1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2803

2 AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_. Amend Senate Bill 2803 by replacing  
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Illinois Identification Card Act is  
5 amended by changing Sections 4 and 12 as follows:

6 (15 ILCS 335/4)

7 (Text of Section before amendment by P.A. 103-210)

8 Sec. 4. Identification card.

9 (a) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard Illinois  
10 Identification Card to any natural person who is a resident of  
11 the State of Illinois who applies for such card, or renewal  
12 thereof. No identification card shall be issued to any person  
13 who holds a valid foreign state identification card, license,  
14 or permit unless the person first surrenders to the Secretary  
15 of State the valid foreign state identification card, license,  
16 or permit. The card shall be prepared and supplied by the

1 Secretary of State and shall include a photograph and  
2 signature or mark of the applicant. However, the Secretary of  
3 State may provide by rule for the issuance of Illinois  
4 Identification Cards without photographs if the applicant has  
5 a bona fide religious objection to being photographed or to  
6 the display of his or her photograph. The Illinois  
7 Identification Card may be used for identification purposes in  
8 any lawful situation only by the person to whom it was issued.  
9 As used in this Act, "photograph" means any color photograph  
10 or digitally produced and captured image of an applicant for  
11 an identification card. As used in this Act, "signature" means  
12 the name of a person as written by that person and captured in  
13 a manner acceptable to the Secretary of State.

14 (a-5) If an applicant for an identification card has a  
15 current driver's license or instruction permit issued by the  
16 Secretary of State, the Secretary may require the applicant to  
17 utilize the same residence address and name on the  
18 identification card, driver's license, and instruction permit  
19 records maintained by the Secretary. The Secretary may  
20 promulgate rules to implement this provision.

21 (a-10) If the applicant is a judicial officer as defined  
22 in Section 1-10 of the Judicial Privacy Act or a peace officer,  
23 the applicant may elect to have his or her office or work  
24 address listed on the card instead of the applicant's  
25 residence or mailing address. The Secretary may promulgate  
26 rules to implement this provision. For the purposes of this

1 subsection (a-10), "peace officer" means any person who by  
2 virtue of his or her office or public employment is vested by  
3 law with a duty to maintain public order or to make arrests for  
4 a violation of any penal statute of this State, whether that  
5 duty extends to all violations or is limited to specific  
6 violations.

7 (a-15) The Secretary of State may provide for an expedited  
8 process for the issuance of an Illinois Identification Card.  
9 The Secretary shall charge an additional fee for the expedited  
10 issuance of an Illinois Identification Card, to be set by  
11 rule, not to exceed \$75. All fees collected by the Secretary  
12 for expedited Illinois Identification Card service shall be  
13 deposited into the Secretary of State Special Services Fund.  
14 The Secretary may adopt rules regarding the eligibility,  
15 process, and fee for an expedited Illinois Identification  
16 Card. If the Secretary of State determines that the volume of  
17 expedited identification card requests received on a given day  
18 exceeds the ability of the Secretary to process those requests  
19 in an expedited manner, the Secretary may decline to provide  
20 expedited services, and the additional fee for the expedited  
21 service shall be refunded to the applicant.

22 (a-20) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard  
23 Illinois Identification Card to a person committed to the  
24 Department of Corrections, the ~~or~~ Department of Juvenile  
25 Justice, a Federal Bureau of Prisons facility located in  
26 Illinois, or a county jail or county department of corrections

1 ~~as follows: upon receipt of the person's birth certificate,~~  
2 ~~social security card, photograph, proof of residency upon~~  
3 ~~discharge, and an identification card application transferred~~  
4 ~~via a secure method as agreed upon by the Secretary and the~~

9       (1) A committed person who has previously held an  
10 Illinois Identification Card or an Illinois driver's  
11 license shall submit an Identification Card verification  
12 form to the Secretary of State, including a photograph  
13 taken by the correctional facility, proof of residency  
14 upon discharge, and a social security number, if the  
15 committed person has a social security number. If the  
16 committed person does not have a social security number  
17 and is eligible for a social security number, the  
18 Secretary of State shall not issue a standard Illinois  
19 Identification Card until the committed person obtains a  
20 social security number. If the committed person's  
21 photograph and demographic information matches an existing  
22 Illinois Identification Card or Illinois driver's license  
23 and the Secretary of State verifies the applicant's social  
24 security number with the Social Security Administration,  
25 the Secretary of State shall issue the committed person a  
26 standard Illinois Identification Card. If the photograph

1       or demographic information matches an existing Illinois  
2       Identification Card or Illinois driver's license in  
3       another person's name or identity, a standard Illinois  
4       Identification Card shall not be issued until the  
5       committed person submits a certified birth certificate and  
6       social security card to the Secretary of State and the  
7       Secretary of State verifies the identity of the committed  
8       person. If the Secretary of State cannot find a match to an  
9       existing Illinois Identification Card or Illinois driver's  
10       license, the committed person may apply for a standard  
11       Illinois Identification card as described in paragraph  
12       (2).

