2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

 6 of the Secretary of State, including sidewalks, terraces, and
 7 grounds and all labor, materials, and other costs incidental
 8 to the above work:

11 Section 15. The sum of \$1,250,000, or so much of this
 12 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
 13 Development Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for
 14 new construction and alterations, and maintenance of the
 15 interiors and exteriors of the following facilities under the
 16 jurisdiction of the Secretary of State: Chicago West
 17 Facility, 5301 N. Lexington Ave., Chicago, Illinois 60644;

1 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Secretary of State
 2 from the Illinois Route 66 Heritage Project Fund to provide
 3 grants for the development of tourism, education,
 4 preservation and promotion of Route 66.

 6 Section 140. The sum of \$45,000, or so much of this
 7 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Police
 8 Memorial Committee Fund to the Office of the Secretary of
 9 State for grants to the Police Memorial Committee for
 10 maintaining a memorial statue, holding an annual memorial
 11 commemoration, and giving scholarships to children to police
 12 officers killed in the line of duty.

 14 Section 145. The sum of \$160,000, or so much of this

 16 Mammogram Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for

8 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Pet
9 Overpopulation Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State
10 for grants to humane societies to be used solely for the
11 humane sterilization of dogs and cats in the State of
12 Illinois.

13

14 Section 170. The amount of \$945,000, or so much of this
15 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the SOS
16 Federal Projects Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State
17 for the cost incident to augmenting the Illinois commercial
18 motor vehicle safety program by assuring and verifying the
19 identity of drivers, including CDL operators, prior to
20 licensure.

21

22 Section 175. The amount of \$3,100,000, or so much of this
23 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
24 the Secretary of State from the Securities Investors
25 Education Fund for any expenses used to promote public
26 awareness of the dangers of securities fraud.

27

28 Section 180. The amount of \$92,500, or so much of this
29 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
30 the Secretary of State from the Secretary of State Evidence
31 Fund for the purchase of evidence, for the employment of
32 persons to obtain evidence, and for the payment for any goods
33 or services related to obtaining evidence.

34

1 Section 185. The amount of \$225,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Alternate Fuels
3 Fund to the Office of Secretary of State for the cost of
4 administering the Alternate Fuels Act.

5

6 Section 190. The amount of \$14,691,500, or so much of
7 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
8 Secretary of State Special Services Fund to the Office of the
9 Secretary of State for office automation and technology.

10

11 Section 195. The amount of \$16,000,000, or so much of
12 this amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
13 Motor Vehicle License Plate Fund to the Office of the
14 Secretary of State for the cost incident to providing new or
15 replacement plates for motor vehicles.

16

17 Section 200. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much of this
18 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the
19 Secretary of State DUI Administration Fund to the Office of
20 Secretary of State for operation of the Department of
21 Administrative Hearings of the Office of Secretary of State
22 and for no other purpose.

23

24 Section 205. The amount of \$46,300, or so much thereof as
25 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Secretary of State
26 Police DUI Fund to the Secretary of State for the payments of
27 goods and services that will assist in the prevention of
28 alcohol related criminal violence throughout the state.

29

30 Section 210. The amount of \$250,000 is appropriated from
31 the Secretary of State Police Services Fund to the Secretary
32 of State for purposes as indicated by the grantor or
33 contractor or, in the case of money bequeathed or granted for
34 no specific purpose, for any purpose as deemed appropriate by

1 the Director of Police, Secretary of State in administering
2 the responsibilities of the Secretary of State Department of
3 Police.

4

5 Section 215. The amount of \$250,000, or so much of this
6 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Office
7 of the Secretary of State Grant Fund to the Office of the
8 Secretary of State to be expended in accordance with the
9 terms and conditions upon which such funds were received.

10

11 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
12 2004.
