Makes appropriations for capital expenditures for the following agencies: Architect of the Capitol, Office of the Lieutenant Governor, Office of the Secretary of State, Department of Agriculture, Department of Central Management Services, Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, Department of Corrections, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Military Affairs, Department of Public Aid, Department of Revenue, Department of State Police, Department of Transportation, Department of Veterans' Affairs, Capital Development Board, Illinois Commerce Commission, Environmental Protection Agency, Historic Preservation Agency, Illinois Finance Authority, Medical District Commission, Illinois Emergency Management Agency, Prisoner Review Board, Chicago State University, Eastern Illinois University, Northeastern Illinois University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University, University of Illinois, and Illinois Community College Board.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

6 Section 5. The following amount, or so much of this
7 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Office of
8 the Architect of the Capitol for plans, specifications, and
9 continuation of work pursuant to the report and
10 recommendations of the architectural, structural, and
11 mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This is
12 for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the State
13 Capitol Building:

14 From Capital Development Fund\$1,250,000

16 ARTICLE 2

17 LT. GOVERNOR

18 Section 5. The sum of \$35,000,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2004, from an appropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 3, Section 3 of Public Act
22 93-0587, is reappropriated to the Office of Lieutenant
23 Governor from the Clean Water Trust Fund to for the purpose
24 of making loans or grants to local governments pursuant to
25 Section 10 of the Clean Water Bond Act.

3 Section 5. The sum of \$1,250,000, or so much of this
4 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital
5 Development fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for
6 new construction and alterations, and maintenance of the
7 interiors and exteriors of the following facilities under the
8 jurisdiction of the Secretary of State: Chicago West
9 Facility, 5301 N. Lexington Ave., Chicago, Illinois 60644;
10 Roger McAuliffe Facility, 5401 N. Elston Ave., Chicago,
11 Illinois 60630; Charles Chew Jr. Facility, 9901 S. King
12 Drive, Chicago, Illinois 60628; and Capital Complex buildings
13 located in Springfield, Illinois.

SECRETARY OF STATE

17 Section 10. The sum of \$100,000, or so much of this
18 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
19 2004, from appropriations heretofore made for such purposes
20 in Section 105 of Article 13 of Public Act 93-91, is
21 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
22 Office of Secretary of State for a grant to the Chicago
23 Public Library for planning a new library for Grand Crossing.

24 Section 15. The amount of \$100,000, or so much of this
25 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
26 2002, from appropriations heretofore made for such purposes
27 in Section 110 of Article 21 of Public Act 92-8, is
28 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
29 Office of the Secretary of State for making grants to the

1 Chicago Library System for land acquisition, planning,
 2 construction, rehabilitation, and all necessary costs
 3 associated with the establishment of regional library.

4 Section 20. The sum of \$375,000, or so much of this
 5 amount as may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30,
 6 2004, from appropriations heretofore made for such purposes
 7 in Section 110 of Article 13 of Public Act 93-91, is
 8 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
 9 Office of the Secretary of State for new construction and
 10 alterations, and maintenance of the interiors and exteriors
 11 of the following facilities under jurisdiction of the
 12 Secretary of State: Chicago West Facility, 5301 N. Lexington
 13 Ave., Chicago, Illinois 60644; Roger McAuliffe Facility, 5401
 14 N. Elston Ave., Chicago, Illinois 60630; Charles Chew Jr.

 16 Capital Complex buildings located in Springfield, Illinois.

17 Section 25. The amount of \$20,400, or so much thereof as
 18 may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2001,
 19 from appropriation heretofore made for such purposes in
 20 Article 4, Division FY90, Section 3-6.2e of Public Act 91-
 21 0708, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois
 22 Bond Fund to the Office of the Secretary of State for making
 23 grants to the City of Chicago for planning, construction,
 24 reconstruction, rehabilitation, and all necessary costs for
 25 the following branches of the Chicago Public Library at the
 26 approximate costs set forth below:

27 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

28 Section 5. The sum of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
2 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
3 Opportunity for a grant to the Illinois Institute of
4 Technology for the Biomedical Research Center.

5 Section 10. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
7 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
9 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

10 Section 15. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
12 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
13 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
14 the Rare Isotope Accelerator Science Center.

15 Section 20. The sum of \$6,700,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
17 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
18 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
19 the Ricketts Regional Biocontainment Laboratory.

