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SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Volumes of crude oil shipments have risen rapidly 3 in the 2010s relative to previous decades; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) remains committed to transporting flammable liquids by all modes of transportation, including the nation's 140,000-mile freight railroad network that is often located near public areas such as neighborhoods and schools, endangering citizens by placing them unknowingly within blast and evacuations zones; and

11 WHEREAS, The rail transportation of large volumes of crude 12 oil and other petroleum products presents unique safety risks; 13 and

14 WHEREAS, Incidents such as the derailment in Lac-Megantic, 15 Quebec, Canada, when a unit train carrying crude oil from the 16 Bakken region of North Dakota killed 47 unsuspecting people 17 and decimated most of the village, have resulted in 18 significant and devastating loss of life and destruction of 19 property and the environment; and

20 WHEREAS, The safe and successful management of any 21 hazardous materials incident is based on effective SJ0044 -2- LRB103 35985 MST 66072 r pre-incident planning, preparedness, training, exercises, and implementation of an incident management system; and

3 WHEREAS, The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety 4 Administration (PHMSA), in consultation with the Federal 5 Railroad Administration (FRA), issued a final rule to improve oil spill response readiness and mitigate effects of rail 6 7 accidents and incidents involving petroleum oil and high-hazard flammable trains (HHFTs); and 8

9 WHEREAS, The intent of comprehensive oil spill response 10 plans (COSRPs) requirements is to ensure that local emergency 11 responders and emergency response planning officials have 12 access to sufficient information regarding the movement of 13 HHFTs in their jurisdictions to adequately plan and prepare 14 for emergency events; and

15 WHEREAS, Government concern regarding the dissemination of 16 "sensitive security information" should not surpass a parent's 17 right to information necessary in allowing them to make 18 decisions related to securing the safety of their child or the 19 school faculty and staff's right to safe working conditions; 20 and

21 WHEREAS, In order for school personnel to manage a 22 hazardous materials incident safely and successfully, they too SJ0044 -3- LRB103 35985 MST 66072 r 1 must take part in effective pre-incident planning, 2 preparedness, training, exercises, and implementation of an 3 incident management system; and

WHEREAS, Even without derailing, spilling, or exploding, doctors have warned that proximity to oil trains poses a serious health risk with increasing rates in cancer, asthma, and cardiovascular disease through exposure to particulate matter released as emissions from trains; therefore, be it

9 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL 10 ASSEMBLY OF STATE ILLINOIS, THE OF THE HOUSE OF 11 CONCURRING HEREIN, that REPRESENTATIVES we urae local emergency response planning officials to partner with school 12 13 districts in their region in order to disseminate information 14 pertaining to safety threats related to the storage and 15 transport of hazardous substances, including petroleum oil and HHFTs, to the parents of attending students, faculty and 16 staff, and schools at risk of being negatively impacted by 17 storage facilities and/or the transport of such hazardous 18 materials; and be it further 19

20 RESOLVED, That we urge local emergency response planning 21 officials to include school districts in their region in the 22 development and implementation of oil spill response plans 23 specific to incidents involving the storage and transport of SJ0044 -4- LRB103 35985 MST 66072 r hazardous materials, including petroleum oil and HHFTs; and be it further

3 RESOLVED, That we urge Congress and the Federal Railroad 4 Administration to find a way to better notify and protect 5 communities as hazardous products move through a community; 6 and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be 7 8 delivered to all emergency response planning committees 9 throughout the State, the President of the United States, the 10 U.S. Senate Majority Leader, the U.S. Senate Minority Leader, 11 the U.S. Speaker of the House, the U.S. House of Representatives Minority Leader, all members of the Illinois 12 Congressional Delegation, and Federal Railroad Administration 13 14 Administrator Amit Bose.
