SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/10-17

from Ch. 122, par. 10-17

Amends the School Code. Provides that the statement of affairs of certain school districts shall be made available to the public by posting the statement on the district's Internet web site, if any, having copies available in the administrative office of the district, and publishing notice on where the statement is available in a newspaper of general circulation (now, the statement itself is required to be published in the newspaper). Effective immediately.

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AN ACT regarding schools.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
10-17 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/10-17) (from Ch. 122, par. 10-17)

Sec. 10-17. Statement of affairs. In Class I or Class II county school units the school board may use either a cash basis or accrual system of accounting; however, any board so electing to use the accrual system may not change to a cash basis without the permission of the State Board of Education.

School Boards using either a cash basis or accrual system 12 of accounting shall maintain records showing the assets, 13 liabilities and fund balances in such minimum forms as may be 14 15 prescribed by the State Board of Education. Such boards shall make available to the public publish a statement of the affairs 16 17 of the district prior to December 1 annually, in such form as 18 may be prescribed by the State Board of Education, by posting 19 the statement on the district's Internet web site, if any, having copies available in the administrative office of the 20 21 district, and publishing notice on where the statement is 22 available in a newspaper of general circulation published in the respective school district districts and if no newspaper is 23 published in the district then in a newspaper published in the 24 25 county in which the school district is located and if no 26 newspaper is published in the county then in a newspaper published in the educational service region in which the 27 28 regional superintendent has supervision and control of such 29 school district in such form as may be prescribed by the State 30 Board of Education. Not later than December 15 annually the clerk shall file with the regional superintendent a certified 31 statement that the statement of affairs publication has been 32

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1 made <u>public</u> together with a copy of the newspaper containing 2 <u>the notice</u> it. After December 15 annually the regional 3 superintendent of schools shall withhold from each treasurer 4 any public moneys due to be distributed to the treasurer until 5 the duties required under this Section have been complied with.

6 When any school district is the administrative district for several school districts operating under a joint agreement as 7 8 authorized by this Code Act, no receipts or disbursements accruing, received or paid out by that school district as such 9 an administrative district shall be included in the statement 10 11 of affairs of the district required by this Section. However, 12 that district shall have prepared and made available to the public published, in the same manner and subject to the same 13 requirements as are provided in this Section for the statement 14 15 of affairs of that district, a statement showing the cash 16 receipts and disbursements by funds (or the revenue, expenses 17 and financial position, if the accrual system of accounting is used) of the district as such administrative district, in the 18 19 form prescribed by the State Board of Education. The costs of 20 making available to the public publishing this separate statement prepared by such an administrative district shall be 21 apportioned among and paid by the participating districts in 22 23 the same manner as other costs and expenses accruing to those districts jointly. 24

25 School districts on a cash basis shall have prepared and 26 <u>made available to the public</u> publish a statement showing the 27 cash receipts and disbursements by funds in the form prescribed 28 by the State Board of Education.

29 School districts using the accrual system of accounting 30 shall have prepared and <u>made available to the public</u> publish a 31 statement of revenue and expenses and a statement of financial 32 position in the form prescribed by the State Board of 33 Education.

In Class II county school units such statement shall be prepared and <u>made available to the public</u> published by the township treasurer of the unit within which such districts are - 3 -LRB094 04193 LJB 34217 b

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1 located, except with respect to the school board of any school 2 district that no longer is subject to the jurisdiction and authority of a township treasurer or trustees of schools of a 3 the district has withdrawn from 4 township because the 5 jurisdiction and authority of the township treasurer and trustees of schools of the township or because those offices 6 have been abolished as provided in subsection (b) or (c) of 7 Section 5-1, and as to each such school district the statement 8 9 required by this Section shall be prepared and made available to the public published by the school board of such district in 10 11 the same manner as required for school boards of school 12 districts situated in Class I county school units.

13 In Class I and Class II counties the statement of school districts on either a cash or accrual basis shall show such 14 15 other information as may be required by the State Board of 16 Education, including:

17 1. Annual fiscal year gross payment for certificated personnel to be shown by name, listing each employee in one of 18 19 the following categories:

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(a) Under \$15,000

3. In addition to wages and salaries all other moneys in 31 32 the aggregate paid to recipients of \$1,000 or more, giving the name of the person, firm or corporation and the total amount 33 34 received by each.

Change in net cash position from the previous report 25 26 period for each district fund. 27 In addition to the above report, a report of expenditures 28 in the aggregate paid on behalf of recipients of \$500 or more, 29 giving the name of the person, firm or corporation and the 30 total amount received by each shall be available in the school 31 district office for public inspection. This listing shall 32 include all wages, salaries and expenditures over \$500 expended 33 from any revolving fund maintained by the district. Any resident of the school district may receive a copy of this 34 35 report, upon request, by paying a reasonable charge to defray 36 the costs of preparing such copy.