20 Section 25. The sum of \$1,600,000, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
23 Opportunity for the Applied Manufacturing Research and

15 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

16 Section 45. The amount of \$16,562,392, or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
18 close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation
19 heretofore made in Article 3, Section 55 of Public Act 93-91,
20 is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
21 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
22 to the DuPage Airport Authority for planning, design,
23 construction and access infrastructure related to the hi-tech
24 business campus.

25 Section 50. The amount of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof
26 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
27 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
28 made in Article 3, Section 60 of Public Act 93-91, is
29 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the

1 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
2 for planning, design, construction, and all other costs
3 associated with a new Ford Technical Training Center.

4 Section 55. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2004, from an appropriation heretofore
7 made in Article 3, Section 95 of Public Act 93-91, is
8 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
9 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
10 to Argonne National Laboratory for the "TRUE GRID I WIRE"
11 Program.

12 Section 60. The amount of \$11,679,805, or so much
13 thereof as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the
14 close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation
15 heretofore made in Article 6, Section 605 of Public Act 93-
16 587, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to
17 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 grants to governmental units, educational facilities and not-
19 for-profit organizations for all costs associated with but
20 not limited to infrastructure improvements.

21 Section 65. The sum of \$35,000,000, or so much thereof
22 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
23 business on June 30, 2004, from an appropriation heretofore
24 made in Article 3, Section 6 of Public Act 93-587, is
25 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
26 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
27 for economic development and infrastructure purposes. No
28 contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for any
29 expenditures from the appropriation made in this section
30 until after the purposes and amounts have been approved in
31 writing by the Director of Commerce and Economic Opportunity.

2 Section 70. The amount of \$2,604,609, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
5 made for such purposes in Article 6, Section 1395 of Public
6 Act 93-587, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
7 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
8 Opportunity for grants to units of local government and
9 educational facilities for all costs associated with
10 infrastructure improvements and capital projects, including
11 equipment and vehicles.

12 Section 75. The amount of \$253,471, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
15 made in Article 6, Section 1400 of Public Act 93-587, is
16 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
17 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants to
18 units of local government and educational facilities for all
19 costs associated with infrastructure improvements and capital
20 projects, including equipment and vehicles.

21 Section 80. The sum of \$3,808,878, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
23 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
24 made for such purposes in Article 8A, Section 10 of Public
25 Act 93-664, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
26 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
27 for grants to units of local government, and educational
28 facilities for all costs associated with infrastructure
29 improvements and capital projects, including equipment and
30 vehicles.

31 Section 85. The amount of \$75,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
3 made in Article 6, Section 560 of Public Act 93-587, as
4 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
5 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
6 the purpose of a grant to Grayville CUSD #1 for building an
7 addition on the high school.

8 Section 90. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made for such purpose in Article 6, Section 1600 of Public
12 Act 93-587, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
13 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
14 Opportunity for the purpose of a grant to the City of Sparta
15 for sewer construction and/or improvements at the American
16 Trap Shooters Facility.

17 Section 95. The amount of \$60,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made in Article 6, Section 565 of Public Act 93-587, as
21 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
22 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
23 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Niles for all costs
24 associated with the resurfacing of Dee Road from Golf Road to
25 the northern border of Niles.

26 Section 100. The amount of \$7,019,000, or so much thereof
27 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
28 business on June 30, 2004, from an appropriation made in
29 Article 8A, Section 4 of Public Act 93-664, is reappropriated
30 from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of
31 Commerce and Economic Opportunity for all costs associated

1 with various construction and/or rehabilitation projects, and
2 equipment purchases for various units of local government,
3 educational facilities and other eligible entities.

4 Section 105. The amount of \$205,000, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
7 made in Article 6, Section 570 of Public Act 93-587, as
8 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
9 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
10 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Niles for watermain
11 improvements.

12 Section 110. The amount of \$25,000, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
15 made in Article 6, Section 430 of Public Act 93-587, as
16 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
17 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Centreville for all
19 costs associated with rebuilding the Community Village
20 Theater.

21 Section 115. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof
22 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
23 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
24 made in Article 6 Section 575 of Public Act 93-587, as
25 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
26 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
27 the purpose of a grant to Staunton Community School District
28 #6 for the repair and/or construction of a running track.

29 Section 120. The sum of \$4,250,000, or so much thereof
30 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made for such purpose in Article 6, Section 1605 of Public
3 Act 93-587, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
4 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
5 Opportunity for the purpose of a grant to William Rainey
6 Harper College for bondable infrastructure improvements.

7 Section 125. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made in Article 6, Section 435 of Public Act 93-587, as
11 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
12 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
13 the purpose of a grant to Berwyn Fire Department for all
14 costs associated with purchasing a fire truck.

