SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/3-412 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-412 625 ILCS 5/3-413 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-413 625 ILCS 5/3-663 new

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Authorizes the Secretary of State to issue to a registered owner of a Corvette a special Corvette license plate to be displayed on that vehicle. Provides that only one rear license plate needs to be displayed on that vehicle.

1 AN ACT concerning vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Sections 3-412 and 3-413 and by adding Section 3-663 as follows:
- 7 (625 ILCS 5/3-412) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-412)
- 8 Sec. 3-412. Registration plates and registration stickers 9 to be furnished by the Secretary of State.
- (a) The Secretary of State upon registering a vehicle 10 subject to annual registration for the first time shall issue 11 or shall cause to be issued to the owner one registration plate 12 for a motorcycle, trailer, semitrailer, motorized pedalcycle, 13 14 or truck-tractor, or Corvette for which a special plate has 15 been issued under Section 3-663, 2 registration plates for vehicles 16 other motor and, where applicable, 17 registration stickers for motor vehicles of the first division. 18 The provisions of this Section may be made applicable to such 19 vehicles of the second division, as the Secretary of State may, from time to time, in his discretion designate. On subsequent 20 21 annual registrations during the term of the registration plate 22 as provided in Section 3-414.1, the Secretary shall issue or cause to be issued registration stickers as evidence of current 23 registration. However, the issuance of annual registration 24 25 stickers to vehicles registered under the provisions of Sections 3-402.1 and 3-405.3 of this Code may not be required 26 if the Secretary deems the issuance unnecessary. 27
 - (b) Every registration plate shall have displayed upon it the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which it is issued, the name of this State, which may be abbreviated, the year number for which it was issued, which may be abbreviated, the phrase "Land of Lincoln" (except as otherwise provided in

this Code Chapter 3), and such other letters or numbers as the Secretary may prescribe. However, for apportionment plates issued to vehicles registered under Section 3-402.1 and fleet plates issued to vehicles registered under Section 3-405.3, the phrase "Land of Lincoln" may be omitted to allow for the word "apportioned", the word "fleet", or other similar language to be displayed. Registration plates issued to a vehicle registered as a fleet vehicle may display a designation determined by the Secretary.

The Secretary may in his discretion prescribe that letters be used as prefixes only on registration plates issued to vehicles of the first division which are registered under this Code and only as suffixes on registration plates issued to other vehicles. Every registration sticker issued as evidence of current registration shall designate the year number for which it is issued and such other letters or numbers as the Secretary may prescribe and shall be of a contrasting color with the registration plates and registration stickers of the previous year.

- (c) Each registration plate and the required letters and numerals thereon, except the year number for which issued, shall be of sufficient size to be plainly readable from a distance of 100 feet during daylight, and shall be coated with reflectorizing material. The dimensions of the plate issued to vehicles of the first division shall be 6 by 12 inches.
- (d) The Secretary of State shall issue for every passenger motor vehicle rented without a driver the same type of registration plates as the type of plates issued for a private passenger vehicle.
- (e) The Secretary of State shall issue for every passenger car used as a taxicab or livery, distinctive registration plates.
- (f) The Secretary of State shall issue for every motorcycle distinctive registration plates distinguishing between motorcycles having 150 or more cubic centimeters piston displacement, or having less than 150 cubic centimeter piston

1 displacement.

- (g) Registration plates issued to vehicles for-hire may display a designation as determined by the Secretary that such vehicles are for-hire.
 - (h) The Secretary of State shall issue for each electric vehicle distinctive registration plates which shall distinguish between electric vehicles having a maximum operating speed of 45 miles per hour or more and those having a maximum operating speed of less than 45 miles per hour.
- (i) The Secretary of State shall issue for every public and private ambulance registration plates identifying the vehicle as an ambulance. The Secretary shall forward to the Department of Public Aid registration information for the purpose of verification of claims filed with the Department by ambulance owners for payment for services to public assistance recipients.
- (j) The Secretary of State shall issue for every public and private medical carrier or rescue vehicle livery registration plates displaying numbers within ranges of numbers reserved respectively for medical carriers and rescue vehicles. The Secretary shall forward to the Department of Public Aid registration information for the purpose of verification of claims filed with the Department by owners of medical carriers or rescue vehicles for payment for services to public assistance recipients.

