26 and other costs related to the establishment and operation of
27 an Ethanol plant.

28 Section 1595. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
29 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
30 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
31 made for such purpose in Article 3, Division FY 03, Section
32 50 of Public Act 92-717 as amended is reappropriated from the
33 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and

1 Economic Opportunity for the purpose of a grant to Advocate
2 Health and Hospitals Corporation to purchase and install a
3 negative pressure exhaust system and related renovations to
4 include prior incurred costs.

5 Section 1600. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
8 made for such purpose in Article 1a, Section 2 of Public Act
9 92-717 as amended is reappropriated from the Capital
10 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
11 Opportunity for the purpose of a grant to the City of Sparta
12 for sewer construction and/or improvements at the American
13 Trap Shooters Facility.

14 Section 1605. The sum of \$4,250,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
17 made for such purpose in Article 1a, Section 5 of Public Act
18 92-717 as amended is reappropriated from the Capital
19 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
20 Opportunity for the purpose of a grant to William Rainey
21 Harper College for bondable infrastructure improvements.

22 Section 1610. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
24 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
25 made for such purpose in Article 1a, Section 6 of Public Act
26 92-717 as amended is reappropriated from the Capital
27 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
28 Opportunity for the purpose of a grant to the Village of
29 Herscher for bondable improvements associated with Phase 2 of
30 a water main project.

31 Section 1615. The sum of \$1,250,000, or so much thereof
32 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
2 made for such purpose in Article 1a, Section 7 of Public Act
3 92-717 as amended is reappropriated from the Capital
4 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
5 Opportunity for the purpose of a grant to the City of Markham
6 for bondable street and drainage improvements.

7 Section 1620. The sum of \$9,800,000, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
10 made for such purpose in Article 1a, Section 8 of Public Act
11 92-717 as amended is reappropriated from the Capital
12 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
13 Opportunity for grants to units of local government and
14 educational facilities for municipal, recreational,
15 educational and public safety infrastructure improvements and
16 other expenses, including but not limited to planning,
17 construction, reconstruction, renovation, utilities,
18 equipment, public safety vehicles and related costs.

20 Section 5. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
21 becoming law."
