1 personal care services under the Adults with Developmental Disabilities waiver and the Support Waiver for Children and 2 Young Adults with Developmental Disabilities authorized under 3 4 Section 1915(c) of the Social Security Act. 5 As used in this Section, "live-in caregiver" means a 6 caregiver who permanently or for an extended period of time resides in the same residence as the individual receiving 7 Medicaid-funded personal care services or home health care 8 9 services. Live-in caregiver status shall be determined by 10 meeting requirements established by the U.S. Department of Labor, Internal Revenue Service, or extenuating circumstances 11 12 approved by the Department of Healthcare and Family Services. 13 The Department of Healthcare and Family Services may adopt 14 any rules necessary to implement this Section, including rules 15 on the form and manner in which a caregiver must verify that he or she meets the definition of "live-in caregiver". 16

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect uponbecoming law.".
