Amends the Election Code. Requires election authorities to provide voter registration in precincts on election day. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning elections.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing
Sections 4-6, 4-6.1, 5-5, 5-16.1, 6-29, 6-50, and 6-50.1 as
follows:

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(10 ILCS 5/4-6) (from Ch. 46, par. 4-6)

Sec. 4-6. For the purpose of registering voters under this 8 in addition to the method provided for precinct 9 Article registration under Section 4-7, the office of the county clerk 10 shall be open every day, except Saturday, Sunday, and legal 11 holidays, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. On Saturdays the hours of 12 registration shall be from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and such 13 14 additional hours as the county clerk may designate. If, 15 however, the county board otherwise duly regulates and fixes the hours of opening and closing of all county offices at the 16 17 county seat of any county, such regulation shall control and supersede the hours herein specified. There shall be no 18 19 registration at the office of the county clerk or at the office 20 of municipal and township or road district clerks serving as deputy registrars during the 27 days preceding any regular or 21 special election at which the cards provided in this Article 22 23 are used, or until the 2nd day following such regular or special election; provided, that if by reason of the proximity 24 25 of any such elections to one another the effect of this provision would be to close registrations for all or any part 26 of the 10 days immediately prior to such 27 day period, the 27 28 county clerk shall accept, solely for use in the subsequent and not in any intervening election, registrations and transfers of 29 30 registration within the period from the 27th to the 38th days, both inclusive, prior to such subsequent election. In any 31 32 election called for the submission of the revision or

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alteration of, or the amendments to the Constitution, submitted by a Constitutional Convention, the final day for registration at the office of the election authority charged with the printing of the ballot of this election shall be the 15th day prior to the date of election.

6 Any qualified person residing within the county or any 7 portion thereof subject to this Article may register or 8 re-register with the county clerk. <u>The county clerk shall</u> 9 <u>provide for precinct registration on election day. A person</u> 10 <u>registering on election day must be a resident of the precinct</u> 11 <u>in which he or she registers.</u>

12 Each county clerk shall appoint one or more registration or 13 re-registration teams for the purpose of accepting the registration or re-registration of any voter who files an 14 15 affidavit that he is physically unable to appear at any 16 appointed place of registration or re-registration. Each team 17 shall consist of one member of each political party having the highest and second highest number of registered voters in the 18 19 county. The county clerk shall designate a team to visit each 20 disabled person and shall accept the registration or re-registration of each such person as if he had applied for 21 22 registration or re-registration at the office of the county 23 clerk.

As used in this Article, "deputy registrars" and "registration officers" mean any person authorized to accept registrations of electors under this Article. (Source: P.A. 92-816, eff. 8-21-02.)

Sec. 4-6.1. In addition to registration at the office of the county clerk, and at the offices of municipal and township or road district clerks, each county clerk shall provide for the following additional methods of registration:

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(2) the establishment of temporary places of

registration, as provided in Section 4-6.3.
 Each county clerk may provide for precinct registration
 pursuant to Section 4-7 <u>in addition to precinct registration on</u>
 <u>election day as provided in Section 4-6</u>.

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(10 ILCS 5/5-5) (from Ch. 46, par. 5-5)

7 Sec. 5-5. For the purpose of registering voters under this Article 5, in addition to the method provided for precinct 8 registration under Sections 5-6 and 5-17 of this Article 5, the 9 10 office of the county clerk shall be open between 9:00 a. m. and 11 5:00 p. m. on all days except Saturday, Sunday and holidays, but there shall be no registration at such office during the 35 12 days immediately preceding any election required to be held 13 14 under the law but if no precinct registration is being 15 conducted prior to any election then registration may be taken 16 in the office of the county clerk up to and including the 28th day prior to an election. On Saturdays, the hours 17 of 18 registration shall be from 9:00 a. m. to 12:00 p. m. noon. 19 During such 35 or 27 day period, registration of electors of political subdivisions wherein a regular, or special election 20 is required to be held shall cease and shall not be resumed for 21 22 the registration of electors of such political subdivisions 23 until the second day following the day of such election. In any election called for the submission of the revision 24 or 25 alteration of, or the amendments to the Constitution, submitted 26 by a Constitutional Convention, the final day for registration 27 at the office of the election authority charged with the printing of the ballot of this election shall be the 15th day 28 29 prior to the date of the election. The county clerk shall 30 provide for precinct registration on election day. A person registering on election day must be a resident of the precinct 31 32 in which he or she registers.

Each county clerk shall appoint one deputy for the purpose of accepting the registration of any voter who files an affidavit that he is physically unable to appear at any - 4 - LRB094 02581 JAM 32582 b

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1 appointed place of registration. The county clerk shall 2 designate a deputy to visit each disabled person and shall 3 accept the registration of each such person as if he had 4 applied for registration at the office of the county clerk.

5 The offices of city, village, incorporated town and town 6 clerks shall also be open for the purpose of registering voters residing in the territory in which this Article is in effect, 7 and also, in the case of city, village and incorporated town 8 9 clerks, for the purpose of registering voters residing in a portion of the city, village or incorporated town not located 10 11 within the county, on all days on which the office of the 12 county clerk is open for the registration of voters of such cities, villages, incorporated towns and townships. 13

Sec. 5-16.1. In addition to registration at the office of the county clerk and at the offices of municipal and township clerks, each county subject to this Article shall provide for the following methods of registration:

20 (1) The appointment of deputy registrars as provided in
21 Section 5-16.2;

(2) The establishment of temporary places of registrationas provided in Section 5-16.3.