13       (2) A committed person who has not previously held an  
14       Illinois Identification Card or Illinois driver's license  
15       or for whom a match cannot be found as described in  
16       paragraph (1) shall submit an Identification Card  
17       verification form, including a photograph taken by the  
18       correctional facility, a certified birth certificate,  
19       proof of residency upon discharge, and a social security  
20       number, if the committed has a social security number. If  
21       the committed person does not have a social security  
22       number and is eligible for a social security number, the  
23       Secretary of State shall not issue a standard Illinois  
24       Identification Card until the committed person obtains a  
25       social security number. If the Secretary of State verifies  
26       the applicant's social security number with the Social

1       Security Administration, the Secretary of State shall  
2       issue the committed person a standard Illinois  
3       Identification Card.

4       The Illinois Identification Card verification form  
5       described in this subsection shall be prescribed by the  
6       Secretary State. The Secretary of State and correctional  
7       facilities in this State shall establish a secure method to  
8       transfer the form.

9       (a-25) The Secretary of State shall issue a limited-term  
10      Illinois Identification Card valid for 90 days to a committed  
11      person upon release on parole, mandatory supervised release,  
12      aftercare release, final discharge, or pardon from the  
13      Department of Corrections, the ~~or~~ Department of Juvenile  
14      Justice, a Federal Bureau of Prisons facility located in  
15      Illinois, or a county jail or county department of  
16      corrections, if the released person does not obtain a standard  
17      Illinois Identification Card as described in subsection (a-20)  
18      prior to release is unable to present a certified copy of his  
19      or her birth certificate and social security card or other  
20      documents authorized by the Secretary, but does present a  
21      Secretary of State prescribed Identification Card verification  
22      form completed by the correctional facility ~~Department of~~  
23      ~~Corrections or Department of Juvenile Justice,~~ verifying the  
24      released person's date of birth, social security number, if  
25      the person has a social security number, and his or her  
26      Illinois residence address. The verification form must have

1 been completed no more than 30 days prior to the date of  
2 application for the Illinois Identification Card.

3 Prior to the expiration of the 90-day period of the  
4 limited-term Illinois Identification Card, if the released  
5 person submits to the Secretary of State a certified copy of  
6 his or her birth certificate and his or her social security  
7 card or other documents authorized by the Secretary, a  
8 standard Illinois Identification Card shall be issued. A  
9 limited-term Illinois Identification Card may not be renewed.

10 This subsection shall not apply to a released person who  
11 was unable to obtain a standard Illinois Identification Card  
12 because his or her photograph or demographic information  
13 matched an existing Illinois Identification Card or Illinois  
14 driver's license in another person's name or identity or to a  
15 released person who does not have a social security number and  
16 is eligible for a social security number.

17 (a-30) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard  
18 Illinois Identification Card to a person upon conditional  
19 release or absolute discharge from the custody of the  
20 Department of Human Services, if the person presents a  
21 certified copy of his or her birth certificate, social  
22 security card, or other documents authorized by the Secretary,  
23 and a document proving his or her Illinois residence address.  
24 The Secretary of State shall issue a standard Illinois  
25 Identification Card to a person prior to his or her  
26 conditional release or absolute discharge if personnel from

1 the Department of Human Services bring the person to a  
2 Secretary of State location with the required documents.  
3 Documents proving residence address may include any official  
4 document of the Department of Human Services showing the  
5 person's address after release and a Secretary of State  
6 prescribed verification form, which may be executed by  
7 personnel of the Department of Human Services.

8 (a-35) The Secretary of State shall issue a limited-term  
9 Illinois Identification Card valid for 90 days to a person  
10 upon conditional release or absolute discharge from the  
11 custody of the Department of Human Services, if the person is  
12 unable to present a certified copy of his or her birth  
13 certificate and social security card or other documents  
14 authorized by the Secretary, but does present a Secretary of  
15 State prescribed verification form completed by the Department  
16 of Human Services, verifying the person's date of birth and  
17 social security number, and a document proving his or her  
18 Illinois residence address. The verification form must have  
19 been completed no more than 30 days prior to the date of  
20 application for the Illinois Identification Card. The  
21 Secretary of State shall issue a limited-term Illinois  
22 Identification Card to a person no sooner than 14 days prior to  
23 his or her conditional release or absolute discharge if  
24 personnel from the Department of Human Services bring the  
25 person to a Secretary of State location with the required  
26 documents. Documents proving residence address shall include



1 any official document of the Department of Human Services  
2 showing the person's address after release and a Secretary of  
3 State prescribed verification form, which may be executed by  
4 personnel of the Department of Human Services.

