2 (2) either (i) has completed a program of study prior to July 1, 2002 that includes course work and 3 4 supervised clinical experience sufficient in breadth and 5 depth to demonstrate knowledge and skills related to the specific problems, methods, and procedures applicable to 6 students with disabilities in a school setting serving 7 8 ages 3 to 21 or (ii) meets the content-area standards for 9 speech-language pathologists adopted by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Teacher 10 11 Certification Board. "Speech-language pathology services" means the 12 application of methods and procedures for identifying, 13 measuring, testing, appraising, predicting, and modifying 14 15 communication development and disorders or disabilities of 16 speech, language, voice, swallowing, and other speech, language, and voice-related disorders for the purpose of 17 counseling, consulting, and rendering services 18 participating in the planning, directing, or conducting of 19 20 programs that are designed to modify communicative disorders and conditions in individuals or groups of individuals 21 22 involving speech, language, voice, and swallowing functions. (b) A school district or a cooperative must make 23 24 reasonable efforts to employ a speech-language pathologist. While making those reasonable efforts or after unsuccessful 25 reasonable efforts have been made, or both, a school district 26 or cooperative may contract for speech-language pathology 27 services with a speech-language pathologist or an entity that 28 employs speech-language pathologists.
