20 heretofore made in Article 52, Section 46 of Public Act 92-
21 538, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to
22 the Department of Transportation for a grant to Metra for the
23 purpose of landscaping, remodeling, and repairing of the
24 embankments and viaducts from 47th to 57th Streets.

25 Section 27. The sum of \$23,800, or so much thereof as
26 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
27 business on June 30, 2003, from the reappropriation
28 heretofore made in Article 52, Section 47 of Public Act 92-
29 538, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to
30 the Department of Transportation for costs associated with
31 the reconstruction of Industrial Drive.

1 Section 28. The sum of \$10,100, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2003, from the reappropriation
4 heretofore made in Article 52, Section 48 of Public Act 92-
5 538, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to
6 the Department of Transportation for costs associated with
7 the reconstruction of Airport Road and Chartres Street.

8 Section 29. The sum of \$75,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2003, from the reappropriation
11 heretofore made in Article 52, Section 49 of Public Act 92-
12 538, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to
13 the Department of Transportation for a traffic signal at 51st
14 Street West in Rock Island.

15 Section 30. The sum of \$8,300, or so much thereof as may
16 be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of business
17 on June 30, 2003, from the reappropriation heretofore made in
18 Article 52, Section 50 of Public Act 92-538, is
19 reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the
20 Department of Transportation for repair of 1st Street from
21 Water Street and Brunner Street to Bucklin Street in LaSalle.

22 Section 31. The sum of \$616,500, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
24 business on June 30, 2003, from the reappropriation
25 heretofore made in Article 52, Section 51 of Public Act 92-
26 538, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to
27 the Department of Transportation for infrastructure
28 improvements, including but not limited to engineering and
29 construction engineering, extension and improvements of
30 highways, roads, access areas, roadside shelters, rest areas,

1 fringe parking facilities, storage and sanitary facilities,
2 equipment, traffic controls, sidewalks, signage.

3 Section 32. The sum of \$50,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2003, from the reappropriation
6 heretofore made in Article 52, Section 52 of Public Act 92-
7 538, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to
8 the Department of Transportation for renovation of the Wood
9 Dale METRA station.

10 Section 33. The sum of \$493,700, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2003, from the reappropriation
13 heretofore made in Article 52, Section 53 of Public Act 92-
14 538, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to
15 the Department of Transportation for the contract or
16 intergovernmental agreement costs associated with the
17 projects described below and having the estimated costs as
18 follows:

3 Section 34. The sum of \$1,200,600, or so much thereof as
 4 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
 5 business on June 30, 2003, from the reappropriation
 6 heretofore made in Article 52, Section 54 of Public Act 92-
 7 538, is reappropriated from the Road Fund to the Department
 8 of Transportation for the same purposes.

9 Section 35. The amount of \$500,000, or so much thereof
 10 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 11 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
 12 made in Article 52, Section 57 of Public Act 92-538, is
 13 reappropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of
 14 Transportation for the purpose of a grant to the City of
 15 Rockford for all costs associated with the construction of a
 16 road around the Rockford airport.

17 Section 36. The amount of \$200,000, or so much thereof
 18 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 19 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
 20 made in Article 52, Section 58 of Public Act 92-538, is
 21 reappropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of
 22 Transportation for the purpose of a grant to the Chicago
 23 Department of Transportation for installation of a traffic
 24 light at 103rd and Corliss Street.

25 Section 37. The amount of \$200,000, or so much thereof
 26 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 27 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
 28 made in Article 51, Section 59 of Public Act 92-538, is
 29 reappropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of
 30 Transportation for the purpose of a grant to the Chicago

1 Department of Transportation for installation of a traffic
2 light at 127th and Stewart Street.

3 Section 38. The amount of \$1,320,000, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
6 made in Article 51, Section 60 of Public Act 92-538, is
7 reappropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of
8 Transportation for the purpose of a grant to the Chicago
9 Department of Transportation for street resurfacing,
10 sidewalks, curbs, and gutters on Michigan Avenue from 103rd
11 Street to 127th Street.

12 Section 39. The amount of \$800,000, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
15 made in Article 51, Section 61 of Public Act 92-538, is
16 reappropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of
17 Transportation for the purpose of a grant to the Chicago
18 Department of Transportation for street resurfacing,
19 sidewalks, curbs, and gutters on King Drive from 100th Street
20 to 115th Street.

21 Section 40. The amount of \$1,350,000, or so much thereof
22 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
23 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
24 made in Article 51, Section 62 of Public Act 92-538, is
25 reappropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of
26 Transportation for the purpose of a grant to the Chicago
27 Department of Transportation for street resurfacing,
28 sidewalks, curbs, and gutters on 111th Street from Bishop
29 Ford Expressway to State Street.

30 Section 41. The sum of \$2,300,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2003, from an appropriation heretofore
3 made in Article 1a, Section 11 of Public Act 92-717, is
4 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
5 Department of Transportation for corridor protection along
6 Route 158.

7 ARTICLE 99

8 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect
9 immediately upon becoming law."