5 (b) The Secretary of State shall issue a special Illinois  
6 Identification Card, which shall be known as an Illinois  
7 Person with a Disability Identification Card, to any natural  
8 person who is a resident of the State of Illinois, who is a  
9 person with a disability as defined in Section 4A of this Act,  
10 who applies for such card, or renewal thereof. No Illinois  
11 Person with a Disability Identification Card shall be issued  
12 to any person who holds a valid foreign state identification  
13 card, license, or permit unless the person first surrenders to  
14 the Secretary of State the valid foreign state identification  
15 card, license, or permit. The Secretary of State shall charge  
16 no fee to issue such card. The card shall be prepared and  
17 supplied by the Secretary of State, and shall include a  
18 photograph and signature or mark of the applicant, a  
19 designation indicating that the card is an Illinois Person  
20 with a Disability Identification Card, and shall include a  
21 comprehensible designation of the type and classification of  
22 the applicant's disability as set out in Section 4A of this  
23 Act. However, the Secretary of State may provide by rule for  
24 the issuance of Illinois Person with a Disability  
25 Identification Cards without photographs if the applicant has  
26 a bona fide religious objection to being photographed or to

1 the display of his or her photograph. If the applicant so  
2 requests, the card shall include a description of the  
3 applicant's disability and any information about the  
4 applicant's disability or medical history which the Secretary  
5 determines would be helpful to the applicant in securing  
6 emergency medical care. If a mark is used in lieu of a  
7 signature, such mark shall be affixed to the card in the  
8 presence of two witnesses who attest to the authenticity of  
9 the mark. The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification  
10 Card may be used for identification purposes in any lawful  
11 situation by the person to whom it was issued.

12 The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card  
13 may be used as adequate documentation of disability in lieu of  
14 a physician's determination of disability, a determination of  
15 disability from a physician assistant, a determination of  
16 disability from an advanced practice registered nurse, or any  
17 other documentation of disability whenever any State law  
18 requires that a person with a disability provide such  
19 documentation of disability, however an Illinois Person with a  
20 Disability Identification Card shall not qualify the  
21 cardholder to participate in any program or to receive any  
22 benefit which is not available to all persons with like  
23 disabilities. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, an  
24 Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card, or  
25 evidence that the Secretary of State has issued an Illinois  
26 Person with a Disability Identification Card, shall not be

1 used by any person other than the person named on such card to  
2 prove that the person named on such card is a person with a  
3 disability or for any other purpose unless the card is used for  
4 the benefit of the person named on such card, and the person  
5 named on such card consents to such use at the time the card is  
6 so used.

7 An optometrist's determination of a visual disability  
8 under Section 4A of this Act is acceptable as documentation  
9 for the purpose of issuing an Illinois Person with a  
10 Disability Identification Card.

11 When medical information is contained on an Illinois  
12 Person with a Disability Identification Card, the Office of  
13 the Secretary of State shall not be liable for any actions  
14 taken based upon that medical information.

15 (c) The Secretary of State shall provide that each  
16 original or renewal Illinois Identification Card or Illinois  
17 Person with a Disability Identification Card issued to a  
18 person under the age of 21 shall be of a distinct nature from  
19 those Illinois Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a  
20 Disability Identification Cards issued to individuals 21 years  
21 of age or older. The color designated for Illinois  
22 Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a Disability  
23 Identification Cards for persons under the age of 21 shall be  
24 at the discretion of the Secretary of State.

25 (c-1) Each original or renewal Illinois Identification  
26 Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card

1 issued to a person under the age of 21 shall display the date  
2 upon which the person becomes 18 years of age and the date upon  
3 which the person becomes 21 years of age.

4 (c-3) The General Assembly recognizes the need to identify  
5 military veterans living in this State for the purpose of  
6 ensuring that they receive all of the services and benefits to  
7 which they are legally entitled, including healthcare,  
8 education assistance, and job placement. To assist the State  
9 in identifying these veterans and delivering these vital  
10 services and benefits, the Secretary of State is authorized to  
11 issue Illinois Identification Cards and Illinois Person with a  
12 Disability Identification Cards with the word "veteran"  
13 appearing on the face of the cards. This authorization is  
14 predicated on the unique status of veterans. The Secretary may  
15 not issue any other identification card which identifies an  
16 occupation, status, affiliation, hobby, or other unique  
17 characteristics of the identification card holder which is  
18 unrelated to the purpose of the identification card.

