2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. "An Act making appropriations", Public Act
5 93-842, approved July 30, 2004, is amended by changing
6 Section 7 of Article 2 as follows:

7 (P.A. 93-842, Article 2, Section 7)

8 Sec 7. The following amounts or so much thereof as may be
9 necessary, which shall be used by the Illinois State Board of
10 Education exclusively for the foregoing purposes and not,
11 under any circumstances, for personal services expenditures
12 or other operational or administrative costs, are
13 appropriated to the Illinois State Board of Education for the
14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004:
