Amends the Swimming Facility Act. Provides that rules adopted by the Department of Public Health under the Act must include unique design criteria and general standards for above-ground pools.

AN ACT concerning regulation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 90. The Swimming Facility Act is amended by 5 changing Section 13 as follows:

6 (210 ILCS 125/13) (from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 1213)

7 Sec. 13. Rules. The Department shall promulgate, publish, 8 adopt and amend such rules as may be necessary for the proper 9 enforcement of this Act, to protect the health and safety of the public using swimming facilities and their appurtenances, 10 and may, when necessary, utilize the services of any other 11 state agencies to assist in carrying out the purposes of this 12 Act. These rules shall include but are not limited to design 13 14 criteria for swimming facility areas and bather preparation facilities, standards relating to sanitation, cleanliness, 15 16 plumbing, water supply, sewage and solid waste disposal, design and construction of all equipment, buildings, rodent 17 and insect control, communicable disease control, safety and 18 19 sanitation of appurtenant swimming facilities. The rules must 20 include provisions for the prevention of bather entrapment or 21 entanglement at new and existing swimming facilities. Bather preparation facilities consisting of dressing room space, 22 toilets and showers shall be available for use of patrons of 23

- 1 swimming facilities, except as provided by Department rules.
- 2 The rules adopted by the Department under this Section must
- 3 include unique design criteria and general standards for
- 4 above-ground pools.
