AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4055

AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 4055 by replacing

3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by

5 changing Section 6-15 as follows:

6 (235 ILCS 5/6-15) (from Ch. 43, par. 130)

7 (Text of Section before amendment by P.A. 93-627)

8 Sec. 6-15. No alcoholic liquors shall be sold or delivered in any building belonging to or under the control of the State 9 or any political subdivision thereof except as provided in this 10 11 The corporate authorities of any city, village, incorporated town or township may provide by ordinance, 12 however, that alcoholic liquor may be sold or delivered in any 13 specifically designated building belonging to or under the 14 15 control of the municipality or township, or in any building 16 located on land under the control of the municipality; provided that such township complies with all applicable 17 ordinances in any incorporated area of the township. Alcoholic 18 liquor may be delivered to and sold under the authority of a 19 special use permit on any property owned by a conservation 20 21 district organized under the Conservation District Act, provided that (i) the alcoholic liquor is sold only at an event 22

authorized by the governing board of the conservation district,

(ii) the issuance of the special use permit is authorized by

the local liquor control commissioner of the territory in which 1 the property is located, and (iii) the special use permit 2 3 authorizes the sale of alcoholic liquor for one day or less. 4 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at any airport 5 belonging to or under the control of a municipality of more than 25,000 inhabitants, or in any building or on any golf 6 7 course owned by a park district organized under the Park 8 District Code, subject to the approval of the governing board of the district, or in any building or on any golf course owned 9 10 by a forest preserve district organized under the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act, subject to the approval of the 11 governing board of the district, or on the grounds within 500 12 feet of any building owned by a forest preserve district 13 14 organized under the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act 15 during times when food is dispensed for consumption within 500 feet of the building from which the food is dispensed, subject 16 17 to the approval of the governing board of the district, or in a 18 building owned by a Local Mass Transit District organized under the Local Mass Transit District Act, subject to the approval of 19 20 the governing Board of the District, or in Bicentennial Park, or on the premises of the City of Mendota Lake Park located 21 adjacent to Route 51 in Mendota, Illinois, or on the premises 22 of Camden Park in Milan, Illinois, or in the community center 23 24 owned by the City of Loves Park that is located at 1000 River 25 Park Drive in Loves Park, Illinois, or, in connection with the 26 operation of an established food serving facility during times when food is dispensed for consumption on the premises, and at 27 28 the following aquarium and museums located in public parks: Art 29 Institute of Chicago, Chicago Academy of Sciences, Chicago Historical Society, Field Museum of Natural History, Museum of 30 31 Science and Industry, DuSable Museum of African American 32 History, John G. Shedd Aquarium and Adler Planetarium, or at 33 Lakeview Museum of Arts and Sciences in Peoria, connection with the operation of the facilities of the Chicago 34

Zoological Society or the Chicago Horticultural Society on land 1 2 owned by the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, or on any 3 land used for a golf course or for recreational purposes owned 4 by the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, subject to the 5 control of the Forest Preserve District Board of Commissioners and applicable local law, provided that dram shop liability 6 7 insurance is provided at maximum coverage limits so as to hold 8 the District harmless from all financial loss, damage, and harm, or in any building located on land owned by the Chicago 9 10 Park District if approved by the Park District Commissioners, or on any land used for a golf course or for recreational 11 purposes and owned by the Illinois International Port District 12 13 if approved by the District's governing board, or at any airport, golf course, faculty center, or facility in which 14 15 conference and convention type activities take place belonging 16 to or under control of any State university or public community college district, provided that with respect to a facility for 17 18 conference and convention type activities alcoholic liquors shall be limited to the use of the convention or conference 19 20 participants or participants in cultural, political 21 educational activities held in such facilities, and provided further that the faculty or staff of the State university or a 22 23 public community college district, or members 2.4 organization of students, alumni, faculty or staff of the State 25 university or a public community college district are active 26 participants in the conference or convention, or in Memorial 27 Stadium on the campus of the University of Illinois at 28 Urbana-Champaign during games in which the Chicago Bears 29 professional football team is playing in that stadium during the renovation of Soldier Field, not more than one and a half 30 31 hours before the start of the game and not after the end of the 32 third quarter of the game, or by a catering establishment which has rented facilities from a board of trustees of a public 33 community college district, or, if approved by the District 34

