

## 103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 SB2815

Introduced 1/17/2024, by Sen. Patrick J. Joyce

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

10 ILCS 5/28-8

from Ch. 46, par. 28-8

Amends the Election Code. Provides that the question of whether a unit of local government shall continue to be a home rule unit (rather than shall cease to be a home rule unit) shall be submitted in a form as specified. Makes conforming changes.

1 AN ACT concerning elections.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing Section 28-8 as follows:
- 6 (10 ILCS 5/28-8) (from Ch. 46, par. 28-8)
- Sec. 28-8. If a referendum held in accordance with Section 8 28-7 of this Act involved the question of whether a unit of
- 9 local government shall become a home rule unit or shall
- 10 <u>continue</u> <del>cease</del> to be a home rule unit and if that referendum
- 11 passed, then the clerk of that unit of local government shall,
- 12 within 45 days after the referendum, file with the Secretary
- of State a certified statement showing the results of the
- 14 referendum and the resulting status of the unit of local
- government as a home rule unit or a non-home rule unit. The
- 16 Secretary of State shall maintain such certified statements in
- 17 his office as a public record.
- 18 The question of whether a unit of local government shall
- 19 become a home rule unit shall be submitted in substantially
- 20 the following form:
- 21 Shall (name of the unit of local government) become a home
- 22 rule unit?
- Votes must be recorded as "yes" or "no".

- 1 The question of whether a unit of local government shall
- 2 <u>continue</u> <del>cease</del> to be a home rule unit shall be submitted in
- 3 substantially the following form:
- 4 Shall (name of the unit of local government) continue
- 5 cease to be a home rule unit?
- 6 Votes must be recorded as "yes" or "no".
