A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 1. The sum of \$782,207,200, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
7 to the Department of Human Services for ordinary and contingent
8 expenses of the department, permanent improvements and for
9 student, member or inmate compensation expenses of the department
10 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024.

11 Section 2. The amount of \$10,334,900, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Department of Human Services for ordinary and
14 contingent expenses associated with the Office of the Inspector
15 General.

16 The Department, with the consent in writing from the
17 Governor, may reapportion not more than 1 percent of the total
18 appropriation of General Revenue Funds in Section 1 to Section
19 2 above among the various purposes therein enumerated.

1 Section 5. The following named sums, or so much thereof

1 Emergency Rental Assistance Program authorized by Section 3201
 2 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and any associated
 3 federal guidance, to fund the permitted purposes of the program
 4 including grants for emergency rental assistance and associated
 5 administrative costs.