1 board, on land owned by the Metropolitan Sanitary District of 2 Greater Chicago and leased to others for a term of at least 20 3 years. Nothing in this Section precludes the sale or delivery 4 of alcoholic liquor in the form of original packaged goods in premises located at 500 S. Racine in Chicago belonging to the 5 University of Illinois and used primarily as a grocery store by 6 7 a commercial tenant during the term of a lease that predates 8 the University's acquisition of the premises; University shall have no power or authority to renew, transfer, 9 10 or extend the lease with terms allowing the sale of alcoholic liquor; and the sale of alcoholic liquor shall be subject to 11 all local laws and regulations. After the acquisition by 12 Winnebago County of the property located at 404 Elm Street in 13 14 Rockford, a commercial tenant who sold alcoholic liquor at 15 retail on a portion of the property under a valid license at the time of the acquisition may continue to do so for so long 16 as the tenant and the County may agree under existing or future 17 18 leases, subject to all local laws and regulations regarding the 19 sale of alcoholic liquor. Each facility shall provide dram shop 20 liability in maximum insurance coverage limits so as to save 21 harmless the State, municipality, State university, airport, golf course, faculty center, facility in which conference and 22 convention type activities take place, park district, Forest 23 24 District, public community college Preserve 25 aquarium, museum, or sanitary district from all financial loss, 26 damage or harm. Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings of golf courses owned by municipalities in connection 27 28 with the operation of an established food serving facility 29 during times when food is dispensed for consumption upon the 30 premises. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at 31 retail in any building owned by a fire protection district 32 organized under the Fire Protection District Act, provided that 33 such delivery and sale is approved by the board of trustees of the district, and provided further that such delivery and sale 34

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1 is limited to fundraising events and to a maximum of 6 events 2 per year.

Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold at retail in the Dorchester Senior Business Center owned by the Village of Dolton if the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with organized functions for which the planned attendance is 20 or more persons, and if the person or facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Village of Dolton and the State from all financial loss, damage and harm.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in any building used as an Illinois State Armory provided:

- (i) the Adjutant General's written consent to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such building is filed with the Commission;
- (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with organized functions held on special occasions;
- (iii) the organized function is one for which the planned attendance is 25 or more persons; and
- (iv) the facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to save harmless the facility and the State from all financial loss, damage or harm.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in the Chicago Civic Center, provided that:

- the written consent of the Public Building (i) Commission which administers the Chicago Civic Center is filed with the Commission;
- (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with organized functions held on special occasions;
- (iii) the organized function is one for which the 34

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planned attendance is 25 or more persons;

(iv) the facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Civic Center, the City of Chicago and the State from all financial loss, damage or harm; and

(v) all applicable local ordinances are complied with.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered or sold in any building belonging to or under the control of any city, village or incorporated town where more than 75% of the physical building is used for commercial properties of the recreational purposes, and the building is located upon a pier extending into or over the waters of a navigable lake or stream or on the shore of a navigable lake or stream. Alcoholic liquor may be sold in buildings under the control of the Department of Natural Resources when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such buildings is filed with the Commission by the Department of Natural Resources. Alcoholic liquor may be served or delivered in buildings and facilities under the control of the Department of Natural Resources upon the written approval of the Director of Natural Resources acting as the controlling government authority. The Director of Natural Resources may specify conditions on that including but not limited to requirements for approval, insurance and hours of operation. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, alcoholic liquor sold by a United States Army Corps of Engineers or Department of Natural Resources concessionaire who was operating on June 1, 1991 on-premises consumption only is not subject to the provisions of Articles IV and IX. Beer and wine may be sold on the premises of the Joliet Park District Stadium owned by the Joliet Park District when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell beer and wine in such premises is filed with the local liquor commissioner by the Joliet Park District. Beer

