- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Attorney General Act is amended by adding
- 5 Section 4f as follows:
- 6 (15 ILCS 205/4f new)
- 7 <u>Sec 4f. Ethics pledge.</u>
- 8 (a) The Attorney General, as soon as may be practical,
- 9 <u>must develop</u> and <u>promulgate</u> an ethics pledge setting forth
- 10 the legal rights, responsibilities, and duties relating to
- 11 <u>ethical conduct in government applicable to all officers,</u>
- officials, appointees, and employees of the State in the
- 13 <u>executive</u>, <u>legislative</u>, <u>and judicial branches</u>. <u>The ethics</u>
- 14 pledge must contain, without limitation, the duty to report
- 15 <u>ethics violations. The Attorney General shall revise and</u>
- re-promulgate the pledge from time to time as necessary.
- 17 <u>(b) Every officer, official, appointee, and employee of</u>
- 18 State government of the executive, legislative, and judicial
- 19 <u>branches must sign the ethics pledge annually, attesting that</u>
- 20 <u>he or she has read and understands it. Signed ethics pledges</u>
