SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

70 ILCS 705/11k

Amends the Fire Protection District Act. Changes the requirement for competitive bidding for fire protection district contracts to contracts over \$30,000 (currently, over \$20,000).

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AN ACT concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Fire Protection District Act is amended by
changing Section 11k as follows:

6 (70 ILCS 705/11k)

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Sec. 11k. Competitive bidding; notice requirements.

8 (a) The board of trustees shall have the power to acquire 9 by gift, legacy, or purchase any personal property necessary for its corporate purposes provided that all contracts for 10 supplies, materials, or work involving an expenditure in 11 \$30,000 \$20,000 shall be let 12 excess of to the lowest 13 responsible bidder after advertising as required under 14 subsection (b) of this Section. The board is not required to accept a bid that does not meet the district's established 15 16 specifications, terms of delivery, quality, and serviceability requirements. Contracts which, by their nature, are not 17 adapted to award by competitive bidding, are not subject to 18 19 competitive bidding, including, but not limited to:

20 (1) contracts for the services of individuals 21 possessing a high degree of professional skill where the 22 ability or fitness of the individual plays an important 23 part; (2) contracts for the printing of finance committee
 reports and departmental reports;

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(3) contracts for the printing or engraving of bonds, tax warrants, and other evidences of indebtedness;

5 (4) contracts for the maintenance or servicing of, or 6 provision of repair parts for, equipment which are made 7 with the manufacturer or authorized service agent of that 8 equipment where the provision of parts, maintenance, or 9 servicing can best be performed by the manufacturer or 10 authorized service agent, or which involve proprietary 11 parts or technology not otherwise available;

(5) purchases and contracts for the use, purchase,
delivery, movement, or installation of data processing
equipment, software, or services and telecommunications
and interconnect equipment, software, and services;

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(6) contracts for duplicating machines and supplies;

17 (7) contracts for utility services such as water,
18 light, heat, telephone or telegraph;

19 (8) contracts for goods or services procured from20 another governmental agency;

(9) purchases of equipment previously owned by some
entity other than the district itself; and

(10) contracts for goods or services which are
economically procurable from only one source, such as for
the purchase of magazines, books, periodicals, pamphlets,
reports, and online subscriptions.

Contracts for emergency expenditures are also exempt from
 competitive bidding when the emergency expenditure is approved
 by a vote of 3/4 of the members of the board.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (a) of this 4 5 Section, all proposals to award contracts involving amounts in excess of $$30,000 \frac{$20,000}{$20,000}$ shall be published at least 10 days, 6 excluding Sundays and legal holidays, in advance of the date 7 announced for the receiving of bids, in a secular English 8 9 language newspaper of general circulation throughout the 10 district. In addition, a fire protection district that has a 11 website that the full-time staff of the district maintains 12 shall post notice on its website of all proposals to award 13 contracts in excess of \$30,000 \$20,000. Advertisements for 14 bids shall describe the character of the proposed contract or 15 agreement in sufficient detail to enable the bidders thereon 16 know what their obligations will be, either in the to 17 advertisement itself, or by reference to detailed plans and specifications on file at the time of the publication of the 18 first announcement. Such advertisement shall also state the 19 20 date, time and place assigned for the opening of bids, and no 21 bids shall be received at any time subsequent to the time 22 indicated in the announcement. All competitive bids for 23 involving an expenditure in excess of contracts \$30,000 \$20,000 must be sealed by the bidder and must be opened by a 24 25 member of the board or an employee of the district at a public bid opening at which the contents of the bids must be 26

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announced. Each bidder must receive at least 3 days' notice of
 the time and place of the bid opening.

3 (c) In addition to contracts entered into under the 4 Governmental Joint Purchasing Act, a board of trustees may 5 enter into contracts for supplies, materials, or work 6 involving an expenditure in excess of <u>\$30,000</u> \$20,000 through 7 participation in a joint governmental or nongovernmental 8 purchasing program that requires as part of its selection 9 procedure a competitive solicitation and procurement process.

10 (d) Subject to the exceptions under subsections (a) and 11 (c), any procurement by a board of trustees involving the 12 acquisition, by direct or beneficial ownership, of 13 improvements to real estate by a fire protection district which results in an expenditure of district funds in excess of 14 15 \$30,000 \$20,000 must be competitively bid in accordance with 16 the procedures of subsection (b).