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and wine may be sold in buildings on the grounds of State veterans' homes when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell beer and wine in such buildings is filed with the Commission by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, and the facility shall provide dram shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits so as to save the facility harmless from all financial loss, damage or harm. Such liquors may be delivered to and sold at any property owned or held under lease by a Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority or Metropolitan Exposition and Auditorium Authority.

Beer and wine may be sold and dispensed at professional sporting events and at professional concerts and other entertainment events conducted on premises owned by the Forest Preserve District of Kane County, subject to the control of the District Commissioners and applicable local law, provided that dram shop liability insurance is provided at maximum coverage limits so as to hold the District harmless from all financial loss, damage and harm.

Nothing in this Section shall preclude the sale or delivery of beer and wine at a State or county fair or the sale or delivery of beer or wine at a city fair in any otherwise lawful manner.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in State parks under the control of the Department of Natural Resources, provided:

- a. the State park has overnight lodging facilities with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,
- b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with the commission by the Department of Natural Resources, and
- c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the State park lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours

from 11 o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, alcoholic

liquor sold by the State park or restaurant concessionaire

sold by the provisions of Articles IV and IX.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings on properties under the control of the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum provided:

- a. the property has overnight lodging facilities with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,
- b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with the commission by the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, and
- c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours from 11 o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight.

The sale of alcoholic liquors pursuant to this Section does not authorize the establishment and operation of facilities commonly called taverns, saloons, bars, cocktail lounges, and the like except as a part of lodge and restaurant facilities in State parks or golf courses owned by Forest Preserve Districts with a population of less than 3,000,000 or municipalities or park districts.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in the Springfield Administration Building of the Department of Transportation and the Illinois State Armory in Springfield; provided, that the controlling government authority may consent to such sales only if

- a. the request is from a not-for-profit organization;
- 34 b. such sales would not impede normal operations of the

departments involved;

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- c. the not-for-profit organization provides dram shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits and agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm;
- d. no such sale shall be made during normal working hours of the State of Illinois; and
 - e. the consent is in writing.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in recreational areas of river conservancy districts under the control of, or leased from, the river conservancy districts. Such sales are subject to reasonable local regulations as provided in Article IV; however, no such regulations may prohibit or substantially impair the sale of alcoholic liquors on Sundays or Holidays.

Alcoholic liquors may be provided in long term care facilities owned or operated by a county under Division 5-21 or 5-22 of the Counties Code, when approved by the facility operator and not in conflict with the regulations of the Illinois Department of Public Health, to residents of the facility who have had their consumption of the alcoholic liquors provided approved in writing by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and dispensed in State housing assigned to employees of the Department of Corrections. No person shall furnish or allow to be furnished any alcoholic liquors to any prisoner confined in any jail, reformatory, prison or house of correction except upon a physician's prescription for medicinal purposes.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the Willard Ice Building in Springfield, at the State Library in Springfield, and at Illinois State Museum facilities by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written

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- permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the controlling government authority, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:
 - a. Obtains written consent from the controlling government authority;
 - b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State offices located in the building;
 - c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building;
 - d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at authorized functions.