19 (c-5) Beginning on or before July 1, 2015, the Secretary  
20 of State shall designate a space on each original or renewal  
21 identification card where, at the request of the applicant,  
22 the word "veteran" shall be placed. The veteran designation  
23 shall be available to a person identified as a veteran under  
24 subsection (b) of Section 5 of this Act who was discharged or  
25 separated under honorable conditions.

26 (d) The Secretary of State may issue a Senior Citizen

1 discount card, to any natural person who is a resident of the  
2 State of Illinois who is 60 years of age or older and who  
3 applies for such a card or renewal thereof. The Secretary of  
4 State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall be  
5 issued in every county and applications shall be made  
6 available at, but not limited to, nutrition sites, senior  
7 citizen centers and Area Agencies on Aging. The applicant,  
8 upon receipt of such card and prior to its use for any purpose,  
9 shall have affixed thereon in the space provided therefor his  
10 signature or mark.

11 (e) The Secretary of State, in his or her discretion, may  
12 designate on each Illinois Identification Card or Illinois  
13 Person with a Disability Identification Card a space where the  
14 card holder may place a sticker or decal, issued by the  
15 Secretary of State, of uniform size as the Secretary may  
16 specify, that shall indicate in appropriate language that the  
17 card holder has renewed his or her Illinois Identification  
18 Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card.

25 security number, if the person has a social security number,  
26 and a document proving his or her Illinois residence address.

1 The verification form must have been completed no more than 30  
2 days prior to the date of application for the Illinois  
3 Identification Card. The Secretary of State shall issue a  
4 limited-term Illinois Identification Card to a person no  
5 sooner than 14 days prior to his or her conditional release or  
6 absolute discharge if personnel from the Department of Human  
7 Services bring the person to a Secretary of State location  
8 with the required documents. Documents proving residence  
9 address shall include any official document of the Department  
10 of Human Services showing the person's address after release  
11 and a Secretary of State prescribed verification form, which  
12 may be executed by personnel of the Department of Human  
13 Services.

14 (b) The Secretary of State shall issue a special Illinois  
15 Identification Card, which shall be known as an Illinois  
16 Person with a Disability Identification Card, to any natural  
17 person who is a resident of the State of Illinois, who is a  
18 person with a disability as defined in Section 4A of this Act,  
19 who applies for such card, or renewal thereof. No Illinois  
20 Person with a Disability Identification Card shall be issued  
21 to any person who holds a valid foreign state identification  
22 card, license, or permit unless the person first surrenders to  
23 the Secretary of State the valid foreign state identification  
24 card, license, or permit. The Secretary of State shall charge  
25 no fee to issue such card. The card shall be prepared and  
26 supplied by the Secretary of State, and shall include a

1 photograph and signature or mark of the applicant, a  
2 designation indicating that the card is an Illinois Person  
3 with a Disability Identification Card, and shall include a  
4 comprehensible designation of the type and classification of  
5 the applicant's disability as set out in Section 4A of this  
6 Act. However, the Secretary of State may provide by rule for  
7 the issuance of Illinois Person with a Disability  
8 Identification Cards without photographs if the applicant has  
9 a bona fide religious objection to being photographed or to  
10 the display of his or her photograph. If the applicant so  
11 requests, the card shall include a description of the  
12 applicant's disability and any information about the  
13 applicant's disability or medical history which the Secretary  
14 determines would be helpful to the applicant in securing  
15 emergency medical care. If a mark is used in lieu of a  
16 signature, such mark shall be affixed to the card in the  
17 presence of two witnesses who attest to the authenticity of  
18 the mark. The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification  
19 Card may be used for identification purposes in any lawful  
20 situation by the person to whom it was issued.

21 The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card  
22 may be used as adequate documentation of disability in lieu of  
23 a physician's determination of disability, a determination of  
24 disability from a physician assistant, a determination of  
25 disability from an advanced practice registered nurse, or any  
26 other documentation of disability whenever any State law

1 requires that a person with a disability provide such  
2 documentation of disability, however an Illinois Person with a  
3 Disability Identification Card shall not qualify the  
4 cardholder to participate in any program or to receive any  
5 benefit which is not available to all persons with like  
6 disabilities. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, an  
7 Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card, or  
8 evidence that the Secretary of State has issued an Illinois  
9 Person with a Disability Identification Card, shall not be  
10 used by any person other than the person named on such card to  
11 prove that the person named on such card is a person with a  
12 disability or for any other purpose unless the card is used for  
13 the benefit of the person named on such card, and the person  
14 named on such card consents to such use at the time the card is  
15 so used.

