SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The United States commemorates National Women's 3 History Month every March to recognize and honor the 4 contributions of women throughout the history of the United 5 States and the women making history now; and

6 WHEREAS, Latinas contribute to the cultural, economic, and 7 political power of the United States; and

8 WHEREAS, There are approximately 30,000,000 Latinas living 9 in the United States, and 1,120,000 Latinas live in the State 10 of Illinois; and

11 WHEREAS, Latinas continue to be greatly underrepresented 12 in elected office; and

13 WHEREAS, Latinas represent 9.3% of the United States 14 population but only 3% of elected officeholders in state and 15 federal offices across the country; and

16 WHEREAS, The State of Illinois is a model for supporting 17 and electing Latinas; and

18 WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has significantly increased 19 the representation of Latinas at all levels of government by

Corral Sepúlveda, State Representative Eva Dina Delgado, 10 State 11 Representative Lilian Jimenez, State Representative Norma 12 Hernandez, State Senator Karina Villa, State Senator Natalie Toro, State Senator Cristina Castro, and U.S. Representative 13 14 Delia C. 15 WHEREAS, Additional Latinas of the Illinois Legislative 16 Latino Caucus include State Senator Celina Villenueva, State Representative Barbara Hernandez, State Representative Dagmara 17 18 Avelar, and State Representative Angelica Guerrero Cuellar; 19 and

20 WHEREAS, Many of the Latinas elected to their positions 21 are the first Latinas in their roles or the first Latinas to 22 serve in their communities; and

23 WHEREAS, The State of Illinois elected State

SR0865 -3-LRB103 39990 MST 71251 r Representative Elizabeth Hernandez, the highest ranking and 1 2 longest serving Latina in the Illinois State Assembly, to chair the Illinois Democratic Party, and in that position, she 3 continues to ensure that Latinas are represented 4 and 5 recognized in political positions; and

WHEREAS, The work of the dedicated Latinas of the Illinois 6 7 Legislative Latino Caucus has resulted in successful legislative action on health equity, Latino representation, 8 9 economic justice, education, immigration, and language access 10 to address the needs of Latinos in all areas of the State; and

11 WHEREAS, The work of Latinas at all levels of government 12 in the State of Illinois has resulted in the codification of 13 women's rights and the expansion of healthcare for 14 undocumented people; and

15 WHEREAS, The grassroots, organizing, and political 16 participation of Latinas resulted in the election of the first 17 Latina from the Midwest to Congress; and

18 WHEREAS, The voices, lived experiences, and contributions 19 of Latinas in the State of Illinois continue to have long 20 lasting, positive impacts for the communities that they serve; 21 and SR0865 -4- LRB103 39990 MST 71251 r WHEREAS, Latinas representing Latinas is necessary to build a multicultural, multigenerational movement that acknowledges the shared humanity of others; and

WHEREAS, Significant progress has been made to increase
the representation of Latinas in all decision-making spaces;

8 achieve equitable representation of Latinas in all sectors,
9 industries, and leadership roles; therefore, be it

10 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED THIRD GENERAL 11 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we celebrate the 12 impact and contributions of contemporary Latinas in the State 13 of Illinois; and be it further

14 RESOLVED, That we acknowledge the value of Latinas and the 15 essential role they play in our multicultural, 16 multigenerational democracy; and be it further

17 RESOLVED, That we recognize the importance of accurate and 18 timely data on Latinas living in the United States and the role 19 that the U.S. Census Bureau plays in delivering data that 20 impacts the political and economic power and influence of 21 Latinas.