The controlling government authority for the Willard Ice Building in Springfield shall be the Director of the Department of Revenue. The controlling government authority for Illinois State Museum facilities shall be the Director of the Illinois State Museum. The controlling government authority for the State Library in Springfield shall be the Secretary of State.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail or dispensed at any facility, property or building under the jurisdiction of the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum where the delivery, sale or dispensing is by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic

- liquors from a controlling government authority, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization provided that such organization:
 - a. Obtains written consent from the controlling government authority;
 - b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal workings of State offices or operations located at the facility, property or building;
 - c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity of the not-for-profit organization in the facility, property or building;
 - d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

The controlling government authority for the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency shall be the Director of the Historic Sites and Preservation, and the controlling government authority for the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum shall be the Director of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the James R. Thompson Center in Chicago, subject to the provisions of Section 7.4 of the State Property Control Act, and 222 South College Street in Springfield, Illinois by (1) a commercial tenant or subtenant conducting business on the premises under a lease or sublease made pursuant to Section 405-315 of the Department of Central Management Services Law (20 ILCS 405/405-315), provided that such tenant or subtenant who sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors shall procure and maintain dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless

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- the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the sale or dispensing of alcoholic liquors, or by (2) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written
- 5 permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the 6 Director of Central Management Services, or by (3) a
- 7 not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:
 - a. Obtains written consent from the Department of Central Management Services;
 - b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State offices located in the building;
 - c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building;
 - d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.
 - Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Director of Central Management Services.
 - Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered at any facility owned by the Illinois Sports Facilities Authority provided that dram shop liability insurance has been made available in a form, with such coverage and in such amounts as the Authority reasonably determines is necessary.
- Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the Rockford State Office Building by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense

- 1 alcoholic liquors from the Department of Central Management
- 2 Services, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization, provided
- 3 that such organization:

- a. Obtains written consent from the Department of Central Management Services;
- b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner
 that does not impair normal operations of State offices
 located in the building;
 - c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building;
 - d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Department of Central Management Services.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county in the City of Bloomington, and used by the McLean County Historical Society if the sale or delivery is approved by an ordinance adopted by the county board, and the municipality in which the building is located may not prohibit that sale or delivery, notwithstanding any other provision of this Section. The regulation of the sale and delivery of alcoholic liquor in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county, and used by the McLean County Historical Society as provided in this paragraph is an exclusive power and function of the State and is a denial and limitation under Article VII, Section 6, subsection (h) of the

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Illinois Constitution of the power of a home rule municipality 1 to regulate that sale and delivery. 2

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in any building situated on land held in trust for any school district organized under Article 34 of the School Code, if the building is not used for school purposes and if the sale or delivery is approved by the board of education.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in buildings owned by the Community Building Complex Committee of Boone County, Illinois if the person or facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance with coverage and in amounts that the Committee reasonably determines are necessary.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in the building located at 1200 Centerville Avenue in Belleville, Illinois and occupied by either the Belleville Area Special Education District or the Belleville Area Special Services Cooperative. (Source: P.A. 92-512, eff. 1-1-02; 92-583, eff. 6-26-02;

Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold under the authority of a

special use permit on any property owned by a conservation 1 2 district organized under the Conservation District Act, 3 provided that (i) the alcoholic liquor is sold only at an event authorized by the governing board of the conservation district, 4 5 (ii) the issuance of the special use permit is authorized by the local liquor control commissioner of the territory in which 6 7 the property is located, and (iii) the special use permit authorizes the sale of <u>alcoholic liquor for one day or less.</u> 8 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at any airport 9 10 belonging to or under the control of a municipality of more than 25,000 inhabitants, or in any building or on any golf 11 course owned by a park district organized under the Park 12 District Code, subject to the approval of the governing board 13 of the district, or in any building or on any golf course owned 14 15 by a forest preserve district organized under the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act, subject to the approval of the 16 governing board of the district, or on the grounds within 500 17 18 feet of any building owned by a forest preserve district organized under the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act 19 20 during times when food is dispensed for consumption within 500 21 feet of the building from which the food is dispensed, subject to the approval of the governing board of the district, or in a 22 23 building owned by a Local Mass Transit District organized under 2.4 the Local Mass Transit District Act, subject to the approval of 25 the governing Board of the District, or in Bicentennial Park, 26 or on the premises of the City of Mendota Lake Park located adjacent to Route 51 in Mendota, Illinois, or on the premises 27 28 of Camden Park in Milan, Illinois, or in the community center 29 owned by the City of Loves Park that is located at 1000 River Park Drive in Loves Park, Illinois, or, in connection with the 30 31 operation of an established food serving facility during times 32 when food is dispensed for consumption on the premises, and at 33 the following aquarium and museums located in public parks: Art Institute of Chicago, Chicago Academy of Sciences, Chicago 34

