(b-2) The Secretary of State shall issue a drivers license to an applicant who is an immigrant and ineligible for a social security number if the applicant has (i) provided the Secretary with an individual tax identification number; (ii) filed with the Secretary, at the time of application, an affidavit stating that the applicant is an immigrant and not eligible for a social security number and that the applicant will file an application to become a permanent resident of the United States at the earliest opportunity the applicant is eligible to do so; (iii) provided a current foreign passport and a foreign birth certificate; (iv) filed with the Secretary of State proof provided to the applicant by the Illinois State Police that a set of the applicant's fingerprints have been collected (costs associated with this fingerprinting shall be paid by

1 the applicant at the time of collection); and (v) surrendered all illegally obtained forms of drivers licenses or State 2 3 identification cards issued to the applicant by the 4 Secretary. Relinquishment of State issued identification 5 shall be handled by the Secretary at his or her discretion. The Secretary of State shall provide to the Department of 6 Revenue all information, including the individual tax 7 8 identification number, captured on the application. If the 9 Department of Revenue determines that the licensee is not in 10 compliance with any applicable tax laws administered by the 11 Department of Revenue, the Department of Revenue shall request that the Secretary of State suspend or revoke the 12 13 license. The Secretary may also require any combination of additional documents, as set forth by administrative rule, as 14 15 sufficient proof of residency or identification. The foreign 16 passport and foreign birth certificate and any additional 17 documents required may be accepted only if: (i) the passport and birth certificate and any additional documents are 18 difficult to duplicate and (ii) the passport and birth 19 20 certificate and any additional documents are verifiable with 21 the issuing agency. A person denied a driver's license under this subsection (b-2) may seek review under the 22 Administrative Review Law. This amendatory Act of the 93rd 23 General Assembly does not affect the issuance of any 24 commercial driver's license or school bus driver's permit 25 under the Illinois Vehicle Code or any State identification 26 27 card under the Illinois Identification Card Act. A driver's license issued under this subsection (b-2) may not be used to 28 29 obtain a Firearm Owner's Identification Card and may not be used to obtain a driver's license in another state. A driver 30 licensed under this subsection (b-2) shall, within 30 days of 31 receiving a license, provide to the Secretary of State proof 32 of insurance and is subject to the mandatory insurance 33 34 requirements of this Code.

1 (b-3) The Secretary of State may, in his discretion, 2 rule or regulation, provide that an application for a drivers license or permit may include a suitable photograph of the 3 4 applicant in the form prescribed by the Secretary, and he may 5 further provide that each drivers license shall include a 6 photograph of the driver.
