SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

405 ILCS 125/10

Amends the Housing is Recovery Pilot Program Act. Provides that an individual is eligible to receive a Housing is Recovery bridge rental subsidy for purposes of stabilizing his or her mental illness or substance use disorder if: (1) the individual is at high risk of unnecessary institutionalization who is 18 (rather than 21) years of age or older, or is aging out of guardianship under the Department of Children and Family Services, and who is eligible to enroll in, or is enrolled in, Medicaid for purposes of receiving mental health treatment; or (2) an individual at high risk of overdose who is 18 (rather than 21) years of age or older, or is aging out of guardianship under the Department of Children and Family Services, and who is eligible to enroll in, or is enrolled in, Medicaid for purposes of receiving under the Department of Children and Family Services, and who is eligible to enroll in, or is enrolled in, Medicaid for purposes of receiving substance use treatment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Housing is Recovery Pilot Program Act is 5 amended by changing Section 10 as follows:

7 Sec. 10. Eligibility. An individual meeting the 8 requirements listed in this Section shall be eligible to 9 receive a Housing is Recovery bridge rental subsidy for 10 purposes of stabilizing his or her mental illness or substance 11 use disorder.
