- 1 AN ACT in relation to vehicles.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 12-601.1 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-601.1 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 12-601.1. Traffic control signal preemption</u>
- 8 devices.
- 9 <u>(a) As used in this Section, "traffic control signal</u>
- 10 preemption device" means any device, either mechanical or
- 11 <u>electrical</u>, that emits a pulse of light or other signal that,
- 12 <u>when received by a detector attached to a traffic control</u>
- 13 signal, changes that traffic control signal to a green light
- or, if the traffic control signal is already green, extends
- 15 <u>the duration of the green light.</u>
- 16 (b) Except as provided in subsection (d), a traffic
- 17 <u>control signal preemption device may not be installed on a</u>
- 18 motor vehicle and may not be operated by the driver or
- 19 passenger of a motor vehicle.
- 20 <u>Violation of this subsection (b) is a Class A</u>
- 21 <u>misdemeanor</u>, <u>punishable</u> by a fine of \$1,000 in addition to
- 22 any other penalty that may be imposed.
- 23 (c) A retailer or manufacturer may not sell a traffic
- 24 <u>control signal preemption device to any person or entity for</u>

24	(6) Vehicles of the Illinois Emergency Management
25	Agency and vehicles of the Department of Nuclear Safety,

29	(7) Commuter buses owned by any political

(8) Vehicles used for snow removal owned by any
political subdivision of this State, operated either by
the political subdivision or its lessee or agent, when
used during a snow emergency in combination with red,
yellow, or amber oscillating, rotating, or flashing
lights.

9 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
