- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 12-601.1 as follows:

- 7 <u>Sec. 12-601.1. Traffic control signal preemption</u>

- 9 <u>(a) As used in this Section, "traffic control signal</u>
- 10 preemption device" means any device, either mechanical or
- 11 <u>electrical</u>, that emits a pulse of light or other signal that,
- 12 <u>when received by a detector attached to a traffic control</u>
- 13 signal, changes that traffic control signal to a green light
- or, if the traffic control signal is already green, extends
- 15 <u>the duration of the green light.</u>
- 16 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a traffic
- 17 <u>control signal preemption device may not be installed on a</u>
- 18 motor vehicle and may not be operated by the driver or
- 19 passenger of a motor vehicle.

- (4) Vehicles that are designed and used exclusively as ambulances or rescue vehicles, when responding to a bona fide emergency, when used in combination with red oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights.
- (5) Vehicles that are equipped and used exclusively as organ transport vehicles, when the transportation is declared an emergency by a member of the transplant team or a representative of the organ procurement organization, when used in combination with red oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights.
- (6) Vehicles of the Illinois Emergency Management
 Agency and vehicles of the Department of Nuclear Safety,
 when responding to a bona fide emergency, when used in
 combination with red oscillating, rotating, or flashing
 lights.
- (7) Commuter buses owned by any political subdivision of this State, operated either by the political subdivision or its lessee or agent, and offering short-haul for-hire regularly scheduled passenger transportation service, over regular routes with fixed schedules, within metropolitan and suburban areas, when used to extend the duration of an already green light to meet schedules.
- 26 (d) Violation of this Section is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 27 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 28 becoming law.
