15 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Manteno for the
16 purchase of a senior citizen van.

17 Section 1120. The amount of \$270,000, or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made in Article 6, Section 1120 of Public Act 93-0587, as
21 amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future
22 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
23 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Skokie for the
24 purchase of an emergency vehicle and a hazardous national
25 rescue vehicle.

26 Section 1125. The amount of \$197,337, or so much thereof
27 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
28 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
29 made in Article 6, Section 1125 of Public Act 93-0587, as
30 amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future

1 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
2 the purpose of a grant to the Village of Skokie for all costs
3 associated with the purchase of equipment, software,
4 vehicles, computers, defibrillators, and program expenses.

5 Section 1130. The amount of \$175,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 6, Section 1130 of Public Act 93-0587, as
9 amended, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future
10 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
11 the purpose of a grant to the Leadership Council of
12 Southwestern Illinois for activities associated with the
13 retention of Scott Air Force Base.

14 Section 1405. The sum of \$172,500, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
17 made in Article 6, Section 1405 of Public Act 93-0587, is
18 reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the
19 Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to
20 units of local government and not-for-profit organizations
21 for infrastructure improvements including but not limited to
22 planning, construction, reconstruction, renovation,
23 equipment, supplies and all costs associated with economic
24 development programs, educational training and programs,
25 community services, public health programs, and public safety
26 programs.

27 Section 1410. The sum of \$182,151, or so much thereof as
28 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
29 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
30 made in Article 6, Section 1410 of Public Act 93-0587, is
31 reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the

1 Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to
2 units of local government, educational facilities and not-
3 for-profit organizations for municipal, recreational,
4 educational, and public safety infrastructure improvements
5 and other expenses, including but not limited to training,
6 planning, construction, reconstruction, renovation,
7 utilities, and equipment, and all costs associated with
8 economic development programs, educational training and
9 programs, community services, public health programs, and
10 public safety programs.

11 Section 1415. The sum of \$21,146, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore
14 made in Article 6, Section 1415 of Public Act 93-0587, is
15 reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the
16 Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to
17 units of local government, educational facilities and not-
18 for-profit organizations for education and training,
19 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects,
20 including but not limited to planning, construction,
21 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
22 costs associated with economic development programs,
23 community service programs, public health programs, public
24 safety programs, and other programs and activities.

25 Section 1420. The amount of \$9,729,332, or so much
26 thereof as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the
27 close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation
28 heretofore made in Article 6, Section 1420 of Public Act 93-
29 0587, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to
30 the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants
31 to units of government, educational facilities and not-for-
32 profit organizations for education and training,

1 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects,
2 including but not limited to planning, construction,
3 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
4 costs associated with economic development programs,
5 community service programs, public health programs, public
6 safety programs, and other programs and activities.

7 ARTICLE 2

8 Section 5. Except as limited by this Section, in each
9 instance where there is a line item appropriation for the
10 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004 to an entity for Personal
11 Services, then, in addition, there is appropriated to that
12 entity for Employee Retirement Contributions Paid by
13 Employer, from the same fund from which the appropriation for
14 Personal Services is made, a dollar amount, or so much of
15 that amount as may be necessary, equal to 4% of the amount
16 appropriated for Personal Services together with an
17 additional 1.5% of the amount of the Personal Services line
18 allocated to salaries payable to employees who qualify for
19 the alternative retirement annuity under Section 14-110 of
20 the Illinois Pension Code or for the retirement annuity
21 available under subsection (g) or (h) of Section 14-108 of
22 the Illinois Pension Code (reduced by any other amounts
23 appropriated for that fiscal year to that entity from that
24 fund for Employee Retirement Contributions Paid by
25 Employer). This Section applies only to the extent that the
26 employee retirement contributions are paid on behalf of
27 employees who are members of the State Employees' Retirement
28 System. The Comptroller shall compute the amount
29 appropriated to each entity under this Section.

30 ARTICLE 99

1 Section 5. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
2 2004."
