Section 70. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as maybe necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund

1 to the Department of Natural Resources for the non-federal cost 2 share of a Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program to 3 establish long-term contracts and permanent conservation easements in the Illinois River Basin; to fund cost share 4 assistance to landowners to encourage approved conservation 5 practices in environmentally sensitive and highly erodible 6 areas of the Illinois River Basin; and to fund the monitoring 7 8 of long-term improvements of these conservation practices as 9 required in the Memorandum of Agreement between the State of 10 Illinois and the United States Department of Agriculture.

11 Section 75. The sum of \$19,600,000, or so much thereof as 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Natural 13 Department of Resources Fund to the for (i) reallocation of Wildlife and Fish grant reimbursements, (ii) 14 15 wildlife conservation and restoration plans and programs from 16 federal and/or state funds provided for such purposes or (iii) 17 both purposes.

18 Section 80. The sum of \$650,000, or so much thereof may 19 be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural 20 Resources from the Partners for Conservation Fund for expenses 21 associated with Partners for Conservation Program to Implement 22 Ecosystem-Based Management for Illinois' Natural Resources.

Section 85. The sum of \$25,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Roadside Monarch Habitat Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for ordinary and contingent expenses related to the development, enhancement and restoration of Monarch butterfly and other pollinator habitats.

6 Section 90. The sum of \$4,500,000, or so much thereof as 7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish 8 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for expenses of 9 subgrantee payments.

10 Section 95. The sum of \$8,000,000, or so much thereof as 11 may be necessary, independently or in cooperation with the 12 Federal Government or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or political subdivision of the State, or with any 13 14 public or private corporation, organization, or individual, is 15 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources from the 16 Federal Title IV Fire Protection Assistance Fund for refunds 17 and for Rural Community Fire Protection Programs.
