

## 94TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2005 and 2006 HB0703

Introduced 02/01/05, by Rep. Thomas Holbrook

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

730 ILCS 5/3-7-2

from Ch. 38, par. 1003-7-2

Amends the Unified Code of Corrections. Provides for the establishment of a pilot program at a Department of Corrections facility built on or after January 1, 2006 in which the inmates shall be prohibited from possessing cigarettes and other tobacco products. Also provides that the Director of Corrections may prohibit the inmates of Department facilities built before January 1, 2006 from possessing cigarettes and other tobacco products as the Director deems appropriate.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Unified Code of Corrections is amended by changing Section 3-7-2 as follows:
- 6 (730 ILCS 5/3-7-2) (from Ch. 38, par. 1003-7-2)
- 7 Sec. 3-7-2. Facilities.
  - (a) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall provide every committed person with access to toilet facilities, barber facilities, bathing facilities at least once each week, a library of legal materials and published materials including newspapers and magazines approved by the Director. A committed person may not receive any materials that the Director deems pornographic.
- 15 (b) (Blank).

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- (c) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall provide facilities for every committed person to leave his cell for at least one hour each day unless the chief administrative officer determines that it would be harmful or dangerous to the security or safety of the institution or facility.
- (d) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall provide every committed person with a wholesome and nutritional diet at regularly scheduled hours, drinking water, clothing adequate for the season, bedding, soap and towels and medical and dental care.
- 26 (e) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall
  27 permit every committed person to send and receive an unlimited
  28 number of uncensored letters, provided, however, that the
  29 Director may order that mail be inspected and read for reasons
  30 of the security, safety or morale of the institution or
  31 facility.
- 32 (f) All of the institutions and facilities of the

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- 1 Department shall permit every committed person to receive 2 visitors, except in case of abuse of the visiting privilege or when the chief administrative officer determines that such 3 visiting would be harmful or dangerous to the security, safety 4 5 morale of the institution or facility. The chief 6 administrative officer shall have the right to restrict visitation to non-contact visits for reasons of safety, 7 8 security, and order, including, but not limited to, restricting 9 contact visits for committed persons engaged in gang activity. 10 No committed person in a super maximum security facility or on 11 disciplinary segregation is allowed contact visits. Any 12 committed person found in possession of illegal drugs or who 13 fails a drug test shall not be permitted contact visits for a period of at least 6 months. Any committed person involved in 14 15 gang activities or found guilty of assault committed against a 16 Department employee shall not be permitted contact visits for a period of at least 6 months. 17
- 18 (g) All institutions and facilities of the Department shall
  19 permit religious ministrations and sacraments to be available
  20 to every committed person, but attendance at religious services
  21 shall not be required.
  - (h) Within 90 days after December 31, 1996, the Department shall prohibit the use of curtains, cell-coverings, or any other matter or object that obstructs or otherwise impairs the line of vision into a committed person's cell.
- 26 (i) A pilot program shall be established within the 27 Department at a facility or institution built on or after January 1, 2006 and designated by the Director in which 28 committed persons shall be prohibited from the possession of 29 cigarettes and other tobacco products. The Director may 30 31 prohibit the possession of cigarettes and other tobacco products by committed persons at institutions and facilities of 32 the Department built before January 1, 2006 as the Director 33 34 deems appropriate.