Each county subject to this Article may provide for precinct registration pursuant to Section 5-17 <u>in addition to</u> <u>precinct registration on election day as provided in Section</u> 5-5.

30 Sec. 6-29. For the purpose of registering voters under this 31 Article, the office of the Board of Election Commissioners 32 shall be open during ordinary business hours of each week day, 33 from 9 a.m. to 12 o'clock noon on the last four Saturdays 34 immediately preceding the end of the period of registration

1 preceding each election, and such other days and such other 2 times as the board may direct. During the 27 days immediately preceding any election there shall be no registration of voters 3 4 at the office of the Board of Election Commissioners in cities, 5 villages and incorporated towns of fewer than 200,000 6 inhabitants. In cities, villages and incorporated towns of 200,000 or more inhabitants, there shall be no registration of 7 8 voters at the office of the Board of Election Commissioners 9 during the 35 days immediately preceding any election; 10 provided, however, where no precinct registration is being 11 conducted prior to any election then registration may be taken 12 in the office of the Board up to and including the 28th day 13 prior to such election. The Board of Election Commissioners may set up and establish as many branch offices for the purpose of 14 15 taking registrations as it may deem necessary, and the branch 16 offices may be open on any or all dates and hours during which registrations may be taken in the main office. All officers and 17 employees of the Board of Election Commissioners who are 18 19 authorized by such board to take registrations under this 20 Article shall be considered officers of the circuit court, and shall be subject to the same control as is provided by Section 21 14-5 of this Act with respect to judges of election. 22

In any election called for the submission of the revision or alteration of, or the amendments to the Constitution, submitted by a Constitutional Convention, the final day for registration at the office of the election authority charged with the printing of the ballot of this election shall be the 15th day prior to the date of election.

29 <u>The board shall provide for precinct registration on</u> 30 <u>election day. A person registering on election day must be a</u> 31 <u>resident of the precinct in which he or she registers.</u>

The board of Election Commissioners shall appoint one or more registration teams, consisting of 2 of its employees for each team, for the purpose of accepting the registration of any voter who files an affidavit, within the period for taking registrations provided for in this article, that he is

1 physically unable to appear at the office of the Board or at 2 any appointed place of registration. On the day or days when a precinct registration is being conducted such teams shall 3 consist of one member from each of the 2 leading political 4 5 parties who are serving on the Precinct Registration Board. 6 Each team so designated shall visit each disabled person and shall accept the registration of such person the same as if he 7 had applied for registration in person. 8

9 Any otherwise qualified person who is absent from his 10 county of residence due to business of the United States, or 11 who is temporarily residing outside the territorial limits of 12 the United States, may make application to become registered by mail to the Board of Election Commissioners within the periods 13 for registration provided for in this Article or 14 by 15 simultaneous application for absentee registration and 16 absentee ballot as provided in Article 20 of this Code.

17 Upon receipt of such application the Board of Election shall immediately mail 18 Commissioners an affidavit of 19 registration in duplicate, which affidavit shall contain the 20 following and such other information as the State Board of Elections may think it proper to require for the identification 21 of the applicant: 22

Name. The name of the applicant, giving surname and first or Christian name in full, and the middle name or the initial for such middle name, if any.

27 Residence. The name and number of the street, avenue or 28 other location of the dwelling, and such additional clear and 29 definite description as may be necessary to determine the exact 30 location of the dwelling of the applicant. Where the location 31 cannot be determined by street and number, then the section, 32 congressional township and range number may be used, or such other information as may be necessary, including post office 33 34 mailing address.

The office of the board Sec. of election 3 commissioners shall be open during ordinary business hours of each week day, from 9 a.m. to 12 o'clock noon on the last four 4 5 Saturdays immediately preceding the end of the period of registration preceding each election, and such other days and 6 such other times as the board may direct. There shall be no 7 8 registration at the office of the board of election commissioners in cities, villages and incorporated towns of 9 10 fewer than 200,000 inhabitants during the 27 days preceding any 11 primary, regular or special election at which the cards 12 provided for in this article are used, or until the second day 13 following such primary, regular or special election. In cities, villages and incorporated towns of 200,000 or more inhabitants, 14 15 there shall be no registration of voters at the office of the 16 board of election commissioners during the 35 days immediately 17 preceding any election; provided, however, where no precinct registration is being conducted prior to any election then 18 19 registration may be taken in the office of the board up to and 20 including the 28th day prior to such election. In any election called for the submission of the revision or alteration of, or 21 22 the amendments the Constitution, to submitted by а 23 Constitutional Convention, the final day for registration at the office of the election authority charged with the printing 24 of the ballot of this election shall be the 15th day prior to 25 26 the date of election.

27 <u>The board shall provide for precinct registration on</u> 28 <u>election day. A person registering on election day must be a</u> 29 <u>resident of the precinct in which he or she registers.</u>

The Board of Election Commissioners shall appoint one or more registration teams, each consisting of one member from each of the 2 leading political parties, for the purpose of accepting the registration of any voter who files an affidavit, within the period for taking registrations provided for in this Article, that he is physically unable to appear at the office of the Board or at any appointed place of registration. day or days when a precinct registration is being conducted such teams shall consist of one member from each of the 2 leading political parties who are serving on the precinct registration board. 8 The office of the board of election commissioners may be 9 designated as a place of registration under Section 6-51 of 10 this Article and, if so designated, may also be open for 11 purposes of registration on such day or days as may be 12 specified by the board of election commissioners under the 13 provisions of that Section.

(2) The establishment of temporary places of registrationas provided in Section 6-50.3.