- Sec. 3-413. Display of registration plates, registration stickers and drive-away permits.
- 31 (a) Registration plates issued for a motor vehicle other 32 than a motorcycle, trailer, semitrailer, truck-tractor, 33 apportioned bus, or apportioned truck, or Corvette for which a 34 special plate has been issued under Section 3-663 shall be 35 attached thereto, one in the front and one in the rear. The

registration plate issued for a motorcycle, trailer, or semitrailer, or Corvette for which a special plate has been issued under Section 3-663 required to be registered hereunder and any apportionment plate issued to a bus under the provisions of this Code shall be attached to the rear thereof. The registration plate issued for a truck-tractor or an apportioned truck required to be registered hereunder shall be

attached to the front thereof.

- (b) Every registration plate shall at all times be securely fastened in a horizontal position to the vehicle for which it is issued so as to prevent the plate from swinging and at a height of not less than 5 inches from the ground, measuring from the bottom of such plate, in a place and position to be clearly visible and shall be maintained in a condition to be clearly legible, free from any materials that would obstruct the visibility of the plate, including, but not limited to, glass covers and tinted plastic covers. Clear plastic covers are permissible as long as they remain clear and do not obstruct the visibility of the plates. Registration stickers issued as evidence of renewed annual registration shall be attached to registration plates as required by the Secretary of State, and be clearly visible at all times.
 - (c) Every drive-away permit issued pursuant to this Code shall be firmly attached to the motor vehicle in the manner prescribed by the Secretary of State. If a drive-away permit is affixed to a motor vehicle in any other manner the permit shall be void and of no effect.
- (d) The Illinois prorate decal issued to a foreign registered vehicle part of a fleet prorated or apportioned with Illinois, shall be displayed on a registration plate and displayed on the front of such vehicle in the same manner as an Illinois registration plate.
- 33 (e) The registration plate issued for a camper body mounted 34 on a truck displaying registration plates shall be attached to 35 the rear of the camper body.
 - (f) No person shall operate a vehicle, nor permit the

- 1 operation of a vehicle, upon which is displayed an Illinois
- 2 registration plate, plates or registration stickers after the
- 3 termination of the registration period for which issued or
- 4 after the expiration date set pursuant to Sections 3-414 and
- 5 3-414.1 of this Code.

- 9 Sec. 3-663. Corvette license plate.
- 10 (a) The Secretary, upon receipt of an application made in
- 11 the form prescribed by the Secretary of State, may issue a
- 12 special registration plate designated to be a Corvette license
- plate to a registered owner of a Corvette; which plate shall be
- 14 <u>displayed on the rear of that Corvette. The special plate</u>
- issued under this Section shall be affixed only to a Corvette.
- A plate issued under this Section shall expire according to the
- 17 <u>multi-year procedure established by Section 3-414.1 of this</u>
- 18 <u>Code</u>.
- 19 (b) The design and color of the plate shall be wholly
- 20 <u>within the discretion of the Secretary of State. Appropriate</u>
- documentation, as determined by the Secretary, shall accompany
- 22 the application. The Secretary may, in his or her discretion,
- 23 <u>allow the plate to be issued as a vanity or personalized plate</u>
- in accordance with Section 3-405.1 of this Code.
- 25 (c) An applicant shall be charged a \$40 fee for original
- 26 <u>issuance</u> in addition to the appropriate registration fee, if
- 27 applicable. This fee shall be deposited into the Secretary of
- 28 <u>State Special License Plate Fund, to be used by the Secretary</u>
- of State to help defray the administrative processing costs.
