WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened to learn of the death of Glenn W. Feldman of Illinois City, who passed away on May 1, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Glenn Feldman was born to Walter William and Laura Dorothy (Dungan) Feldman in Muscatine, Iowa on June 12, 1944; he graduated from Rockridge High School in 1962 and from Iowa State University in 1967; immediately following graduation, he was drafted by the U.S. Army and completed Basic Training at Ft. Leonard Wood in 1967 and went on to complete Helicopter Maintenance Training; in the summer of 1968, he reported for duty with the SPC 1st Air Cavalry Division in Vietnam, where he performed maintenance on helicopters and flew 25 aerial missions in support of ground forces; after being wounded in an airstrike, he was awarded the Purple Heart and Air Medal for his meritorious participation in action and was honorably discharged; and
