SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

ILCON Art. I, Sec. 1 ILCON Art. I, Sec. 3 ILCON Art. I, Sec. 8 ILCON Art. I, Sec. 10 ILCON Art. I, Sec. 12 ILCON Art. I, Sec. 14

Proposes to amend the Bill of Rights Article of the Illinois Constitution. Replaces gendered language with gender-neutral language. Effective upon being declared adopted.

3	RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL
4	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF
5	REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be
6	submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or
7	rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6
8	months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to
9	amend Sections 1, 3, 8, 10, 12, and 14 of Article I of the
10	Illinois Constitution as follows:
11	ARTICLE I
12	BILL OF RIGHTS
13	(ILCON Art. I, Sec. 1)
14	SECTION 1. INHERENT AND INALIENABLE RIGHTS
15	All <u>people</u> men are by nature free and independent and have
16	certain inherent and inalienable rights among which are life,
17	liberty and the pursuit of happiness. To secure these rights
18	and the protection of property, governments are instituted
19	among people men, deriving their just powers from the consent
20	of the governed.

SECTION 3. RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

2 The free exercise and enjoyment of religious profession 3 and worship, without discrimination, shall forever quaranteed, and no person shall be denied any civil or 5 political right, privilege or capacity, on account of that person's his religious opinions; but the liberty of conscience 6 7 hereby secured shall not be construed to dispense with oaths 8 or affirmations, excuse acts of licentiousness, or justify 9 practices inconsistent with the peace or safety of the State. 10 No person shall be required to attend or support any ministry 11 or place of worship against that person's his consent, nor 12 shall any preference be given by law to any religious 13 denomination or mode of worship.

- 16 SECTION 8. RIGHTS AFTER INDICTMENT

In criminal prosecutions, the accused shall have the right to appear and defend in person and by counsel; to demand the nature and cause of the accusation and have a copy thereof; to be confronted with the witnesses against the accused him or her and to have process to compel the attendance of witnesses on in his or her behalf of the accused; and to have a speedy public trial by an impartial jury of the county in which the offense is alleged to have been committed.

- 4 No person shall be compelled in a criminal case to give
- 5 evidence against <u>oneself</u> <u>himself</u> nor be twice put in jeopardy

- 9 SECTION 12. RIGHT TO REMEDY AND JUSTICE
- 10 Every person shall find a certain remedy in the laws for
- 11 all injuries and wrongs received which he receives to one's
- 12 his person, privacy, property or reputation. Every person He
- shall obtain justice by law, freely, completely, and promptly.

- 16 SECTION 14. IMPRISONMENT FOR DEBT
- 17 No person shall be imprisoned for debt unless the person
- 18 he refuses to deliver up the person's his estate for the
- 19 benefit of the person's his creditors as provided by law or
- 20 unless there is a strong presumption of fraud. No person shall
- 21 be imprisoned for failure to pay a fine in a criminal case
- 22 unless the person he has been afforded adequate time to make
- 23 payment, in installments if necessary, and has willfully

- failed to make payment.
