- 4 Section 5. The Acupuncture Practice Act is amended by

- 7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2008)
- 8 Sec. 40. Application for licensure. Applications for
- 9 original licensure as an acupuncturist shall be made to the
- 10 Department in writing on forms prescribed by the Department
- and shall be accompanied by the required fee, which shall not
- 12 be refundable.
- Until December 31, 2001, applicants shall submit with the
- 14 application proof of passing the National Certification
- 15 <u>Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine</u> National
- 16 Commission---for---the---Certification---of----Acupuncturists
- 17 examination or a substantially equivalent examination
- 18 approved by the Department or meeting any other
- 19 qualifications established by the Department.
- On and after January 1, 2002, the Department shall issue
- 21 a license to an applicant who submits with the application
