The 2 information collected and maintained for the disability 3 4 database shall include, but is not limited to, the following: (i) the types of services of which the individual is 5 potentially in need; (ii) demographic and identifying 6 information about the individual; (iii) factors indicating 7 need, including diagnoses, assessment information, age of 8 9 primary caregivers, and current living situation; (iv) if applicable, the date information about the individual is 10 submitted for inclusion in the database and the types of 11 services sought by the individual; and (v) the representative 12 13 district in which the individual resides. In collecting and maintaining information under this Section, the Department 14 shall give consideration to cost-effective appropriate 15 16 services for individuals. 17 (b) This amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly does not create any new entitlement to a service, program, or 18 benefit, but shall not affect any entitlement to a service, 19 program, or benefit created by any other law. Except for a 20 service, program, or benefit that is an entitlement, a 2.1 22 service, program, or benefit provided as a result of the collection and maintenance of the disability database shall 23 be subject to appropriations made by the General Assembly. 24 (c) The Department, consistent with applicable federal 25 and State law, shall make general information from the 26 27 disability database available to the public such as: (i) the number of individuals potentially in need of each type of 28 service, program, or benefit and (ii) the general 29 characteristics of those individuals. The Department shall 30 protect the confidentiality of each individual in the 31 database when releasing database information by not 32 33 disclosing any personally identifying information.