16 An optometrist's determination of a visual disability  
17 under Section 4A of this Act is acceptable as documentation  
18 for the purpose of issuing an Illinois Person with a  
19 Disability Identification Card.

20 When medical information is contained on an Illinois  
21 Person with a Disability Identification Card, the Office of  
22 the Secretary of State shall not be liable for any actions  
23 taken based upon that medical information.

24 (c) The Secretary of State shall provide that each  
25 original or renewal Illinois Identification Card or Illinois  
26 Person with a Disability Identification Card issued to a

1 person under the age of 21 shall be of a distinct nature from  
2 those Illinois Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a  
3 Disability Identification Cards issued to individuals 21 years  
4 of age or older. The color designated for Illinois  
5 Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a Disability  
6 Identification Cards for persons under the age of 21 shall be  
7 at the discretion of the Secretary of State.

8 (c-1) Each original or renewal Illinois Identification  
9 Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card  
10 issued to a person under the age of 21 shall display the date  
11 upon which the person becomes 18 years of age and the date upon  
12 which the person becomes 21 years of age.

13 (c-3) The General Assembly recognizes the need to identify  
14 military veterans living in this State for the purpose of  
15 ensuring that they receive all of the services and benefits to  
16 which they are legally entitled, including healthcare,  
17 education assistance, and job placement. To assist the State  
18 in identifying these veterans and delivering these vital  
19 services and benefits, the Secretary of State is authorized to  
20 issue Illinois Identification Cards and Illinois Person with a  
21 Disability Identification Cards with the word "veteran"  
22 appearing on the face of the cards. This authorization is  
23 predicated on the unique status of veterans. The Secretary may  
24 not issue any other identification card which identifies an  
25 occupation, status, affiliation, hobby, or other unique  
26 characteristics of the identification card holder which is



1 unrelated to the purpose of the identification card.

2 (c-5) Beginning on or before July 1, 2015, the Secretary  
3 of State shall designate a space on each original or renewal  
4 identification card where, at the request of the applicant,  
5 the word "veteran" shall be placed. The veteran designation  
6 shall be available to a person identified as a veteran under  
7 subsection (b) of Section 5 of this Act who was discharged or  
8 separated under honorable conditions.

9 (d) The Secretary of State may issue a Senior Citizen  
10 discount card, to any natural person who is a resident of the  
11 State of Illinois who is 60 years of age or older and who  
12 applies for such a card or renewal thereof. The Secretary of  
13 State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall be  
14 issued in every county and applications shall be made  
15 available at, but not limited to, nutrition sites, senior  
16 citizen centers and Area Agencies on Aging. The applicant,  
17 upon receipt of such card and prior to its use for any purpose,  
18 shall have affixed thereon in the space provided therefor his  
19 signature or mark.

20 (e) The Secretary of State, in his or her discretion, may  
21 designate on each Illinois Identification Card or Illinois  
22 Person with a Disability Identification Card a space where the  
23 card holder may place a sticker or decal, issued by the  
24 Secretary of State, of uniform size as the Secretary may  
25 specify, that shall indicate in appropriate language that the  
26 card holder has renewed his or her Illinois Identification

1 Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card.

13 Card of a youth for whom the Department of Children and Family  
14 Services is legally responsible or a foster child to be issued  
15 at no fee, the youth must submit, along with the application,  
16 an affirmation by his or her court appointed attorney or an  
17 employee of the Department of Children and Family Services on  
18 a form provided by the Secretary of State, that the person is a  
19 youth for whom the Department of Children and Family Services  
20 is legally responsible or a foster child.

21 The fee for any duplicate identification card shall be  
22 waived for any person who presents the Secretary of State's  
23 Office with a police report showing that his or her  
24 identification card was stolen.

25 The fee for any duplicate identification card shall be  
26 waived for any person age 60 or older whose identification

1 card has been lost or stolen.

2 As used in this Section, "active-duty member of the United  
3 States Armed Forces" means a member of the Armed Services or  
4 Reserve Forces of the United States or a member of the Illinois  
5 National Guard who is called to active duty pursuant to an  
6 executive order of the President of the United States, an act  
7 of the Congress of the United States, or an order of the
