SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Makes various Fiscal Year 2025 appropriations to the Office of the State Comptroller. Effective July 1, 2024.

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1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1

- Section 5. The sum of \$30,893,900, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Office of the State Comptroller, which includes in part, the approximate sum
- 9 of \$250,000 for the Comptroller's Office of Inspector General.
- Section 10. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State Comptroller from the Comptroller's Administrative Fund for the discharge of duties of the office.
- Section 15. The sum of \$50,300, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State Comptroller from the State Lottery Fund for expenses in connection with the State Lottery.
- Section 20. The following named sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes

10 ARTICLE 2

Section 5. The sum of \$53,000,000, or such much thereof as may be necessary and in addition to other amounts that may be appropriated, is appropriated to the State Comptroller from the Capital Facility and Technology Modernization Fund to the Office of the Comptroller for technology modernization of the Statewide Legacy Systems and maintenance of information technology systems and infrastructure and other costs pursuant to Section 28(e) of the State Comptroller Act. The effective date of this section is July 1, 2024.

Section 10. The amount of \$53,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of the

- 1 Comptroller from the General Revenue Fund for deposit into the
- 2 Capital Facility and Technology Modernization Fund to the
- 3 Office of the Comptroller for technology modernization of the
- 4 Statewide Legacy Systems and maintenance of information
- 5 technology systems and infrastructure and other costs pursuant
- 6 to Section 28(e) of the State Comptroller Act. The effective
- 7 date of this section is July 1, 2024.