After the acquisition by 17 18 Winnebago County of the property located at 404 Elm Street in 19 Rockford, a commercial tenant who sold alcoholic liquor at 20 retail on a portion of the property under a valid license at 21 the time of the acquisition may continue to do so for so long as the tenant and the County may agree under existing or future 22 23 leases, subject to all local laws and regulations regarding the 2.4 sale of alcoholic liquor. Each facility shall provide dram shop 25 liability in maximum insurance coverage limits so as to save 26 harmless the State, municipality, State university, airport, golf course, faculty center, facility in which conference and 27 28 convention type activities take place, park district, Forest 29 Preserve District, public community college district, aquarium, museum, or sanitary district from all financial loss, 30 31 damage or harm. Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in 32 buildings of golf courses owned by municipalities in connection with the operation of an established food serving facility 33 during times when food is dispensed for consumption upon the 34

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premises. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at 1 retail in any building owned by a fire protection district 2 3 organized under the Fire Protection District Act, provided that 4 such delivery and sale is approved by the board of trustees of 5 the district, and provided further that such delivery and sale is limited to fundraising events and to a maximum of 6 events 6 7 per year.

Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold at retail in the Dorchester Senior Business Center owned by the Village of Dolton if the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with organized functions for which the planned attendance is 20 or more persons, and if the person or facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Village of Dolton and the State from all financial loss, damage and harm.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in any building used as an Illinois State Armory provided:

- (i) the Adjutant General's written consent to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such building is filed with the Commission;
- (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with organized functions held on special occasions;
- (iii) the organized function is one for which the planned attendance is 25 or more persons; and
- (iv) the facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to save harmless the facility and the State from all financial loss, damage or harm.
- 31 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in the Chicago Civic Center, provided that: 32
- 33 written consent of the Public Building (i) the Commission which administers the Chicago Civic Center is 34

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filed with the Commission;

- (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only in connection with organized functions held on special occasions;
- (iii) the organized function is one for which the planned attendance is 25 or more persons;
- (iv) the facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Civic Center, the City of Chicago and the State from all financial loss, damage or harm; and
- (v) all applicable local ordinances are complied with.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered or sold in any building 13 14 belonging to or under the control of any city, village or 15 incorporated town where more than 75% of the physical 16 properties of the building is used for commercial 17 recreational purposes, and the building is located upon a pier 18 extending into or over the waters of a navigable lake or stream 19 or on the shore of a navigable lake or stream. Alcoholic liquor 20 may be sold in buildings under the control of the Department of 21 Natural Resources when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such buildings is filed 22 23 with the Commission by the Department of Natural Resources. 24 Alcoholic liquor may be served or delivered in buildings and 25 facilities under the control of the Department of Natural 26 Resources upon the written approval of the Director of Natural 27 Resources acting as the controlling government authority. The 28 Director of Natural Resources may specify conditions on that 29 approval, including but not limited to requirements for insurance and hours of operation. Notwithstanding any other 30 31 provision of this Act, alcoholic liquor sold by a United States 32 Army Corps of Engineers or Department of Natural Resources 33 concessionaire who was operating on June 1, 1991 on-premises consumption only is not subject to the provisions 34

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of Articles IV and IX. Beer and wine may be sold on the 1 premises of the Joliet Park District Stadium owned by the 2 3 Joliet Park District when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell beer and wine in such premises is filed with 4 5 the local liquor commissioner by the Joliet Park District. Beer and wine may be sold in buildings on the grounds of State 6 7 veterans' homes when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell beer and wine in such buildings is filed with 8 the Commission by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, and the 9 10 facility shall provide dram shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits so as to save the facility harmless from all 11 financial loss, damage or harm. Such liquors may be delivered 12 13 to and sold at any property owned or held under lease by a Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority or Metropolitan 14 15 Exposition and Auditorium Authority.

