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HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Department of Central Management Services has decided to eliminate Health Alliance Medical Plans as a managed care plan option for State employees and some State retirees beginning in Fiscal Year 2005; and

6 WHEREAS, State government is Health Alliance's largest
7 client and 90,000 downstate residents are covered by Health
8 Alliance's HMO as a result of its contract with the State; and

WHEREAS, Developing a long-term relationship with a trusted family physician can greatly improve the quality of health care; however, as a result of this action by the Department of Central Management Services, some State employees who wish to remain in an HMO will not be able to keep their current primary physician, thereby disrupting the continuity of care for those employees and their families; and

WHEREAS, Job preservation is a high priority for the State of Illinois; because Health Alliance is headquartered in downstate Illinois, the enrollment of State employees with Health Alliance provides jobs to downstate Illinois residents; any movement of State employees to other managed care plans headquartered elsewhere could have the effect of moving jobs elsewhere; and

WHEREAS, All of the consequences of the action taken by the Department of Central Management Services should be fully considered in determining whether that action is in the best interests of the State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Department of Central Management Services to reconsider its decision to eliminate Health Alliance as a
