**SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:**

Makes FY05 appropriations to the Supreme Court for the ordinary and contingent expenses of certain officers of the court system of Illinois, the Supreme Court, the Appellate Courts, the Circuit Court, the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts, the Illinois Courts Commission, Mandatory Arbitration Programs, the Foreign Language Interpreter Program, and lawyers' assistance programs. Effective July 1, 2004.

**A BILL FOR**

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

9 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Mandatory  
10 Arbitration Fund to the Supreme Court for Mandatory  
11 Arbitration Programs.

12 Section 40. The sum of \$116,800, or so much thereof as  
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Foreign Language  
14 Interpreter Fund to the Supreme Court for the Foreign  
15 Language Interpreter Program.

16 Section 45. The sum of \$728,000, or so much thereof as  
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Lawyers'  
18 Assistance Program Fund to the Supreme Court for lawyers'  
19 assistance programs.

20 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,  
21 2004.
