2 WHEREAS, On an average day, more than 700 injury crashes 3 involve distracted driving, and the economic toll of all motor 4 vehicle crashes in the U.S. annually exceeds \$400 billion; and

WHEREAS, Talking on a mobile phone, even in hands-free mode, texting, and programming your dashboard infotainment system or GPS device can divert your attention away from driving and result in physical or cognitive distraction; and

- 9 WHEREAS, Illinois residents and all Americans deserve to 10 live in communities that promote safe driving behaviors and 11 healthy lifestyles; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Preventing distracted driving injuries and deaths
 13 requires the cooperation of all levels of government,
 14 employers, and the general public; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The National Safety Council and the State of
 16 Illinois work to promote policies, practices, and procedures
 17 leading to increased safety, protection, and health in
 18 business and industry, in schools and colleges, on roads and
 19 highways, and in homes and communities; and
- 20 WHEREAS, In 2023, the National Safety Council will provide

- 1 the nation with a month-long distracted driving public
- 2 education campaign; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Spring is a time when people begin to log more
- 4 miles on the road, and it is imperative to focus attention on
- 5 motor vehicle injury risks and preventions; therefore, be it
- 6 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL
- 7 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare April of
- 8 2023 as Distracted Driving Awareness Month in the State of
- 9 Illinois; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That we urge the citizens and businesses of the
- 11 State of Illinois to observe Distracted Driving Awareness
- 12 Month by practicing safe driving behaviors and pledging to
- drive distraction-free.