Beer and wine may be sold and dispensed at professional sporting events and at professional concerts and other entertainment events conducted on premises owned by the Forest Preserve District of Kane County, subject to the control of the District Commissioners and applicable local law, provided that dram shop liability insurance is provided at maximum coverage limits so as to hold the District harmless from all financial loss, damage and harm.

Nothing in this Section shall preclude the sale or delivery of beer and wine at a State or county fair or the sale or delivery of beer or wine at a city fair in any otherwise lawful manner.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in State parks under the control of the Department of Natural Resources, provided:

a. the State park has overnight lodging facilities with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,

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- b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with the commission by the Department of Natural Resources, and
- c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the State park lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight. from 11 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, alcoholic liquor sold by the State park or restaurant concessionaire is not subject to the provisions of Articles IV and IX.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings on properties under the control of the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum provided:

- a. the property has overnight lodging facilities with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,
- b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with the commission by the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, and
- c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours from 11 o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight.

The sale of alcoholic liquors pursuant to this Section does not authorize the establishment and operation of facilities commonly called taverns, saloons, bars, cocktail lounges, and the like except as a part of lodge and restaurant facilities in State parks or golf courses owned by Forest Preserve Districts with a population of less than 3,000,000 or municipalities or park districts.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in the Springfield Administration Building of the Department of Transportation

- and the Illinois State Armory in Springfield; provided, that 1
- 2 the controlling government authority may consent to such sales
- 3 only if

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- a. the request is from a not-for-profit organization; 4
- 5 b. such sales would not impede normal operations of the departments involved; 6
 - c. the not-for-profit organization provides dram shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits and agrees defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm;
- d. no such sale shall be made during normal working 11 hours of the State of Illinois; and 12
 - e. the consent is in writing.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in recreational areas of river conservancy districts under the control of, or leased from, the river conservancy districts. Such sales are subject to reasonable local regulations as provided in Article IV; however, no such regulations may prohibit or substantially impair the sale of alcoholic liquors on Sundays or Holidays.

Alcoholic liquors may be provided in long term care facilities owned or operated by a county under Division 5-21 or 5-22 of the Counties Code, when approved by the facility operator and not in conflict with the regulations of the Illinois Department of Public Health, to residents of the facility who have had their consumption of the alcoholic liquors provided approved in writing by a physician licensed to practice medicine in all its branches.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and dispensed in State housing assigned to employees of the Department of Corrections. No person shall furnish or allow to be furnished any alcoholic liquors to any prisoner confined in any jail, reformatory, prison or house of correction except upon a physician's prescription for medicinal purposes.

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Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the Willard Ice Building in Springfield, at the State Library in Springfield, and at Illinois State Museum facilities by (1) an judicial agency of the State, whether legislative, executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the controlling government authority, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:

- a. Obtains written consent from the controlling government authority;
- b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State offices located in the building;
- c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building;
- d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at authorized functions.

The controlling government authority for the Willard Ice Building in Springfield shall be the Director of the Department of Revenue. The controlling government authority for Illinois State Museum facilities shall be the Director of the Illinois State Museum. The controlling government authority for the State Library in Springfield shall be the Secretary of State.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail or dispensed at any facility, property or building under the jurisdiction of the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of

- the Historic Preservation Agency or the Abraham Lincoln
 Presidential Library and Museum where the delivery, sale or
 dispensing is by (1) an agency of the State, whether
 legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency
 first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic
- b first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic
- 6 liquors from a controlling government authority, or by (2) a
- 7 not-for-profit organization provided that such organization:
 - a. Obtains written consent from the controlling
 government authority;
 - b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal workings of State offices or operations located at the facility, property or building;
 - c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity of the not-for-profit organization in the facility, property or building;
 - d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

