois Procurement 18 19 Bulletin. The written explanation must include:

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(1) a description of the agency's needs;

(2) a determination that the anticipated cost will be
fair and reasonable;

23 (3) a listing of all responsible and responsive24 bidders; and

(4) the name of the bidder selected, the totalcontract price, and the reasons for selecting that bidder.

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Each chief procurement officer may adopt guidelines to
 implement the requirements of this subsection (g).

3 The written explanation shall be filed with the 4 Legislative Audit Commission, and the Commission on Equity and 5 Inclusion, and the Procurement Policy Board, and be made 6 available for inspection by the public, within 14 days after 7 the agency's decision to award the contract.

(g-5) Failed bid notice. In addition to the requirements 8 9 of subsection (g), if a bidder has failed to be awarded a 10 contract after 4 consecutive bids to provide the same services 11 to the Department of Transportation, the Capital Development 12 Board, or the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority, the 13 applicable chief procurement officer for the respective agency 14 shall in writing detail why all 4 bids were rejected. The chief procurement officer shall submit by certified copy to the 15 16 bidder the reasoning for the rejection of the bid within the 17 same calendar quarter in which the fourth bid was rejected and prior to 15 days before the next Illinois Procurement Bulletin 18 19 for that type of bid.

(h) Multi-step sealed bidding. When it is considered impracticable to initially prepare a purchase description to support an award based on price, an invitation for bids may be issued requesting the submission of unpriced offers to be followed by an invitation for bids limited to those bidders whose offers have been qualified under the criteria set forth in the first solicitation. (i) Alternative procedures. Notwithstanding any other 1 2 provision of this Act to the contrary, the Director of the 3 Illinois Power Agency may create alternative bidding procedures to be used in procuring professional services under 4 5 subsections (a) and (c) of Section 1-75 and subsection (d) of Section 1-78 of the Illinois Power Agency Act and Section 6 7 16-111.5(c) of the Public Utilities Act and to procure renewable energy resources under Section 1-56 of the Illinois 8 9 Power Agency Act. These alternative procedures shall be set 10 forth together with the other criteria contained in the 11 invitation for bids, and shall appear in the appropriate 12 volume of the Illinois Procurement Bulletin.

13 (j) Reverse auction. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section and in accordance with rules adopted by the 14 chief procurement officer, that chief procurement officer may 15 16 procure supplies or services through a competitive electronic 17 auction bidding process after the chief procurement officer determines that the use of such a process will be in the best 18 interest of the State. The chief procurement officer shall 19 20 publish that determination in his or her next volume of the Illinois Procurement Bulletin. 21
