- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 4-1.6b as follows:
- 6 (305 ILCS 5/4-1.6b new)
- Sec. 4-1.6b. Child Support Pays Program.
- 8 (a) The Child Support Pays Program is created. Under
- 9 the program, the Department of Public Aid shall pay to
- 10 <u>families receiving cash assistance under this Article who</u>
- 11 <u>have earned income an amount equal to whichever of the</u>
- 12 <u>following is greater: (1) 50% of the current monthly child</u>
- 13 <u>support collected on behalf of the members of the assistance</u>
- 14 unit; or (2) the amount of current monthly child support
- 15 <u>collected on behalf of the members of the assistance unit</u>
- 16 required to be paid to the family pursuant to administrative
- 17 <u>rule. The child support passed through to a family pursuant</u>
