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1	AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2704
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 2704 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The Illinois Income Tax Act is amended by changing Section 234 as follows:
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6	(35 ILCS 5/234)
7	Sec. 234. Volunteer emergency workers.
8	(a) For taxable years beginning on or after January 1,
9	2023 and beginning prior to January 1, 2028, each individual
10	who (i) serves as a volunteer emergency worker for at least 9
11	months during the taxable year and (ii) does not receive
12	compensation for his or her services as a volunteer emergency
13	worker of more than \$5,000 for the taxable year may apply to
14	the Department for a credit against the taxes imposed by
15	subsections (a) and (b) of Section 201. The amount of the
16	credit shall be \$500 per eligible individual. If a taxpayer

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1 described in this subsection (a) is a volunteer member of a county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency 2 3 under the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, then the 4 taxpayer must serve as a volunteer emergency worker with the 5 county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency for at least 100 hours during the taxable year. The aggregate 6 amount of all tax credits awarded by the Department under this 7 8 Section in any calendar year may not exceed \$5,000,000. 9 Credits shall be awarded on a first-come first-served basis.

10 (b) A credit under this Section may not reduce a 11 taxpayer's liability to less than zero.

(c) By January 24 of each year, the Office of the State 12 13 Fire Marshal shall provide the Department of Revenue an electronic file with the names of volunteer emergency workers, 14 15 other than volunteer emergency workers who are volunteer members of a county or municipal emergency services and 16 disaster agency under the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 17 Act, who (i) volunteered for at least 9 months during the 18 19 immediately preceding calendar year, (ii) did not receive 20 compensation for their services as a volunteer emergency 21 worker of more than \$5,000 during the immediately preceding 22 calendar year, and (iii) are registered with the Office of the State Fire Marshal as of January 12 of the current year as 23 24 meeting the requirements of items (i) and (ii) for the 25 immediately preceding calendar year. The chief of the fire 26 department, fire protection district, or fire protection

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1 association shall be responsible for notifying the State Fire 2 Marshal of the volunteer emergency workers who met the requirements of items (i) and (ii) during the immediately 3 4 preceding calendar year by January 12 of the current year. 5 Notification shall be required in the format required by the 6 State Fire Marshal. The chief of the fire department, fire protection district, or fire protection association shall be 7 responsible for the verification and accuracy of their 8 9 submission to the State Fire Marshal under this subsection.

10 By January 24, 2025, and by January 24 of each year 11 thereafter, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland Security shall provide the Department of 12 Revenue an electronic file with the names of volunteer 13 14 emergency workers who (A) volunteered with a county or 15 municipal emergency services and disaster agency pursuant to 16 the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act for at least 9 months during the immediately preceding calendar year, (B) did 17 not receive compensation for their services as a volunteer 18 emergency worker of more than \$5,000 during the immediately 19 20 preceding calendar year, (C) volunteered with a county or municipal emergency services and disaster agency pursuant to 21 22 the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act for at least 100 hours during the immediately preceding calendar year, and (D) 23 24 are registered with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 25 and Office of Homeland Security as of January 12 of the current year as meeting the requirements of items (A), (B), and (C) for 26

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1 the immediately preceding calendar year. The coordinator of 2 the emergency services and disaster agency shall be 3 responsible for notifying the Illinois Emergency Management 4 Agency and Office of Homeland Security of the volunteer 5 emergency workers who met the requirements of items (A), (B), 6 and (C) during the immediately preceding calendar year by January 12 of the current year. Notification shall be in the 7 format required by the <u>Illinois Emergency Management Agency</u> 8 9 and Office of Homeland Security. The coordinator of the 10 emergency services and disaster agency shall be responsible 11 for the verification and accuracy of their submission to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency and Office of Homeland 12 13 Security under this subsection.

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(d) As used in this Section, "volunteer emergency worker" 14 15 means a person who serves as a member, other than on a 16 full-time career basis, of a fire department, fire protection district, or fire protection association that has a Fire 17 Department Identification Number issued by the Office of the 18 State Fire Marshal and who does not serve as a member on a 19 20 full-time career basis for another fire department, fire 21 protection district, fire protection association, or 22 governmental entity. For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2024, "volunteer emergency worker" also means a 23 24 person who is a volunteer member of a county or municipal 25 emergency services and disaster agency pursuant to the 26 Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act.

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1 (e) The Department shall adopt rules to implement and 2 administer this Section, including rules concerning 3 applications for the tax credit.
