SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

10 ILCS 5/20-8

from Ch. 46, par. 20-8

Amends the Election Code. Provides that absentee ballots of U.S. service members and overseas civilians that are received within 14 days after an election are eligible to be counted if postmarked or dated on or before 11:59 p.m. of the day before the election.

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AN ACT concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

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Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing Section 5 20-8 as follows:

(10 ILCS 5/20-8) (from Ch. 46, par. 20-8) 6

7 Sec. 20-8. In case any such ballot is received by the 8 election authority prior to the delivery of the official ballots to the judges of election of the precinct in which said 9 elector resides, such ballot envelope and application, sealed 10 in the carrier envelope, shall be enclosed in the same package 11 with the other official ballots and therewith delivered to the 12 judges of such precinct. In case the official ballots for such 13 14 precinct have been delivered to the judges of election at the 15 time of the receipt by the election authority of such absent voter's ballot, it shall immediately enclose said envelope 16 17 containing the absent voter's ballot, together with his 18 application therefor, in a larger or carrier envelope which 19 shall be securely sealed and addressed on the face to the judges of election, giving the name or number of precinct, 20 street and number of polling place, city or town in which such 21 22 absent voter is a qualified elector, and the words, "This 23 envelope contains an absent voter's ballot and must be opened only on election day at the polls immediately after the polls 24 25 are closed," mailing the same, postage prepaid, to such judges 26 of election, or if more convenient he or it may deliver such absent voter's ballot to the judges of election in person or by 27 28 duly deputized agent and secure his receipt for delivery of such ballot or ballots. Absent voter's ballots postmarked after 29 30 11:59 p.m. of the day immediately preceding the election returned to the election authority too late to be delivered to 31 the proper polling place before the closing of the polls on the 32

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1 day of election shall be endorsed by the person receiving the 2 same with the day and hour of receipt and shall be safely kept 3 unopened by the election authority for the period of time 4 required for the preservation of ballots used at such election, 5 and shall then, without being opened, be destroyed in like 6 manner as the used ballots of such election.

All absent voters' ballots received by the election 7 8 authority after 12:00 noon on election day or too late for delivery to the proper polling place before the closing of the 9 10 polls on election day, except ballots returned by mail 11 postmarked after midnight preceding the opening of the polls on election day, shall be counted in the office of the election 12 13 authority on the day of the election after 7:00 p.m. All absent voters' ballots delivered in error to the wrong precinct 14 polling place shall be returned to the election authority and 15 16 counted under this provision. Absent voters' ballots 17 postmarked or dated on or before 11:59 p.m. of the day immediately preceding the election but received by or delivered 18 to the election authority within 14 calendar days after the 19 20 election shall be eligible to be counted.

Such counting shall commence no later than 8:00 p.m. and shall be conducted by a panel or panels of election judges appointed in the manner provided by law. Such counting shall continue until all absent voters' ballots received as aforesaid have been counted <u>but in no case shall they be counted after</u> the 14th day following the election.

The procedures set forth in Section 19-9 of this Act and Articles 17 and 18 of this Code, shall apply to all absent voters' ballots counted under this provision; except that votes shall be recorded without regard to precinct designation.

Where certain absent voters' ballots are counted in the office of the election authority as provided in this Section, each political party, candidate and qualified civic organization shall be entitled to have present one pollwatcher for each panel of election judges therein assigned.