The controlling government authority for the Historic Sites and Preservation Division of the Historic Preservation Agency shall be the Director of the Historic Sites and Preservation, and the controlling government authority for the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum shall be the Director of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail or dispensed for consumption at the Michael Bilandic Building at 160 North LaSalle Street, Chicago IL 60601, after the normal business hours of any day care or child care facility located in the building, by (1) a commercial tenant or subtenant conducting business on the premises under a lease made pursuant

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to Section 405-315 of the Department of Central Management 1 Services Law (20 ILCS 405/405-315), provided that such tenant 2 3 or subtenant who accepts delivery of, sells, or dispenses 4 alcoholic liquors shall procure and maintain dram 5 liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, indemnify, and save harmless the 6 7 State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage, or harm 8 arising out of the delivery, sale, or dispensing of alcoholic liquors, or by (2) an agency of the State, whether legislative, 9 judicial, or executive, provided that such agency first obtains 10 written permission to accept delivery of and sell or dispense 11 alcoholic liquors from the Director of Central Management 12 Services, or by (3) a not-for-profit organization, provided 13 that such organization: 14

- a. obtains written consent from the Department of Central Management Services;
- b. accepts delivery of and sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State offices located in the building;
- c. accepts delivery of and sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building; and
- d. provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless, and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage, or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.
- Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Director of Central Management Services.
- 34 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the

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James R. Thompson Center in Chicago, subject to the provisions of Section 7.4 of the State Property Control Act, and 222 South College Street in Springfield, Illinois by (1) a commercial tenant or subtenant conducting business on the premises under a lease or sublease made pursuant to Section 405-315 of the Department of Central Management Services Law (20 ILCS 405/405-315), provided that such tenant or subtenant who sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors shall procure and maintain dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the sale or dispensing of alcoholic liquors, or by (2) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the Director of Central Management Services, or by (3) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:

- a. Obtains written consent from the Department of Central Management Services;
- b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State offices located in the building;
- c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building;
- d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Director of

1 Central Management Services.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered at any facility owned by the Illinois Sports Facilities Authority provided that dram shop liability insurance has been made available in a form, with such coverage and in such amounts as the Authority reasonably determines is necessary.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the Rockford State Office Building by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the Department of Central Management Services, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization:

- a. Obtains written consent from the Department of Central Management Services;
- b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal operations of State offices located in the building;
- c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in connection with an official activity in the building;
- d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Department of Central Management Services.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county in the City of Bloomington, and used by the McLean

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County Historical Society if the sale or delivery is approved by an ordinance adopted by the county board, municipality in which the building is located may not prohibit that sale or delivery, notwithstanding any other provision of this Section. The regulation of the sale and delivery of alcoholic liquor in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county, and used by the McLean County Historical Society as provided in this paragraph is an exclusive power and function of the State and is a denial and limitation under Article VII, Section 6, subsection (h) of the Illinois Constitution of the power of a home rule municipality to regulate that sale and delivery.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in any building situated on land held in trust for any school district organized under Article 34 of the School Code, if the building is not used for school purposes and if the sale or delivery is approved by the board of education.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in buildings owned by the Community Building Complex Committee of Boone County, Illinois if the person or facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance with coverage and in amounts that the Committee reasonably determines are necessary.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in the building located at 1200 Centerville Avenue in Belleville, Illinois and occupied by either the Belleville Area Special Education District or the Belleville Area Special Services Cooperative.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at the Louis Joliet Renaissance Center, City Center Campus, located at 214 N. Ottawa Street, Joliet, and the Food Services/Culinary Arts Department facilities, Main Campus, located at 1215 Houbolt Road, Joliet, owned by or under the control of Joliet Junior College, Illinois Community College District No. 525.