15 Section 130. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof
16 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made in Article 6, Section 580 of Public Act 93-587, as
19 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
20 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
21 the purpose of a grant to Gillespie Community Unit School
22 District #7 for the repair and/or construction of a running
23 track.

24 Section 135. The amount of \$600,000, or so much thereof
25 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
26 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
27 made in Article 6, Section 440 of Public Act 93-587, as
28 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
29 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
30 the purpose of a grant to The Frankfort Community Park
31 District for all costs associated with the development and

1 construction of an activities center.

3 Section 140. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made in Article 6, Section 585 of Public Act 93-587, as
7 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
8 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
9 the purpose of a grant to Girard High School for the repair
10 and/or construction of a running track.

11 Section 145. The amount of \$130,000, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
14 made in Article 6, Section 445 of Public Act 93-587, as
15 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
16 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
17 the purpose of a grant to Evanston School District 65 for all
18 costs associated with the renovation of an Oakton Elementary
19 School wall containing WPA murals.

20 Section 150. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof
21 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
22 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
23 made in Article 6, Section 590 of Public Act 93-587, as
24 amended, is appropriated from the Capital Development Fund to
25 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
26 purpose of a grant to Virden Community Unit School District
27 #4 for the repair and/or construction of a running track.

28 Section 155. The amount of \$8,591,677, or so much
29 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
30 close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation
31 heretofore made for such purpose in Article 6, Section 1390

1 of Public Act 93-587, is reappropriated to the Department of
2 Commerce and Economic Opportunity from the Capital
3 Development Bond Fund for grants to units of local government
4 and educational facilities for municipal, recreational,
5 educational and public safety infrastructure improvements and
6 other expenses, including but not limited to planning,
7 construction, reconstruction, renovation, utilities,
8 equipment, public safety vehicles and related costs.

9 Section 160. The amount of \$70,000, or so much thereof
10 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
12 made in Article 6, Section 450 of Public Act 93-587, as
13 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
14 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 the purpose of a grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for
16 all costs associated with the purchase of individual light
17 fixtures with bullet proof lenses and poles for fixtures.

18 Section 165. The amount of \$150,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made in Article 6, Section 500 of Public Act 93-587, as
22 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
23 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
24 the purpose of a grant to Morrisonville-Palmer Fire
25 Protection District for the repair and/or construction of a
26 fire house.

27 Section 170. The amount of \$250,000, or so much thereof
28 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
29 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
30 made in Article 6, Section 455 of Public Act 93-587, as
31 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund

1 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
2 the purpose of a grant to the Jewish Federation of
3 Metropolitan Chicago for all costs associated with security
4 installations and upgrades at several community facilities.

5 Section 175. The amount of \$25,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 6, Section 510 of Public Act 93-587, as
9 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
10 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
11 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Sawyerville for the
12 repair of water lines.

13 Section 180. The amount of \$75,000, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made in Article 6, Section 460 of Public Act 93-587, as
17 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
18 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 the purpose of a grant to Village of Riverside for all costs
20 associated with capital expenses.

21 Section 185. The amount of \$75,000, or so much thereof
22 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
23 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
24 made in Article 6, Section 465 of Public Act 93-587, as
25 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
26 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
27 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Maywood for all
28 costs associated with a parking lot along the prairie path.

29 Section 190. The amount of \$112,500, or so much thereof
30 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made in Article 6, Section 520 of Public Act 93-587, as
3 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
4 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 the purpose of a grant to the City of Hillsboro to upgrade a
6 sports complex.

7 Section 195. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much
8 thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the
9 close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation
10 heretofore made in Article 6, Section 470 of Public Act 93-
11 587, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
12 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
13 Opportunity for the purpose of a grant to the Chicago Park
14 District for all costs associated with the renovation of the
15 Broadway Armory Park.

16 Section 200. The amount of \$150,000, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 6, Section 525 of Public Act 93-587, as
20 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
21 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
22 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Livingston for the
23 construction, repair, or renovation of a public recreational
24 facility.

25 Section 205. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof
26 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
27 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
28 made in Article 6, Section 475 of Public Act 93-587, as
29 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
30 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
31 the purpose of a grant to the City of McHenry for all costs

1 associated with the construction of the Riverwalk.

2 Section 210. The amount of \$67,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
5 made in Article 6, Section 530 of Public Act 93-587, as
6 amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 the purpose of a grant to Litchfield Park District for park
9 improvements.

10 Section 215. The amount of \$200,000, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
