## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Military Surplus Identification Act. Provides that certain items of military surplus sold on or after the effective date of the Act shall display an indelible and permanent marking designed and approved by the Department of Military Affairs, by rule, clearly indicating it was sold as military surplus. Provides that the Department of Military Affairs shall determine the location of the markings on the items. Provides penalties for a violation of the Act.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

```
Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Military Surplus Identification Act.
Section 5. Military surplus; identification. Military surplus sold on or after the effective date of this Act, must display an indelible and permanent marking designed and approved by the Department of Military Affairs, by rule, clearly indicating it was sold as military surplus. The Department of Military Affairs shall determine the location of the markings on the items. "Military surplus" means insignia, vehicles, and weapons.
```

Section 10. Penalty.
(a) A person who sells military surplus without the indelible and permanent marking required by this Act is guilty of a petty offense. Each item sold is a separate offense. The penalty is a fine of $\$ 1,000$ for each offense. A tenth or subsequent offense is a Class A misdemeanor.
(b) A person who removes or obscures an indelible and permanent marking on military surplus required by this Act is guilty of a petty offense. Each item sold is a separate offense. The penalty is a fine of $\$ 1,000$ for each offense. A tenth or subsequent offense is a Class A misdemeanor.
